#### working out the final quantities

The general rule is to allow one invitation per couple, single or family. If you want to invite a family unit as a whole but they don't live at the same address, it's one for each household/living address.

#### don't forget the spares!

Once you've worked out your final list and invitation quantities in the previous worksheet section, don't forget to add in at least 5 to 10 spares. It may seem like a lot but there's always a last-minute invitation, someone who is forgotten from the main list, or the parents will nonchalantly mention "oh, did you remember about Uncle and Aunt So-and-So?" once you've ordered! Having spares also means that you avoid waiting for (and the expense of) reprints later on.

All you need to do now is print this beauty out and start writing down the names of your nearest, dearest, and best-beloved people. You can then tick off when you've sent each family/couple/single their invitation, when you get their RSVP back, and write down how many from each family/couple/single are attending so you know how many people to expect and plan for with your caterers, venues, and for your on-day stationery like placecards and menus as well as how many wedding favours or bombonniere you'll need to order.

We've numbered the left column so you can easily keep track of how many invitations in total you'll need.
