


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

Wall-Mounting Screws

- Mount the VESA bracket using 4*M4 isometric threaded screws (sold separately).
- · Screws (4pcs) for attaching the TV to the wall-mounting bracket (sold separately).

- 1. Lay the TV face down on a flat, cushioned surface to avoid damaging or scratching.
- 2. Insert 2 legs directly into the bottom of the base, no screw is needed.
- 1.Lay the TV face down on a flat, cushioned surface to avoid damaging or scratching.
- 2. Pull the 2 legs straight out of the base without screws.
- 3.Attach the wall-mount bracket to the TV using the mounting holes on the back of the TV. Mount this TV according to the instructions included in the wall-mount bracket.



Depth of screw: Minimum: 0.20" (5.0 mm) Maximum: 0.24" (6.0 mm)

Only clean the TV with a soft and dry cloth.








6. FRONT/BACK CONNECTIONS OF LED TV

- 3. POWER INDICATOR: Blue when TV is powered on. Red when TV is powered off.


Back View and Control Connections


Power Cord Connection

- Connect the power cord correctly as shown.




Antenna Connection

To ensure good picture and sound, TV antenna system needs to be installed. The antenna system as shown can be sourced from TV equipment shops, which will provide service for correct installation and connection. After installation, insert the 75-ohm antenna plug into the antenna jack as shown.




AV Connection


Connect the VIDEO and AUDIO output jack of the DVD or VCR to the VIDEO jacks on the set using the RCA cable. Match the jack colors: Video is yellow, Audio left is white, and Audio right is red. Select the AV input source using the SOURCE button on the remote control.



VGA(PC) Connection

Connect the RGB output of the PC to the VGA(PC) jack on the set. Connect the AUDIO output of The PC to the PC AUDIO jack on the set. Select the VGA input source with using SOURCE button on the remote control.





HDMI Connection

HDMI plug which replaces the HDMI connection allows transfer of all audio/video control signals through one cable only. These signals are transferred in digital.


- 1. Open the cover.

- 3. Replace the battery cover.

To prevent battery leakage which may result in bodily injury or damage to the remote: 1. Install all batteries correctly, and as marked on the remote control.


- 2. Do not mix batteries:(OLD and NEW or CARBON and ALKALINE, etc) Remove batteries when the remote is not used for a long period of time.

Note: If you forget your password, you can use "8899" to enter any menu locked.

US Rating


Press ▼/▲ button to select US Rating, then press ◀/► button to enter. A sub menu will appear as below. The TV rating composes of two aspects: age-based and content -based.

This system defines the rating control which comes from MPAA rules.



Canada Rating

Press ▼/▲ button to select Canada Rating, then press ◄/► button to enter. Press ◄/► button to select.



Canada English

Press ▼/▲ button to select Canada English, then press ◀/► button to set. Available Canada English: Off, C, C8+,G, PG, 14+,18+.

Canada French

Press ▼/▲ button to select Canada French, then press ◀/▶ button to set. Available Canada French: Off, G, 8ans+, 13ans+, 16ans+, 18ans+.

Channel Menu

Note: This menu is only shown when the input source is TV.



1.Press **◄/**► button to select **Channel** in the main menu.

2.Press ▼/▲ button to select the option that you want to adjust in the Channel menu.

3.Press ◀/► button to desired level.

4. When you have changed the settings, you can exit from the menu by pressing MENU.

Signal Type

Press V/▲ button to select Signal Type, then press </ > button to set. Available Signal Type: Air, Cable.

Auto Scan

Press \forall / A button to select Auto Scan, then press **ok** button to search channel. A Channel Search Menu will appear as below.



Favorite

Press ▼/▲ button to select Favorite, then press ok button to scan the Favorite channel list.

Show/Hide

Press \bigvee/A button to select Show, then press **ok** button to enter . Show or hide the channels in your program list.

Channel Label

Press ∇/Δ button to select Channel Label, then press **ok** button to enter. Create labels for channels, up to 7 characters.

- 5.US, Canada, RRT Setting and Reset RRT in LOCK menu is invalid

6.PC mode has no CHANNEL menu.




Note:Before operating Media menu, Plug in USB device, then press SOURCE button to set the Input Source to USB.

Press ◄/► button to select JPEG in the main menu, then press OK button to enter. Press Exit button to return back to the previous menu.



Press ◀/► button to select drive disk you want to watch, then press OK button to enter. Press ◀/► button to select Return option to go back to the previous menu.



Press ◀ / ► button to select the file you want to watch in the file selecting menu, then press OK button to display picture.

When highlighting the option you select, the file information will appear on the right and picture will be previewed in the center.

10. Troubleshooting

Please check if you can solve problems by troubleshooting yourself.

Troubleshooting	Control	
No signal	Please check that all cables are correctly plugged in.	
No color shades	Adjust the contrast, the color and the brightness.	
Stain on the screen	May be the result from a lighting signal from car, motor, neon light and other electrical devices or appliances.	
Double or multiple display image	May be the result of an electrical wave disturb from other TV, Computer and Game machine or Radio.	
Snow on the screen	The cables of the antenna are not correctly plugged in.	
The remote control does not work	Please check the batteries order and alignment. Check that the IR of the remote control is not hidden by something.	
"Zip" made noise on TV cover	Even if the display image is correct, the noise may come from an unsteady fixation of the panel.	
No sound	Make sure that you have not press the MUTE button of the remote control.	

- Do not use your TV in areas that are too hot or too cold, because the cabinet may warp or the screen may malfunction. Your TV works best in temperatures that are comfortable to you.
- Storage temperatures are 32° to 122°F(0° to 50°C).
- Working temperatures are 32° to 95°F(0° to 35°C).
- Do not place your TV in direct sunlight or near a heat source.
- minimum 5cm distances around the apparatus for sufficient ventilation;
- the ventilation should not be impeded by covering the ventilation openings with items, such as newspapers, table-cloths, curtains, etc.;
- no naked flame sources, such as lighted candles, should be placed on the apparatus;
