And does it bother you that you were the last writer on a comic before it went ka-put?

Len: When, when, when is Phoebe Marrs coming back for REVENGE on Tony Stark? I'm still waiting. However, Marcy Pearson is an interesting criminal element, particularly if she effects revenge upon Stark Enterprises by using a technological approach.

Or, maybe he could "possess" a suit of armor and cruise around that way! H.O.M.E.R. is cool. And another great

character in the Iron Man tradition.

The readers of Iron Fan have heard this idea before, but here it is again now that we have Len on the line... Tony Stark once more improves his thought controlled (cybernetic) helmet interface. The problem is that the new software is affected by Tony's unconscious thoughtstream, thereby generating a revenge program that is carried out by the armor to seek and destroy an enemy of Tony's! The software generation begins when Tony's hatred for a certain individual becomes an obsession. Stark's obsessive thoughts (daydreams?) of revenge are interpreted as a REAL PLAN by the interface and it directs the armor to carry out the plan according to the user's (Tony's) "wishes!" I always wondered how the interface in the armor could distinguish between an actual conscious thought command and an unintentional subconscious thought command. Anyway, Tony loses control of his armor. The villain: his own subconscious! Is there a possibility of something like this ever happening? (Somehow, suddenly, I like the H.O.M.E.R. idea better.)

Will you be talking to Dan Abnett and Andy Lanning, the writers on Force Works? I know that one of the reasons for dumping the WACOS was due to screwed up continuity with the Avengers book.

I truly enjoyed the *IM* story synopses published in *Iron Fan* and *Advanced Iron*! I thank you, Scott, and Marvel (and, of course, Bill Egan) for making it possible.

I got this inside scoop thanks to my friends Sandy and Jerry Lonne, owners of The Dugout cards and comic shop in Virginia, MN. Sandy, bless her, gave me her copy of the Jan. 1994 Marvel Sales to Astonish marketing catalog which contained a promo ashcan edition of Force Works #1!

The U.S.Agent's new battlesuit reminds me of the early Strange Tales-days of S.H.I.E.L.D. which featured all of Nick Fury's gizmos and gadgets designed by Anthony Stark. Back then, Nick Fury'arsensal made James Bond's stuff look like a sack full of capguns!

It appears that H.O.M.E.R. will play a significant role in the development of Force Works.

Sandy Lonne quickly ordered one for me. I cannot wait to get my mitts on it! Man, I'm forty years old and I feel like I'm fourteen. But isn't that what our great hobby is all about!

Yep: The WAR Machine t-shirt is due out in February 1994. I saw an ad for it in the 11/26/93 Comics Buyer's Guide.

So let me get this straight... "War Machine" is Jim Rhodes in his War Machine armor, but "WAR Machine" is the company run by War Machine (Jim Rhodes). Sure. Okay. Easy enough.

#### **Last Stop**

Somewhere or other in this issue of AI is a cover shot of Marvel's 1993 Third Quarter Report.

Interestingly enough, the original—in color—verifies that the new Iron Man armor does indeed have solid red "pants." The cover in general illustrates both the old and present new looks of old, established Marvel heroes and also shows Thunderstrike as a spin-off character from the Thor mythos.

That's it; that's all. Done.

# KAMINSKI'S KORNER

Len Kaminski has graciously agreed to answer your questions about his Iron Man universe. I've started things off with a few of my own questions:

IF: I've heard that you are going to write the new War Machine series. Will you be staying with Iron Man as well?

Len: Yes, I fully plan to stay on IRON MAN for the foreseeable future, for as long as Nel Yomtov will have me, or until I reach a point where I've told all the IRON MAN stories in me and no longer feel I can do justice to the book. This was one of the main reasons I decided to get myself a co-writer on WAR MACHINE, so that I could do both books without the quality on either of them suffering.

IF: Clytemnestra Erwin is scheduled as one of the recurring characters in the War Machine series. The last I saw of her she was quite insane and was responsible for the deaths of several people. Has something happened to change her or is Rhodey just a darker character?

Len: When Scott and I wrote the original proposal for WAR MACHINE, I goofed, plain and simple. I misremembered the last several stories in which Clytemnestra Irwin appeared; the fact is, not only had she become insane, the last time we saw her, she got dead. Needless to say, she won't be a part of the WAR MACHINE cast after all.

IF: Although Rhodey has used the armor effectively, there is nothing in his background that would indicate that he could repair or modify the armor. Who will take on the task of maintaining Rhodey's armor? If the armor is severely damaged, I assume that a new version would look quite different than Stark's and presumably be less advanced (technologically speaking).

Len: Archie Cramer (who'll probably get a race and name change by the time we actually see him, since it's been pointed out that for a global agency, Worldwatch has an overabundance of Caucasians) is going to be a brilliant engineer, though probably not quite in Stark's class. We're considering some design modifications to the War Machine armor, to make him more distinct from Iron Man, but whether that happens remains to be seen; it depends on licensing arrangements and other things that may be beyond the control of the creative team. We have every intention of dealing with the whole question of maintaining and repairing the armor without Stark, and have a two-part story guest-starring Stark and Iron Man planned for sometime in the year that'll resolve that particular question.

IF: Will Marcy Pearson be involved with Jim Rhodes in his new series?

Len: I haven't decided yet what I'll be doing with Marcy Pearson after her next set of appearances in IRON MAN, or whether she'll continue to be an IRON MAN character, or if shell move over to WAR MACHINE. Another run-in with Rhodes seems inevitable doesn't it?
