

# Crafts

#### Make paper flowers

- Stack three sheets of tissue paper in a pile.
  Fold them into a concertina, as though making a paper fan.
- 2. Wrap a pipe cleaner around the middle and twist the ends together.
- 3. Cut rounded edges at the end of each concertina.
- 4. Spread the concertina out on both ends like a fan.
- 5. Gently separate each layer of tissue paper and pull upwards. Any small accidental rips probably won't be noticeable.
- 6. Make lots of flowers to create a bouquet like Serafina's!

### Make a storytelling bag

Find a bag or basket. Collect a mixture of objects and toys from around your home and garden to put in the bag. Once you've collected plenty of items, find a comfy storytelling chair. Select an object from the bag and start making up a story about it. As you go along, choose additional items from the bag to include in the story.

#### Make storytelling cards

- choose 4 different colours of A6 card (these can be cut down from A4). Or use white paper stuck on to coloured card.
- 2. Allocate a colour to each category character, setting, problem, object.
- Choosing one category at a time, illustrate the cards with things that could make an interesting story.

Creepy forest

Try to have a lot of variation within the categories. Label each card.

4. Turn the cards over so that you can only see the colours. Choose one card from each category and use them to make up a story.

#### Magnetic story prompts

- Draw characters and objects from the story onto card.
  Cut around each one carefully.
- 2. Fix small magnets to the back of each piece.
- 3. Stick the magnets onto the fridge (or any magnetic surface).
- 4. Arrange them in order and use them as prompts to retell the story.

## Make a pretend campfire

Use kitchen roll and wrapping paper inner tubes, and orange, red and yellow tissue paper to build a campfire. Gather your friends and tell some stories.



#### Make a comic

Draw a comic template (or use the printable template) and use it to tell the story of Yokki and the Parno Gry (or any story) in a comic format. As there isn't much room for text in a comic, you can also use the template as a handy prompt for storytelling.

# Make peg people

Peg making is a craft that Yokki's family may have employed. Use wool and paper to turn some pegs into characters and use them to tell a story.



### Make a Parno Gry bookmark

- 1. Cut out two horse head shapes from card (or use the template).
- 2. Stick short pieces of wool along the back of one head to make a mane.
- 3. Sandwich the wool and lolly stick between the two pieces of card to make the hobby horse style neck.
