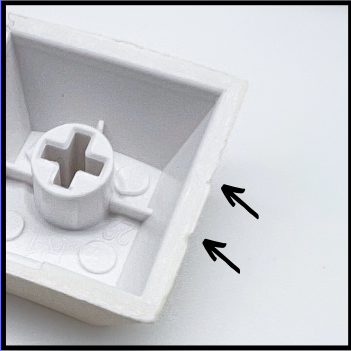




Acceptable Standards For Dye Sublimation PBT Keycaps



The below are common traits of dye sub PBT keycaps that are a result of the manufacturing process.



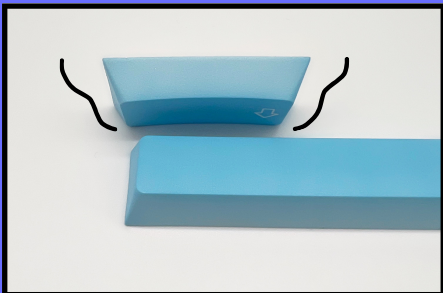
SMALL INDENTS

If you spot some keycaps with small indents or nicks on the bottom, this is normal and does not affect utility and in most cases, aesthetics.



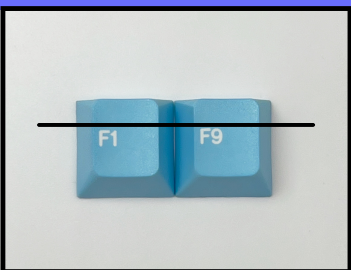
LEGEND BLEED

Due to the dye sublimation process, there may be a slight bleed along the edges of the legends when compared to those of a "double-shot" legend.



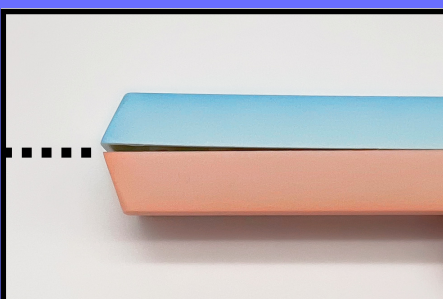
COLOR FADING

On longer and larger keys, there may be color fading present near the bottom edges of the keycaps (also depending on the intensity of the color itself) due to the sublimation process.



LEGEND DRIFT

Some caps may have legends that are slightly misaligned or have drifted slightly. We have implemented measures to reduce drift, but it may be slightly visible due to the nature of the sublimation process.



SLIGHT WARPING + STEM MISALIGNMENT

Spacebars and some longer keys may be slightly warped due to the high manufacturing temperatures required to make and dye PBT keycaps. This should not affect utility or function. High manufacturing temperatures may also result in slight stem misalignment.
