In fact, the previous sentence is a sequentially earlier event that took place before the event in this sentence. <br> Choice C is incorrect because "regardless" signals that the information in this sentence is still true despite the previous sentence. However, there is no such contrast in this passage. Choice D is incorrect because "for instance" illogically signals that the information in this sentence provides an example for the information in the previous sentence. |
