

# Clemson Spineless Okra



The standard variety in the South. Suitable to be grown in containers and the cream-colored flowers are beautiful and edible. Abundant harvest for grilling, sautéing, frying, or for soups and gumbo!

# Crookneck Squash



This traditional variety is well known for its buttery flavor and firm texture. Big plants are late to begin bearing, but then yield consistently over a long period.

# Zephyr Squash



Unique appearance and great flavor! Fruits are yellow with faint white stripes and green blossom ends. Harvest young at 4-6" for unusually delicious nutty flavor and firm texture.

# Goldfinch Squash



Excellent early, steady yields of beautiful tender yellow squash perched on a long central stem. Upright growth habit lends well to container gardening!

# Dunja Zucchini



Excellent disease resistance and high yields of attractive straight green glossy fruit. Compact plant single stemmed with short spines.

# Safari Zucchini



Great zucchini with attractive white stripes! Prolific yielder of attractive, glossy fruits on nearly spineless plants.

# Diva Cucumber



Seedless, slicing cucumber. Flavorful thin-skinned cucumbers are distinctly crisp, sweet, and bitter-free. Harvest at 5-7” for AAS winner flavor!

# Mexican Sour Gherkin



A unique specialty cucumber also known as the Cucamelon. Cute 1" fruits look like miniature watermelons and taste like cucumbers with a hint of lime. Great eaten fresh or pickled!



# Adam Gherkin Cucumber



Extremely productive European pickling cucumber. Fruits are blanketed with tiny spines and are dependable for great flavor, crisp texture, and even color. Nicely proportioned at 2-3”.

# Max Pack Cucumber



Huge yields of very uniform and attractive 4.5" picklers on vigorous vines. Small seed cavity, dense flesh, and sweet flavor make it perfect for pickles.

# Muncher Cucumber



A favorite low acid slicer that is very prolific and tender! Smooth, nearly spineless medium green cucumbers about 8-10" long and 2-3" wide.

# Crimson Sweet Watermelon



This is a classic large watermelon with excellent flavor and texture. Dark and yellow-green striped, 10"x12" block oval fruits weight in at 15-25 lbs. Leave room for them to sprawl.

# Sugar Baby Watermelon



The standard of "icebox" melons! Round 6-8" fruits average 8-10 lbs. and are a solid dark green, almost black, when ripe.

# Sarah's Favorite Melon



Consistently comes out on top as the best tasting cantaloupe. It is the ideal 3 lb. size and best harvested when a gentle tug removes the fruit from the vine.
