## Summary:

---

In Report 1, Election Integrity Force's **Data Heroes** shared that three (3) Michigan Legislators had lost votes in the November 2020 election.

Let's clarify that "lost votes" means that *if* these public functionaries did vote (and we have every reason to believe that they did), their vote was not recorded in the state government's official record of all citizen's voting history called the Qualified Voter File (QVF).

Before we dig into the details, let us be clear. This is not a report about three lost legislative votes. In report 1 we were giving you a glimpse of a significant problem. You see, **we have identified at least 55,132 Michigan voters whose votes were not reported in a timely manner to the QVF (a late vote) or may not have been reported at all (a lost vote). 55,132!!!**

In Report 3 we will share "the where" and question "the how" those votes were late and/or lost.

## Background:

---

There are multiple reports supporting an election in Michigan. There is, however, only one 'official' record of the election in Michigan as recognized by Michigan State Law. That record is the Qualified Voter File (QVF).

Michigan law requires that the Qualified Voter File (QVF) be made 'current' within seven (7) days after an election. So, one would think that when we take a look at the Qualified Voter File that is published 28 days following an election, all of the recorded votes would be included in the file. Well, EIF tested that theory....

## The Qualified Voter File (QVF) for Votes Cast on November 3, 2020:

---

The Secretary of State's website indicates that there were 5,579,317 ballots cast in the November 03, 2020 election (that is over 5 ½ million ballots). So if we look at a Qualified Voter File (QVF) from December 01, 2020 (this is 28 days past the election date and 21 days past the legally mandated reporting date deadline), we would expect that the state's recorded number of ballots cast would be equal (or almost equal) to the 5,579,317 ballots cast shown on the website.

Logic would suppose that to be true; Math would confirm that to be true; and the Law would require that to be true.



However, much to our consternation, Michigan appears to be a place where laws and logic don't seem to apply and where fuzzy math reigns supreme. In fact, we see that things fall apart pretty quickly on just about all measures of accuracy in reporting.

So, the state's official QVF is missing 104,197 votes in the December 01, 2020 file.

Someone then manages to 'find' 915 votes and add them to the file before publishing the December 31, 2020 QVF ... but the report still showed 103,222 missing votes. Really?!

Finally, when we look at the ballots cast in the April 1, 2021 QVF for the 11/3/20 election we still see a shortfall of 68,014 ballots.

Now if we sit down with a clerk they will tell us that the QVF is a dynamic document - that voters are being added and deleted constantly. While that is true, we believe that the QVF has never represented the votes cast in November 2020 and that the election staff have been conditioned to use the 'dynamic nature' of the QVF as an excuse to hide the lack of credibility and mismanagement of the document.

Additionally, before our government workers and/or the complicit and compliant media that tends to do their bidding starts saying that 104,197 votes is not enough to overturn the election, let us remind everyone that this lost vote issue is just one of MANY disturbing display-of-data issues identified with the November 2020 election.

Then, for those who want to jump up and point the finger away from themselves by saying 'look to Wayne county', well gang – not this time.

We would never suggest that Wayne county had a purely unadulterated election – we are highly suspect that they didn't – but this issue can be found just about everywhere in Michigan.

We have identified issues within 57 of Michigan's 83 counties so far and we are still counting. Make no mistake, that represents 68.67 percent of the counties ... that's a majority by anybody's standard and we are not done sleuthing. So if you are thinking that because you live in Keweenaw, Luce or Kalkaska that these problems do not apply to you – YOU WOULD BE WRONG.



## Irrefutable Math in the lovely County of Grand Traverse:



Here is a photo of the county courthouse in beautiful downtown Traverse City, situated in Grand Traverse County along the magnificent shores of Lake Michigan. As of 2020 the population of Grand Traverse County was 95,238.

There are a total of 39 voting precincts in Grand Traverse County. You might not be able to easily discern this fact if you simply look at the Precinct Map posted to the county website:

We asked Christine at the Grand Traverse County Clerk’s office to verify the exact number of voting precincts, so we are pretty sure that we can confidently state this number to be true.

Just using Grand Traverse County as an example, we will show you a bit more detail around late and lost votes.

Looking at just a handful of precincts in Grand Traverse County, we find that the December 01, 2020 Qualified Voter File (QVF) reported absentee votes and in-person votes cast for the majority of precincts. Yet Mayfield Township 1 and Long Lake Township 3 had no in-person votes cast on November 3, 2020?

To add a little subjective analysis to the mix, according to a website that sources data from the US Census 2020, Mayfield Township has a reported total population of 1,517. Of that total, it is reported that approximately 76 percent of those Mayfield Twp. residents are between the ages of 18 and 80. That would be around 1,153 people of relative voting age. So, if 995 people are registered to vote, that would mean that 86 percent of voting age people are registered to vote. Why would only 37 percent of these registered voters have voted? And why would none of them have voted in person? Good questions.

Additionally these two precincts of interest (Mayfield Township 1 and Long Lake Township 3) had official vote totals that are off by 1,561 votes.\* Are we kidding? No, we are not. Look at the data.

If those good people of voting age in either one of these two precincts voted in person, they should be very unhappy right about now. Don't you think that someone should be held accountable for the fact that it appears that their vote didn't get recorded? But the real question is, "Did their vote get counted?"

Remember that in Report 1, (called A Sample Canvass - the Michigan Legislature), we identified three legislators, John Roth (Grand Traverse County), Aric Nesbitt (Van Buren County) and Steve Marino (Macomb County) who have late and lost votes. We can now share that Representative John Roth and Senator Aric Nesbitt were not alone.

**Every in-person voter in their voting precincts was a late / lost vote victim in November 2020.**

As for Representative Steve Marino (Macomb County), his lost vote appears to be one of many lost votes that we are randomly finding across the state. So yes, while there are big patterns to the late / lost votes allowing us to quantify at least 55,132 lost votes in the QVF, there are also issues of votes late / lost with no pattern to be found.

In all, we have **57 counties – 131 precincts - and AT LEAST 50,154 LATE AND LOST IN-PERSON VOTES** which have experienced this issue related to November 2020. (Note: We estimate another 4,978 late and lost absentee votes from Wayne County for a minimum estimate of 55,132 TOTAL late and lost votes.)

At the risk of causing further indignation to our readers, please remember that the three legislators identified as having lost/late votes in EIF's Report 1 were all members of the Republican Party. As we meet our "lost/late vote" voters from across the state, we do ask which party they cast a ballot for in the Presidential race of 2020. We know that this information might be considered anecdotal and only represents hearsay but **the truth remains that every single "lost/late vote" voter who volunteered a response indicated that they voted Republican in November 2020 – 100% Republican for the Presidential race.**

## So How Did This Happen?

One of our 3 lost vote legislators did reach out to their local clerk to understand what happened with his vote in November 2020. The clerk looked him up in a voter list printed from the election and reported that he did indeed vote. That is all true, but unless that vote is reported to the 'official' election document for the state of Michigan – the QVF – did it count? And since that vote was not reported within the 7 days as required by law, did it count?



Before you say, 'Well the clerk forgot to load the data,' lets pause for a moment. How conceivable is it that the clerk in Long Lake Township (or any municipality for that matter), who is tasked with the constitutional duty of managing election data, would remember to load the electronic poll book for two precincts and somehow forget to load the electronic poll book for a third precinct? If that did indeed happen then we are back to the same two questions:

- 1) How much incompetence are the American people going to endure in their election data management systems?
- 2) How much malfeasance are we going to tolerate?

And, how are we to interpret the fact that we have had reports of clerks indicating that the QVF seemed 'glitchy' that day. Really? Glitchiness; Incompetence; or Malfeasance? None of these options square with transparency and trustworthiness.

Here is the crux of the matter. Systems are in place to alert clerks when data is not being transmitted in a timely manner. It begins with pinging the city and/or township clerks, then pinging the county clerks and continuing up the chain of command to the state level.

What is pinging? Ping is the acronym for Packet Internet Groper, which is a method for determining the amount of time it takes for computer data to travel between two networks.

So are we to surmise that the communications monitoring system was conveniently disabled for the 2020 election? Say it isn't so ... no, rather... prove it isn't so.

Then, are we to believe that clerks across 131 precincts forgot to load or cross check their records? ... plus 57 county clerks; plus the State Board of Canvassers; plus the Secretary of State and oh – lets not forget the Auditor General who neglected to pick up this issue in their March of 2022 report? We repeat: Prove it isn't so.

So again, as we march through the election data systems we ask, "How exactly was the 2020 election the safest, most secure election ever?"

## How about a FOIA?

If you are feeling a bit stumped by now, fear not, former State Senator Patrick Colbeck is stumped too. He filed a Freedom of Information (FOIA) request with the Secretary of State's office back in December of 2021 (more than a year after the November 3, 2020 election) and asked for a list of voters from that November 2020 election.

As of this writing, he has not received the data. The state has graciously agreed to provide the list, and he has submitted the \$750+ deposit, but he continues to wait for the data.



Senator Colbeck, we believe you will be waiting a long time because it is our belief that the state can not provide the report that you have requested because they can not tell you to whom the 5,579,317 ballots cast belong.

## What's Next?

---

For those of you wondering if your vote counted or not, we have listed the 131 precincts with issues that have been identified in Exhibit 1 below. While your first instinct will be to call your local clerk, we instead recommend you reach out to your legislators (See phone directory in Exhibit 2). Let them know that the time for them to request an audit has long since passed.

It is time for them to nullify the November 2020 election and recall the Michigan electors.

Or, as we have said, prove it isn't so.
