Bruce Faulkner, 3 Simple Rules	<b>Curating the Environment</b> Bruce will be talking about how when a leader asks for assurance that things are being done right that often gets translated into a demand for compliance. This was never what the leader intended. Bruce will explore the conditions that create this situation and describes how leaders can curate the environment to get what they actually intended.
Colin Spowart, Volvo	<b>Personal Reinforcement</b> Colin will discuss how his leadership style has changed using BMT and how that in turn has changed the source of his own positive reinforcement.
Garry Sanderson, Visualyze Solutions	<b>From Behavioural Safety to Behavioural Innovation</b> Garry will share his perspectives on the application of behavioural science to achieve improvements in business performance, innovation and change - highlighting important connections with the key areas of wellbeing and meaning at work.
Howard Lees, Hollin	The Hierarchy Effect Howards talk is called 'The hierarchy effect', he is going to discuss the characteristics of high and low performing teams, organisations and projects. Howard is a big fan of Sir Ken Robinson, whose talks severely criticises education systems in such a charming and interesting way that he always gets his message across, and to a smiling, appreciative audience. lan Bradler, Network Rail	London Bridge Redevelopment – Behavioural Science in Action A walk-through experience on the London Bridge Project where Behavioural Science was used as a tool to assist in solving an issue where significant risks were not being effectively managed despite there being rafts of process in place.
Joanne Benjamin, Hollin	<b>Under Pressure</b> Joanne will discuss the impact that stress and time demands have on a workplace and its safety culture. Her talk will highlight some of the barriers current workplaces are facing and consider what next steps can be taken to ensure we are reducing the pressures around us.
Peter Whitman, Taylor Woodrow	The Road to Success Peter Whitman will be speaking about some of the challenges he has encountered and lessons he has learned in his role as Highways Sector Director for Taylor Woodrow and in previous roles.
Rachel Edwards, Hollin	<b>24/7</b> One thing everyone has in common is time: 24 hours in a day, and 7 days in a week. Some people do a great job managing demands

	on their time, but others less so. Rachel's presentation will discuss the links between stress and time in the workplace, and consider strategies for making the most of the time available.
