TRENDING RECLAIMED WOOD FLOORS

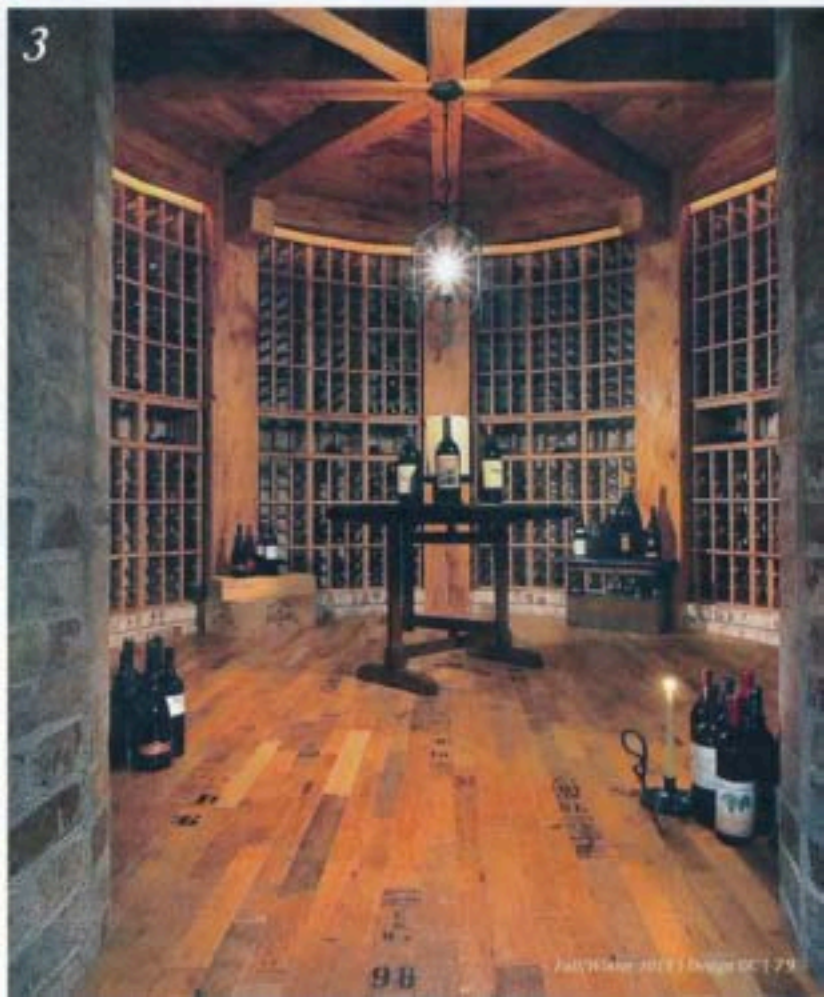
Age Gracefully! Give up the idea of perfection and celebrate the flaws in reclaimed wood flooring. Choose wood with character, so when you drop that glass, the divot goes unnoticed, and is actually celebrated.

1 / Milled from antique barn and granary boards, this distinctive floor is a mixture of red and white oak. Adorned with solid knots, occasional wormholes, original saw marks, stress cracks, nail and spike holes, and other remnants of long ago use, this historic material offers a character that's impossible to create with new flooring. 2 / Salvaged primarily from century-old barns in Ohio, Pennsylvania, Virginia, and Kentucky, this oak plank flooring is endowed with a naturally rich patina created by countless decades of sun, wind, and rain. A special milling technique is used to preserve the original face of this remarkable wood that maintains all aspects of its distinctive character; including the original saw marks, color variations, random knots, nail holes and height variations. TRENDING REPURPOSED MATERIALS

Everything old is new again. Wine barrels transformed into floors? Old barn doors recycled into beams and new partitions for walls? What better way to lessen the footprint on Mother Earth than repurposing well made items into a second act.

1/ These Hand Hewn Oak beams were pulled from an early 1900s barn in Wisconsin and custom crafted to make up this truss system design. Beams are all harvested from barns East of the Mississippi and go through a rigorous process, which brings them back to life for several more centuries. 2/ The wood was purchased from an Amish family in Wisconsin. The barn started construction in the late 1800s. The wood is a mix of hardwoods consisting of elm and oak. The boards are re-sawn making one side flat so they can be affixed to a wall. Available at Reclaimed Wood Crafts, Laguna Hills, reclaimedwoodcrafts.com
