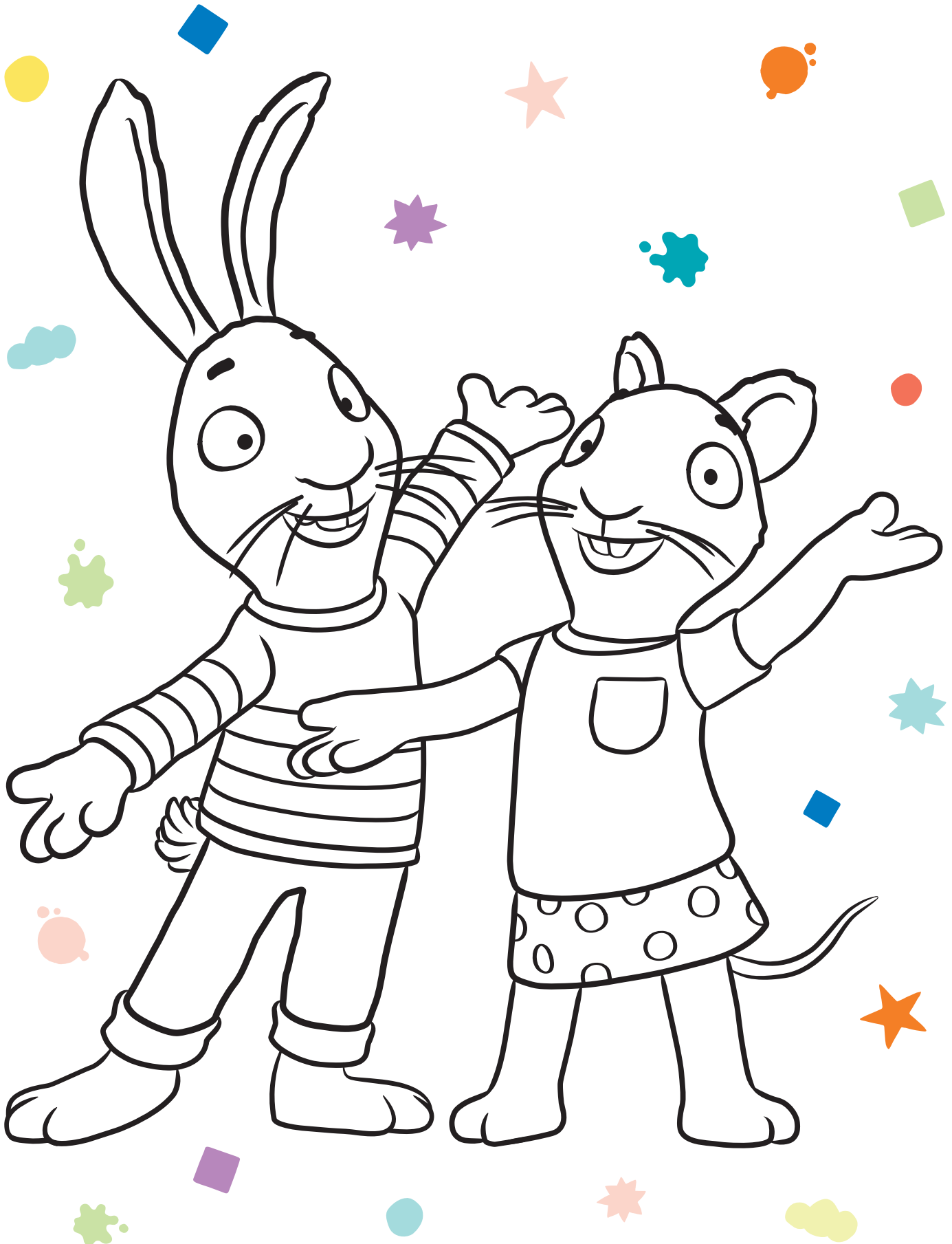

puppet



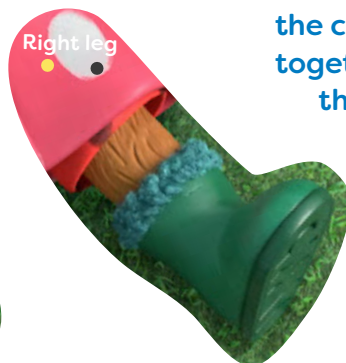
Posy was sad when there was no snow to play in. Pip said they could still have fun without it. Do you like their snow angels?

Instructions

1. Print the sheet and cut out the body, arms and legs.
2. With a pointed object on a soft surface, e.g. a pencil on an old folded tea towel, pierce holes where you see the black and yellow dots on the body, arms and legs. Twist the pencil around in the hole to make it larger if required. (See diagram 1 on the next page.)
3. Using the ruler and scissors, measure and cut six lengths of 8cm string and one length of 20cm.
4. Thread one string through the hole in the left shoulder of the body. Take the left arm and thread the string through where the black dots were. (Refer to the on-screen version.) Tie a knot to make a moving joint. The string should be loose in the joint to allow free movement. (See diagram 2.)
5. Repeat for the other arm and both legs. Looser joints allow for more movement. The knots can be adjusted at the end.
6. With the puppet face down on a flat surface, thread another piece of string through where the yellow dots were, joining the arms together. Making sure the string isn't too tight between the arms. (See diagram 3.) Repeat for the legs.
7. Take the 20cm string and tie a knot at the centre of the string that joins the arms together. Feed it under the string joining the legs together and tie another knot. Let the remaining string hang down. (See diagram 4.)



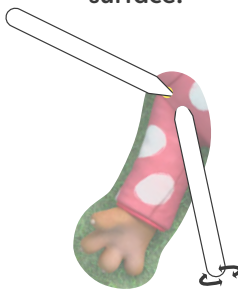
That's it! Pull on the long string to make Posy's arms and legs move!

Repeat the process from the Posy page to make a Pip snow angel puppet.



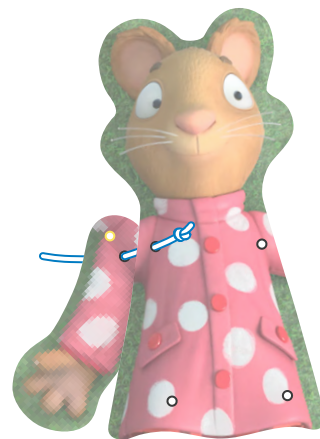
Diagram 1

Make a small hole in the black and yellow dots with a pointed object on a soft surface.



Twist the pencil into the hole to make the opening neater and larger.

Leave some slack between the body and the arm so that it can move freely. Pull the string through and tie a loose knot at the back.

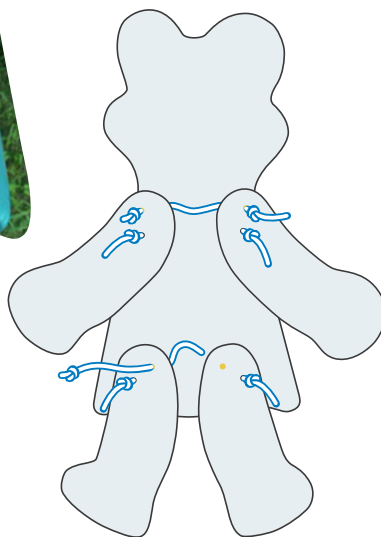
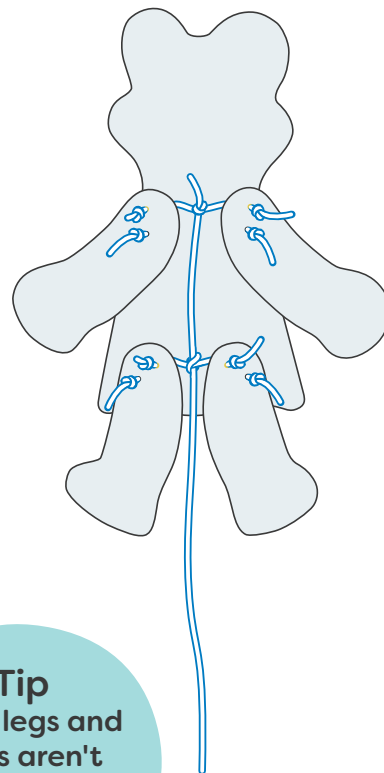
