It is easy to get injured by magnets and lack of concentration is the single biggest cause of injury when handling magnets.

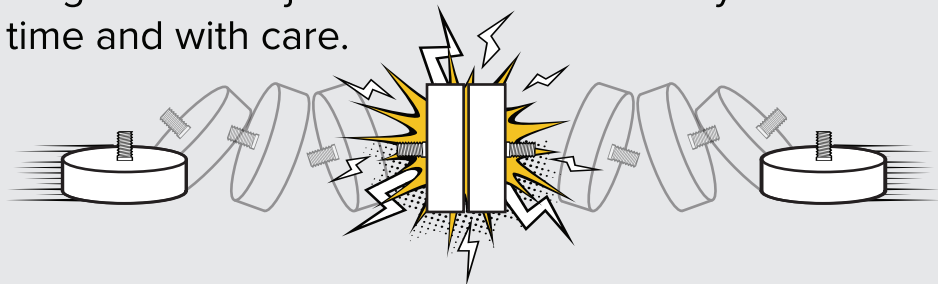
- Always wear safety goggles when handling strong magnets.
- Always wear gloves when handling magnets to prevent pinching.
- Children should NEVER be allowed to play with magnets.

WARNING: *If more than one magnet is swallowed, they can attract each other through the walls of the intestines, get stuck and pinch the digestive tract causing major swelling and even life-threatening injuries requiring surgery. Always keep all magnets out of the reach of children.*

Tech items that you should keep away from magnets.

- Credit or debit Cards that may have a magnetic stripe
- Computer Hard Drives
- Phones
- Televisions
- Pacemakers
- Anything with Magnetic Data

Warning: Two magnets can leap together with extreme speed and great force if placed loosely apart. This can cause damage to magnets and injuries to hands and body. Handle magnets one at a time and with care.



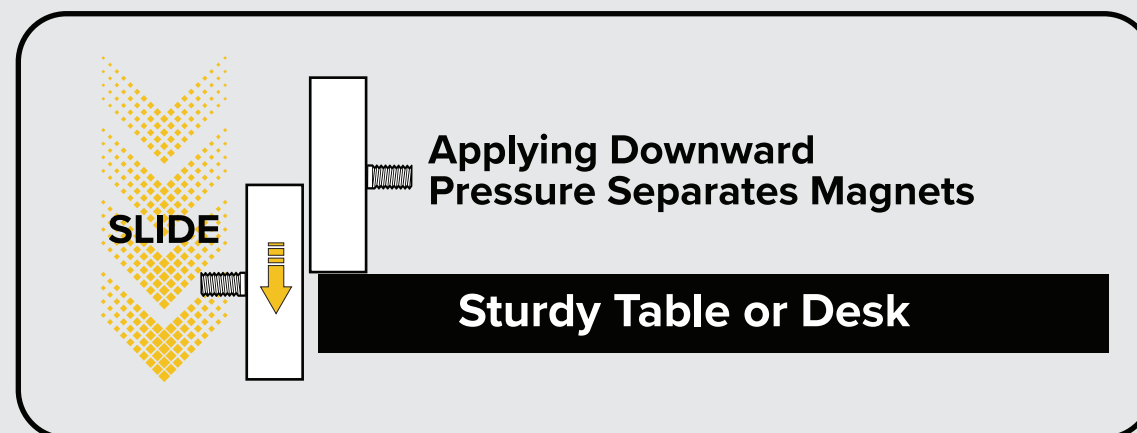

Recommendations on Handling Magnets Safely

- Use eye protection and work gloves when working with magnets.
- Pay close attention when you are separating or handling magnets.
- To separate attached magnets, grasp one magnet, and slide it off in a downward motion, pulling it away quickly.
- Work on a metal table or surface, so that magnets stay where you set them and don't jump together.
- When you have magnets in both hands, remember to keep your hands far apart.
- Do not drill or machine magnets.
- Seek immediate medical attention for any serious injuries.
- Magforce magnets will retain their magnetism and integrity when handled, utilized and protected properly.

Separating attached magnets

Use a sturdy table or desk and overhang one magnet. Apply strong downward pressure to separate. Once separated, keep moving the magnet to a safe distance. **Handling Tip:** It's 5x easier to slide magnets apart than it is to pull them apart.
