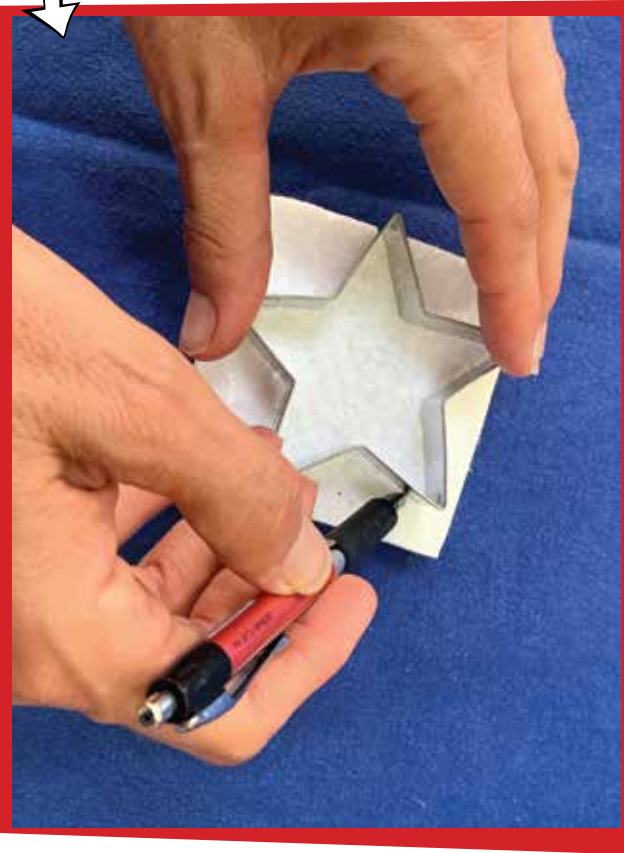


DAY 2

WRAPPED YARN ORNAMENTS

Step by step instructions:

1. Place the cookie cutter on top of the Styrofoam.
2. Using a pen, mark the outline of the star on the Styrofoam.



3. Poke sewing pins through the Styrofoam to mark out the outline (about 0.3" apart). Don't stick them all the way in.



- Materials in the box:**
- Star cookie cutter
 - Yarn
 - Styrofoam square
 - Sewing pins
 - Fishing string
 - Glitter powder
- Some extra stuff you need:**
- White glue
 - Pen
 - Scissors
 - Plastic fork



4. Pour some white glue into a small bowl.
5. Soak the yarn in the bowl with the glue but hold one end outside.
6. Slide the yarn through the fork prongs, then pull it up and through to remove excess glue.



7. Wrap the 'glue-soaked yarn' around the outline of the star shape. Wrap the yarn around the pins, first follow the star shape and then randomly cross from one side to the other to fill the inner part of the star. Try to wrap the yarn around all of the pins at least once.
8. Once you feel your shape is ready, tuck the end of the yarn (so it won't be seen).



9. Use your finger to gently push the yarn down on each of the pins. And also make sure all the layers of the yarn are touching each other so they stick together well once the glue dries.
10. Pour some glitter powder on top.

11. Let the yarn ornament dry overnight. It must be stiff and completely dry when you remove it from the pins.
12. The pins are going to be glued to the yarn, so you have to loosen the grip in a gentle circular movement to take them out. Once the dry glue breaks, use your fingernail to hold the yarn down as you pull out each of the pins from the Styrofoam.
13. Once all the pins have been removed, use a flat knife to separate the ornament from the Styrofoam.
14. Tie the star on the fishing string and hang it on your Christmas tree.
