## IT CAN BE TRICKY FINDING YOUR SIZE!

We offer a few methods using this tool. Measure your finger a few times throughout the day, as size can change with heat and swelling. Most of our rings cannot be resized (for example, most rings with stones or patterns all around). To be positive of your size, visit a local jeweler and get sized in person.

## Method 01. Measure an Existing Ring

1. Have a ring that fits your desired finger perfectly already? Awesome! First, check the band width* is comparable to the piece you are thinking of purchasing.
2. Print this document with "Page Sizing" set to "Actual Size" on your print dialog box. Measure the 2 inch scale at the top right side odf page with a ruler before proceeding.
3. Place the ring on the circles below. The ring should fully encompass the black circle, so you can see the complete black circle inside the ring. If the ring falls between two sizes, order the larger size.

## Method 02. Create a Paper Sizer

Cut out the ring sizer and cut a slit on the vertical bronze line. Wrap the ruler around the base of the intended finger.
Pull the angled end through the slit until the paper fits comfortably around your finger.


FOR WIDE BANDS: People usually need to go up a half to a full size for a ring with a wider band. If you're measuring an existing ring, ensure the band width is similar.

ASK A PRO: We cannot guarantee that ring sizing via paper will be accurate. We highly recommend getting sized by a local jeweler. Most of our rings cannot be resized
