













Sheetrock Clearance Instructions

Note: Depending on your safe model, it may already have clearance cuts for your Swing Out Rack and no further modifications are required. Please check before proceeding. If so, refer to page 8 for installation.

To install your new Swing Out Rack, the six holes on the left side of your safe's door opening must have enough sheetrock cut away from behind them. Please follow these steps for checking the sheetrock clearance and to cut away sheetrock as necessary.


- Using a ruler and tape measure, check if there is at least 1.25 inches of clearance to the sheet rock above the first hole, then below the third hole on the top set of holes. Do this same process for the bottom set of holes. Refer to the diagram on Figure 1.
- 2. If the sheetrock clearance is less than 1.25 inches, use the tape measure/ ruler and a box cutter to cut away excess sheet rock.

- Note: 2 people are recommended for the following steps. If installing alone, use a rolled up towel, blanket, or piece of foam to set the Swing Out Rack on while inside your safe. Failure to do so can cause damage to the safe or Swing Out Rack, or cause personal injury.
- Align the top hinge with the top 3 pre-drilled holes on the safe door flange. Ensure the hinge curls are facing inside and the hinge is behind the flange as shown in Figure 2.
- 2. Use three 16mm Screws (#5) and three Nylock Nuts (#3) to attach hinge to door flange.
- 3. Repeat for bottom section.


SOR13 Safe Install:

- Align the top hinge with the top three pre-drilled holes on the safe door flange. Ensure the hinge curls are facing inside and the hinge is behind the flange as shown in Figure 3.
- 2. Use three 20mm Screws (#3) and three Nylock Nuts (#5) to attach hinge to door flange.
- 3. Repeat for bottom section.

SOR13 on SafeX[®] Models Install:

- Align the top hinge with the top three pre-drilled holes on the safe door flange. Ensure the hinge curls are facing inside and the hinge is behind the flange as shown in Figure 3.
- 2. Use three 20mm Screws (#7) and three Nylock Nuts (#6) to attach hinge to door flange.
- 3. Repeat for bottom section.

Do not exceed the weight rating of 100lbs for the Swing-Out Rack. Rhino Metals is not liable for damage caused by improper installation of Swing Out Rack



LIMITED WARRANTY (Accessories)

Rhino Metals, Inc. ("Company") warrants to the original consumer ("Purchaser") a Limited Warranty ("Warranty") covering defects in workmanship and material. Warranty is for a period of one (1) year from the date of original purchase and is not assignable or transferable to any other person.

- 1. Any damage to the product as a result or destruction, misuse, tampering, abuse, neglect, accident, improper installation, modification, unauthorized service or violation of the instructions furnished by Company will void Warranty.
- 2. The sole responsibility of Company shall be limited to the repair or replacement (in its sole discretion) of any component of the product which fails to conform to Warranty at no cost to Purchaser for a period of one (1) year from the date of the original purchase.
- 3. Contact Company directly to obtain service under Warranty. A Return Authorization must first be obtained prior to returning defective products to Company.
- 4. Products shipped without prior Return Authorization may not be accepted. Company will not be responsible for their disposition and/or cost of return to Purchaser.
- 5. Company will not assume any responsibility for any loss or damage incurred in shipping. All returned products should include a copy of the original invoice or proof of purchase for Warranty to be honored.
- 6. Warranty is not an insurance policy, and Company is not responsible for damage or theft of Purchaser's product or its contents.
- 7. Any implied warranties with Purchaser may have a limit to the duration of the warranties described above. There are no further warranties which extend or apply beyond the face hereof, and Company expressly disclaims and excludes all warranties of merchantability or fitness for a particular purpose. Some states do not allow limitation on how long an implied Warranty lasts, so the above limitation may not apply to Purchaser.
