RESUME TIPS



Many positions are extremely competitive, so something as small as a typo could decrease your chances at an interview. Have multiple people edit and proofread your resume. This is especially important for roles requiring attention to detail in their job posting.

Ensure your experience bullets contain key words related to the job description. Everything on your resume should add value to your resume (adding your G driver's license will not add value if it is not in the job posting).





Optimize your spacing. Commas take up less space than bullets:

Skills: Skill X, Skill Y, Skill Z Hobbies: Hobby X, Hobby Y, Hobby Z

Numbers add credibility to your experiences. How many people were on your team or at your event? How much money did you raise or save? How much time did you save? Was there a % increase in nominations, applications, or event attendees?





Anyone can say they are a team player. Rather than listing soft skills, highlight them in action through your experience bullets. e.g. "Collaborated with a remote team of 5 volunteers, planning an event for 50 students; resulted in an 85% satisfaction rating".

BEHAVIOURAL PREP TIPS



Almost every interviewer will ask you this question. You know it's coming; why not prepare? There are many ways you can answer this question; I like to tell a chronological story, highlighting what brought me to where I am today, what I'm doing right now, and where I see myself going in the future.

Think of three reasons why you're interested in the role and three reasons why you want to work at that specific firm. Hopefully you can speak with current/former employees, and look at the company website to gain the information you need to effectively answer both of these questions.





Pick your 5-6 experiences you want to speak about during your interview and think of which questions you can answer with each experience (Example 1 could answer questions about your ability to take initiative, lead a team, and give presentations, while example 2 could answer questions about your weakness, willingness to learn, and ability to receive constructive feedback).

Gain insight into some of the work your prospective firms are doing across different industries and practices. This will help you learn more about the firm and allow you to refer to what you read during your question period. Some firms refer to thought leadership as white papers or insights.
