

#### **DURING READING:**


- Is there a main character in this book?

- What is the message the author is trying to share with you?
- Why are some words in bold typeface and others aren't?

#### **AFTER READING:**

- What is the main message of this story?
- What does the author want you to think about?
- What is your favorite page in this book? Why?
- How do the illustrations in the book make you feel?
- Learning new things can be hard sometimes. What can you do if things are hard to learn?
- What is the author's purpose for writing this book?
- What is a task that was hard for you? How did you (or could you) work toward accomplishing the task?




