

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Tumour Treating Fields

Tumour Treating Fields (TTF) are electric fields capable of disrupting cell division and inducing tumour cell death. Through their research, Novocure has identified the frequencies of TTF suitable for different cancers. The disruptive effect on cell division of TTF has been demonstrated in 18 types of solid tumours in culture and in 8 in vivo tumour models. Novocure believe they now have a major clinical development in glioblastoma with over 25,000 patients already treated worldwide. Hilary Duckworth, Novocure UK & Ireland Country Manager will present on the theory behind TTF, what they might offer for brain tumour patients in the UK, and what could be the route to the UK market.

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Better Safe Than Tumour – signs and symptoms campaign update

In July 2022, The Brain Tumour Charity launched Better Safe Than Tumour, a campaign aimed at raising awareness amongst the public of brain tumour signs and symptoms. This campaign follows on from their previous HeadSmart campaign, which helped reduce the diagnosis time for children with a brain tumour from 13 weeks to 6.5 weeks.

Better Safe Than Tumour is targeted at both children and adults and includes an online symptom checker.

At this APPGBT meeting, The Brain Tumour Charity – which invests in research funding and provides a wide range of support and information services – will present more information about *Better Safe Than Tumour* and how you can support the campaign.



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APPGBT inquiry update

The Pathway to a Cure – breaking down the barriers inquiry was launched by the APPGBT at their July meeting in 2021.

The context of this inquiry is that, since the landmark Petitions Committee report into funding for brain tumour research was published in 2016, there has been another report into brain tumour research from the Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC), oral evidence sessions from the Petitions Committee, a £40 million funding announcement from the National Institute for Health Research (NIHR) and Westminster Hall debates. Many Parliamentary Questions have been asked and comments made in debates, but funding issues for vital brain tumour research continue to be raised and barriers continue to be identified.

This inquiry aims to bring clarity to the lack of progress by scrutinising commitments made in recent years and assessing progress, as well as seeking evidence from patient, researcher, and clinician experts.

This evidence will form the basis of an official APPGBT report with key recommendations for Government.

At today's meeting Hugh Adams, Head of Stakeholder Relations at Brain Tumour Research will provide the latest update on the inquiry, following the collation of written evidence, a patient survey and six oral evidence sessions.
