


## **Author Bio**

The devil, a ghost, a doppelganger, a selkie, a hobgoblin – these creatures appear in Marianne Micros's *Statue*, a collection of tales which combine traditional and ancient elements with contemporary issues and experiences. These fifteen stories show that the boundaries between fantasy and reality, art and life, life and death are fragile and inconstant. Included are tales of: sexual shenanigans in a creative writing department; a mysterious photograph in which a woman is seen posing naked in front of a statue; a selkie's daughter who hides her deformed feet; the devil's temptation of a young girl; a woman wrestler's fight with the devil; a high-end call girl's experiment with time travel; a sculptor's attempt to capture in art a mentally handicapped boy's love for his neighbour; a man's memories of a trip to Pompeii with his wife as she lies dying; an elderly woman tormented by the ghost of a fly; the attempt of two elderly Greek cousins to save their dying village.

As shown in several of the stories, a statue can represent lifelessness or transcendence, stagnancy or aspiration. Micros seamlessly combines magic with the realities of daily life, showing the interrelationship of the natural and the supernatural and the significance of those interactions.





At the heart of *I'll Be* resides a highly unreliable narrator. As he fumbles through his days, he breaks boundaries that are larger than the seemingly insignificant tasks at hand: the concept of space is uncertain, language is broken, history is rewritten, identity itself remains a question. The futility of language is a theme that surfaces continually. In a commentary on the nature of political systems, for example, the narrator points out its inadequacy in facilitating truthful communication: "To be fair, this country is safe, no one I know has fallen from a sniper's rifle, and not since 1970 have tanks roamed the streets. But that was in another province, another language, so it may not have happened."

Between sentences strife with comma splices, existentialist questions, and other deconstructionist strategies, the novel is peppered with poetic metaphor and laugh-out-loud humor that is sometimes dark, and always searching. By working to unravel every strand of our understanding of the external world, the novel, in turn, reveals the frailty of our thought process, inner constitution, and essentially our humanity.





As a tsunami in South-East Asia kills three hundred thousand and Pope John Paul II lies dying, the lives of eight people in Rome are transformed by a Croatian housekeeper named Dubravka, who was betrayed in love and later witness to a miracle at the site of apparitions of the Virgin Mary. The stories of the North Americans and Italians she encounters interconnect and alternate with key episodes from Dubravka's life, as she struggles to resolve her personal concerns as well as the contradictions in her Catholic faith while working at a pensione on Rome's Campo de' Fiori, in the shadow of the statue of the martyred visionary Giordano Bruno.

In Bruno's Shadow is a book about exiles and pilgrims: about people from populations that have been displaced by global events beyond their control, as well as those who have the means to travel in search of some small measure of meaning. It is also a book about idealism, about hope, about beliefs that go beyond the stern measure of science, and about positive thought—or what some might call—prayer.





Coal Boy is a human fiction that builds on the premise: love is universal; so is racism—the same mold as Colson Whitehead, James Hannaham, and Robert Dugoni. It focuses on people of mixed racial heritage: namely, Black-Japanese—the children of Black Americans and Japanese women born in Japan during the post-World War II Occupation.

Uruo Yusa is a six-year-old Black-Japanese boy born of a Japanese woman and an American engineer stationed in Japan. Because of Uruo's mixed heritage, the townspeople in Mitsukaidō ostracize him. One day, bullied, Uruo retaliates against the son of the town's assemblyman. This confrontation prompts the town's elders to exile Uruo from Mitsukaido to St. Veronica's Home in Chinosaki—a school and orphanage for biracial children.

Despite a childhood filled with ceaseless discrimination, rejection, and exploitation from those around him, Uruo drives himself to success—even if he must leave everything behind to do it.




