

BEAR - BULL TRAP

The bull trap is a false bullish movement with a temporary exit from a congested zone. Investors buy stocks as prices exit the congested area and then see prices drop quickly. A bear trap works the same way but in reverse.





MARIO DRAGHI

CENTRAL BANK PRESIDENT: Mario Draghi (1947), after a transition in the Ministry of the Italian Treasury and in Goldman Sachs, became Governor of the Bank of Italy. He was also Chairman of the FSB and then Executive Director of the World Bank for Italy. In 2011 became President of the Europe an Central Bank until 2019. In 2021 he became Italy's Prime Minister.

LEVERAGE BUYOUT

It is a technique of purchasing a majority stake in a company, business unit or group of activities.

This operation can be carried out by launching a takeover bid on the stock market or through a confidential negotiation with the reference shareholders. It can also be hostile.

GEORGE SOROS

MANAGER: George Soros (1930) is famous for the "Black Wednesday" (09/16/1992), when he set up a short sale of pounds worth over \$10 billion, taking advantage of the BOE's immobility on adjusting its interest rates. A similar operation was carried out against the Italian lira, that was obliged to devalue by 30%. Soros also donated 11 billions for different causes.



WARREN BUFFET

MANAGER: Known as the "Oracle of Omaha", Warren Buffett (1930) is considered to be the largest value investor ever. In 1962 he began to acquire stakes in Berkshire Hathaway, with which he started to buy undervalued companies in the most varied sectors. He is also a notable philanthropist, most through the Gates Foundation.





DIVIDENDS VS INTEREST

Dividends refer to cash or shares paid out to shareholders of a company proportionally to the amount of capital they invested in the company. Interest is the amount paid by borrowers to lenders at a fixed rate and in a specified date for the use of the money lent.

PONZI SCHEME

The Ponzi scheme is an economic model of fraudulent sales conceived by Charles Ponzi, which promises strong gains to the victims, as long as they recruit new "investors". The last money collected are used to pay only interests. The scam collapses when people try to withdraw.





QUANTITATIVE EASING

It is a policy implemented by central banks to "create money" by purchasing government bonds or other bonds on the market or by increasing the amount of money lent to lenders through open market operations.





BACKWARDATION CONTANGO

In commodities typically the prices of the closest maturities are lower than those of the most distant. This normal situation is called contango and occurs as there are storage and maintenance costs. When, on the other hand, the value of the futures contracts is lower than the spot price, we speak of backwardation.

FLIGHT TO QUALITY

Flight to Quality occurs when all investors start shifting their asset allocation away from riskier investments into safer ones, for instance out of stocks and into bonds.


WHO IS SATOSHI NAKAMOTO?

SATOSHI NAKAMOTO

Satoshi Nakamoto is the pseudonym of Bitcoin's inventor, which results anonymous. In 2008, he published the "Bitcoin protocol" on The Cryptography Mailing list. In 2009, he distributed the first version of the client software and contributed to the project anonymously, before leaving the community in 2010. His last contact was in 2011.







TRAILING STOP

A trailing stop (or trailing profit) is a closing order that moves following the price rising movements, and is activated when a trend reversal occurs that could cause the loss of the profits earned up to that point.





Also known as "Risk management" in stock market investments language, it is an expression that refers to money management techniques aimed at maximizing profits and potentially reducing losses. It is usually related to the management of the sizes invested.







1929 CRISIS

On October 22, 1929, the president of the National City Bank stated: "I am not aware of anything fundamentally negative about the stock market." The following day, prices collapsed until October 24, "Black Thursday". On October 29, the "Black Tuesday", there was the sank of Wall Street with dramatic suicides by some brokers.

Exchange-traded funds (ETFs) are a type of investment funds belonging to ETPs (exchange-traded products), with the aim of replicating a reference index (benchmark). Unlike mutual funds and SICAVs, they are mostly passively managed and are listed on the stock exchange in the same way as shares and bonds.

SUBPRIME CRISIS

The crisis began around the second half of 2006, when the US housing bubble began to deflate and, at the same time, many holders of subprime mortgages became insolvent due to rising interest rates. In April 2009, the IMF estimated total losses of banks and other financial institutions worldwide at US \$ 4.1 trillion.

MANAGER: Steve Jobs (1955) was the co-founder of Apple Inc. and its CEO until 2011, when he resigned for health reasons. He also founded the NeXT Computer company and Pixar Animation Studios. It has introduced successful products such as Macintosh, iMac, iPod, iPhone and iPad.
