

Professional Feather Dye Instructions

Items needed:

- Wild Fletching Professional Feather Dye
- Water
- Dawn Dish Soap OR other mild detergent
- White vinegar OR Citric Acid

Before you start:

This dye is very concentrated and **will stain almost anything** it comes in contact with including skin and countertops. Use Pyrex glass, enamel coated, or stainless steel for dyeing.

Cleaning your feathers:

For best results soak feathers in warm to hot tap water with 1 TBS of Dawn dish soap or mild detergent for 10-15 mins. Agitate to remove any dirt or blood. Then drain and rinse with water to remove any remaining soap

Large batch stovetop method:

- 1. Fill a stainless steel or enamel pot with enough water for the feathers to move freely, then heat on the stove.
- 2. In a separate dish dissolve the dye power in one cup of vinegar or 2 TBS of Citric Acid and 1 cup of water. Depending on the desired shade of color use 1%-3% of power to dry weight of feathers. For example, 1LB (448g) of feathers would take about ¼ oz (7g = full jar of dye) of dye or ¼ TSP dye for every 2 oz of feathers. (Recommended 1.5% for all colors)
- 3. Add the dye mixture to the pot of water and stir.
- 4. Add feathers to the pot and stir feathers to ensure even coverage.
- 5. Raise the temperature to 185°F to 200°F, just below boiling.
- 6. Maintain temperature and stir frequently for 30-60mins or until slightly darker than desired shade is achieved.
- 7. Remove feathers from dye bath and place in cold water bath for a few minutes to remove excess dye from the surface of the feathers.
- 8. Dry feathers with hair dryer or using a washer bag in the clothes dryer on high heat for 15-20 minutes.

Small Batch Microwave method

- 1. Mix water, ~1/4 tsp dye and vinegar (or citric acid) in a glass dish large enough for the feathers and small enough to fit in the microwave.
- 2. Add feathers to dye bath and microwave one minute at a time stirring between cycles until mixture is hot (185°F-200°F). Let feathers sit in hot dye bath until desired shade is reached. Microwave as needed to keep dye bath hot.
- 3. Remove feathers from dye bath and place in cold water bath for a few minutes to remove excess dye from the surface of the feathers.
- 4. Dry feathers with hair dryer or using a washer bag in the clothes dryer on high heat for 15-20 minutes.
