Responsible Harvest & Fishing Practices Are Very Important: Land fish as quickly as possible to prevent exhaustion. Use net to land. Handle with care. Never touch gills. Be prepared with dehooker for quick hook removal. Always work with care to minimize injury. Sometime the situation calls for cutting the hook for best chance of survival. When releasing be sure to revive. Use circle hooks (non offset) when using live or dead baits and always consider pinching hook barbs. It's the angler's responsibility to reduce Fish are measured flat (not over the body) from the tip of the snout (mouth closed) to the longest part of the tail. \* Except Sea Bass, Shark, Swordfish, Tuna Cleaning / filleting of fish with a minimum size limit while at sea is prohibited.
