
BD Barcelona Design is the Spanish furniture company with the most international prestige. Founded in 1972, its catalogue features designs from the most important contemporary creators including Álvaro Siza Vieira, Ettore Sottsass, Alessandro Mendini, Oscar Tusquets, Lluís Clotet, Pepe Cortés, Cristian Zuzunaga, Alfredo Häberli, Jaime Hayon, Konstantin Grcic, Ross Lovegrove, Doshi Levien, Färg & Blanche, Stephen Burks and the Campana Brothers, amongst others, as well as historic names such as Gaudí and artists like Salvador Dalí. During its long existence, BD has been recognised by the Spanish Premio Nacional de Diseño (1989), the European Community Design Prize (1990), the Red Dot Design Award 'best of the best' in 2011 and the prestigious Delta Career Award in 2022.



In the late 60's, a group of young architects decided to produce the designs they needed for their projects. Very soon many architects and friends contacted them to buy their products and in 1972 they decided to create a company to produce them.

From the beginning, BD has strived to combine the most unusual and modern proposals with classic design pieces. Respect for the masters is evident as much in the first pieces of furniture from Gregotti as in the first reissues of pieces signed by Terragni, Rietveld and Mackintosh. Bocaccio Design's first pieces were a little roguish. This delightful, pious bed head created by Xavier Sust, one of the first collaborators with the then small production company, has the appearance of an exclusive piece from an antique shop.

Long-lasting designs

There is a fact that confirms the success of the adventure BD started out on in 1972: the longevity of many of the designs it has produced. Antoni Gaudí

Without a doubt, Antoni Gaudí (1852 - 1926) is the most internationally famous Spanish architect, but it is not just his buildings and ingenious architectural solutions that have taken the world by storm. His overall approach to architecture led him to become involved with all the decorative elements. including furniture, that were to form part of the building. The admiration of many modern designers for Gaudí furniture has not gone unnoticed by BD, which was the first company to rescue them from history to create handcrafted series of reproductions using the same materials - varnished solid oak - and the whole wealth of details used in the manufacture of the originals.

Ettore Sottsass

Ettore Sottsass (Insbruck, Austria, 1917) was a grandee of late 20th century Italian design. Best known as the founder of the early 1980s Memphis collective, he also designed iconic products for Olivetti, as well as beautiful glass and ceramics. He's one of the most illustrious collaborators with BD. In the 1970s, ten years before he formed the mythical Memphis group, Sottsass was a regular visitor to Barcelona. He had fallen in love with a beautiful student at the Eina School, Fruit of this love affair and his time in our country is this vase of rose-colored ceramic, which he named Shiva. BD had only just been born and so with it this modern fertility symbol. The genius and risqué character of the master have been preserved in the original catalogue of this iconic piece that is still in production.











Oscar Tusquets

Born in Barcelona in 1941, Oscar Tusquets presents himself publicly as an architect by training, a designer by adaptation, a painter by vocation and a writer through the desire to make friends. In other words, the prototype of the complete artist that the specialisation of the modern world has steadily driven to extinction. He graduated as an architect in 1965 from Barcelona's Escuela Técnica Superior de Arquitectura and was a member of Studi Per, together with Pep Bonet. Cristian Cirici, Lluís Clotet and Mireia Riera, with all of whom he set out in 1972 on the adventure of BD, where he began his work as a designer of furniture and objects, thanks to which he has won the Spanish National Design Award and seen a number of his pieces appear in the collections of such major museums as the MoMA in New York and the Centre George Pompidou in Paris

Konstantin Grcic

Born in Madrid in 1974, Jaime Hayon can boast one of the most glittering careers to be seen in the recent history of contemporary design. Although born and trained in Madrid, he was forged as a designer with Fabrica, the breeding ground of creativity run by Benetton near the Italian city of Treviso, where he arrived in 1997, when he had barely turned 24, to work under Oliviero Toscani, who would soon put him in charge of the design department. It was at Fabrica that he first worked with BD on the Mail Me project. In 2004, Hayon decided to branch out on his own, so he settled in Barcelona and began working on a number of projects while also exhibiting his more personal work in art galleries. His exhibition entitled Mediterranean Digital Baroque, at London's David Gill Gallery, and the bathroom collection that of simplicity. he designed for ArtQuitect marked the start of his meteoric international rise, which was established with

Konstantin Grcic (1965) was trained as a cabinet maker at The John Makepeace School for Craftsmen in Wood before studying Design at the Royal College of Art in London. He set up his own office in Munich in 1991. Today, Konstantin Grcic Design GmbH is based in Berlin. The office is active in several fields ranging from industrial design projects, exhibition design and architectural collaborations. Konstantin Grcic defines function in human terms, combining formal strictness with considerable mental acuity and humour. Each of his products is characterized by his careful research into the history of design and architecture and his passion for technology and materials. Known for pared-down pieces, Grcic is often called a minimalist but the designer himself prefers to speak

Stephen Burks Stephen Burks (Chicago, 1969) is both a traveler and a designer. For over a decade he has dedicated his work to building a bridge between authentic craft traditions. industrial manufacturing, and contemporary design. Since 2005, Burks has consulted with nonprofits including Aid to Artisans, the Clinton Global Initiative Design Network Africa. Artesanias de Colombia and the Nature Conservancy, uniting the artisan, the designer, and global brands in a triangle of immersive development. With his New York-based studio, Stephen Burks Man Made, Burks has produced innovative products, furniture, lighting and exhibitions for a range of international clients including B&B Italia, Boffi, Cappellini, Dedar, Dedon, Harry Winston, Missoni, Moroso Parachilna, Roche Bobois and Swarovski.

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



Antoni Gaudí is without a doubt Spain's most internationally famous architect, but not only for his buildings and his ingenious architectural solutions that have been adopted worldwide. His holistic approach to architecture led him to conceive not only structural solutions, but also decorative elements, including furniture, that would become part of the building. Gaudían furniture has been greatly admired by many modern designers and this did not go unnoticed by BD. It was the first company to rescue the pieces from the history books and reproduce them, 'mass producing' them yet in an artisan way, using the same materials – solid varnished oak – and all the richness of detail of the originals.



Connection from its roots with architecture


BD has been very close to the Contract world for nearly 50 years, given its connection from its roots with architecture. Designs have been developed and tailor-made in Barcelona with the needs of top architects and interior designers in mind for installing offices, hotels, restaurants and public space projects, indoor and outdoor.



Lord's Cricket Ground

Place

At the heart of Lord's, the most important cricket ground in the world, is the Victorian Members' Pavilion. To watch games, tradition holds that the members sit on benches, not individual seats, on the three stepped tiers. Fitted end to end means they can squeeze in on busy days, or spread out when there is room. The whole stadium has been modernized with new stands and ergonomic seating. The time had come for an upgrade to the timberslatted benches as they were not ergonomic (uncomfortable for a full day's cricket) and were very expensive to maintain.








As Design Director at Bridges Associates I was tasked with finding the replacement. Easier said than done. We could not find an off-the shelf bench which was slatted, upholstered and fitted the somewhat bespoke dimensions of the Lord's terraces. Konstantin Grcic's Bench B came closest so I spoke to Jordi Arnau at BD Barcelona who immediately understood the challenge. With the sort of can-do attitude that has made BD famous, he proposed changes to the dimensions of the cast aluminium frame and

the slats, all weather upholstery, and various small details that effectively turned the bench into a bespoke product without losing its essential beauty. Lord's is a byword in tradition. The Pavilion houses committees that regulate the international game, as well as holding astonishing collections of artefacts and paintings which illustrate cricket from its beginnings on a field nearby. The benches are a visible part of the tradition, so it is very significant that the new refined design has been accommodated so seamlessly.

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Homes with personality

The multifaceted personality of BD Barcelona adapts to a multitude of styles, from reimagined historical interiors to contemporary, eclectic environments. Starting from Spain's Can Llimona, this global overview takes us from Australia to Brazil, passing through Colombia, Italy and the UK. Colour, texture and architecture form a canvas for each piece, its presence enriching a space with nods to the history of art, avantgarde design, humour and modernity.

Can Llimona

Built in the late 18th century, Can Llimona was designed as a traditional "masia", the typical rural structure found across Catalonia, originally featuring three floors dedicated to precise functions that included space for livestock, housing and a granary. Bought by Spanish artist Joan Llimona in the 19th century, over the years the building has evolved, with influences from Catalan Modernism in 1909, and a subtly contemporary intervention which was completed eighty years later by BD Barcelona co-founder Lluís Clotet, in collaboration with Jose Antonio Martínez de la Peña.
