LAUDATE DOMINUM

by Tomás Luis de Victoria (c.1548-1611)







Spanish composer Tomás Luis de Victoria is well known as one of the greatest composers of choral music that ever lived. This lovely setting is a trio from his responsory, "Tenebrae facte sunt," in an office for holy week first published in 1585. Although it is very short and easy to learn, it is nevertheless quite stunning in its simple beauty.

For this arrangement, several changes have been made. The key has been changed from the original; tempo, style word and rehearsal piano reduction have been added, and a different Latin text has been set here. The original Latin text begins "Exclamans Jesus voce magna." In English, the original Latin text translates, "Jesus said, 'Father, into your hands I commend my spirit."

This arrangement is in ABA form (musically, measures 20-28 are a repeat of measures 1-9). The first 19 measures are Victoria's own music with the following exceptions:

- 1) Some slight rhythmic alterations have been made to accommodate the placement of the new text.
- 2) In part II, measure 5 (and subsequently measure 24) the original music was:



3) In part III, octave D's have been added in measure 28. The original part included a whole rest.

To facilitate learning, have the singers learn their own voice part separately, as if learning three separate tunes. They should then practice them separately many times, maintaining the feel of the pulse throughout. Only after the singers are very comfortable with their part both melodically and rhythmically should two and, eventually, the three parts be put together. The piece can be learned this way either in segments or as a whole. As with all polyphonic music of this time, it is important to maintain the rise and fall of each phrase within each of the three voice parts independently. Purity of vowels is essential in the performance of this piece.
