## Safety Leadership An online workshop in two parts

This workshop is aimed at organisational leaders whose responsibilities include health, safety and wellbeing but who do not specialise in those fields.

This workshop looks at where the field of safety is now, and why numerous current approaches are not necessarily making workplaces more safe. We will approach safety with the rigour of science, and offer practical suggestions for how to do this.

Safety can improve when a scientific approach is used, and these can generalise into improvements in quality, production and other key desirable elements of organisational performance. This online workshop will outline what a scientific approach looks like and explain the knowledge and training required to get to the next step. We will look at various performance frameworks to help organisational leaders design a strategic and measurable approach to achieving successful and sustainable workplace safety.


## Workshop topics and outcomes:
