Iconic, historic, or absolutely ordinary and hidden away in the urban landscape, hotels and motels are unique places you just pass through, where you may encounter public figures or an army of nobodies. In this book, Annie Richard, also known as the crime-duster -, and her investigating sidekick, Jean-Philippe Rousseau, take us into a dozen hotels and motels, all over Quebec, which have been the settings for intriguing and sometimes even dramatic events. From the Château Frontenac to Place Bonaventure, and including several small motels elsewhere in Quebec, they describe the most bizarre events that have taken place inside the walls of these establishments, which have not always been havens of peace. We'll discover the story of a young American man who took his own life while taking great pains to hide his identity; a meeting between Churchill, Roosevelt, and Mackenzie King, during which the plans for the future Normandy landing might have gone astray, an event that would have completely changed the course of history; a kidnapping plot threatening star hockey player Guy Lafleur during the Stanley Cup playoffs in 1976; the mysterious presence of a UFO observed by dozens of clients. Proof that anything can happen around the corner of a hallway or in the peace and quiet of a hushed bedroom...
