Sheldon Kennedy - Biography

Sheldon Kennedy won a Memorial Cup, World Junior Gold Medal and skated for three teams in his eight-year NHL career. He is best known for his courageous decision to charge his Major Junior Hockey league coach with sexual assault for the abuse he suffered over a five year period while a teenager under his care. Through this disclosure, and the important work that Sheldon continues to do, he has become an inspiration to millions around the world.

Kennedy's off-ice contributions are extensive and his impact has extended will beyond sport and the Canadian border. Sheldon has been instrumental in bringing governments, public and private sector partners together to work collaboratively to influence policy change and improve the way child abuse is handled. He has influenced changes in Canadian law and has taken his message to the International Olympic Committee and the US Senate. His impact has extended well beyond sport and the Canadian border.

Sheldon was Co-Founder of the Calgary Child Advocacy Centre, the first-of-its-kind in Canada, offering full wraparound services for victims of child abuse. He is also the Co-Founder of *Respect Group*, which provides empowering online abuse, bullying and harassment prevention education to sport organizations, schools and the workplace. Respect Group has currently certified over 2 million Canadians.

- Designed and launched the "Speak Out" program with Hockey Canada in 1997
- In-line skated across Canada in 1998 to raise awareness of child abuse and donated all \$ 1.2 M proceeds to the Canadian Red Cross to maintain the Speak Out program
- Named Newsmaker of the Year in 1997 and featured in hundreds of media interviews and keynote speeches, in Canada and abroad, to influence social change
- Co-founded the Sheldon Kennedy Child Advocacy Centre
- Spent countless volunteer hours as Lead Director of the Sheldon Kennedy/Calgary Child Advocacy Centre and was instrumental in the development and implementation of an Integrated Practice Model
- Instrumental in bringing the topic of Mental Health and Addiction into the realm of Sport and beyond
- Co-Founded Respect Group which has certified over 2 M Canadians through the *Respect in Sport* programs, designed to prevent bullying, abuse, harassment and discrimination
- Anonymous volunteer resource for the NHLPA substance abuse program
- Athlete member/Subject Matter Expert of the International Olympic Committee Medical Committee
- Change Agent for Federal Legislation (Victims of Crime)
- Change Agent for Provincial Legislation (Sharing of information)
- Won numerous Awards (see below) including the Order of Canada and the Hockey Canada Order of Merit

1997	Gordon Kirke publishes <i>Players First Report</i> on behalf of the Canadian Hockey League in response to the Sheldon Kennedy case. This Report lead to the creation of Hockey Canada's " <i>Speak Out program</i> " which was mandatory classroom training for all hockey coaches.

1998 May - Oct	Kennedy In-line skates across Canada. Covers 8000 kilometers in 4 ½ months. From meeting with Prime Minister Chrétien, consoling other victims and speaking in small communities and hockey arenas across the country, Kennedy gets daily media coverage, and increases Canadian's awareness of child sexual abuse.
1999	Sheldon Kennedy Foundation donates all \$ 1.2M proceeds from the in-line skate to the Canadian Red Cross to grow and maintain the <i>Speak Out</i> program for Hockey Canada
2004	Kennedy Co-Founds Respect Group. A company devoted to the on-line training (<i>Respect in Sport</i>) of Canadian coaches, parents and officials to prevent bullying, abuse, harassment and discrimination in sport.
