#### CARE INSTRUCTIONS

#### For Setting Up Your Tent:

- For a comfortable night's rest, find a smooth and level spot and
- When opening for the first time, the rainfly and footprint
- Lay out all contents of the bag and slowly assemble tent poles for a smoother setup.

- Remove shoes before entering tent. Store in vestibule to
- Handle zippers with care. Use limited force when opening and closing your tent.

- After every use, hang or pitch your tent in a shaded outdoor spot to dry completely before storing away in the carry bag. Putting your tent away damp or wet can cause mold to grow on the tent and break down the chemicals responsible for keeping
- Once dry, store your tent in a cool, dry location like a closet.

## PREPARE FOR SET UP


- · Select a level site clear of rocks, branches, and other hard or sharp objects to set up your tent.
- Remove all contents from bag.
- · Spread out footprint and place tent body directly on top.
- NOTE: Color code tent foot connector to footprint connector.
- Assemble all poles.

## ATTACH TENT POLES

- Place color-coded tent poles into foot connector at the circular hole closest to the tent body, connecting red pole ends to red tent foot connectors and silver pole end to silver tent foot connector.
- NOTE: Once tent poles are in place, poles should fit into both the footprint and tent feet comfortably.
- · Once poles are securely in tent foot connector, begin clipping tent body to poles to build tent shape (Fig. 1).
- NOTE: The clip webbing is color coded: attach clips2 with red webbing to red poles, and clips with silver webbing to silver poles.
- · Secure tent body to ridge pole ends by sliding silver ridge pole through ridge pole connector3 (Fig. 2).




## ATTACH RAINFLY

- Drape rainfly over tent, centering zippers over door and vents at sides of tent.
- RECOMMENDED: For extra stability, attach orange hook-and-loop fasteners on underside of rainfly to tent poles to help keep tent stable.
- Attach rainfly to tent foot connector¹ by inserting into channel (Fig. 3).
- NOTE: Color code rainfly anchor to tent foot connector.1
- · Adjust tension webbing at corner(s) of tent until rainfly is taut.
- Stake out vestibule and remaining sides of rainfly. • NOTE: For extra tension, make sure non-looped
- end of cord is securely tucked into "tooth" on underside of tensionlock4. Lift up to release tension.

## 5 SECURE VENTS & GUYLINES

- Once rainfly is set up, attach rainfly toggle<sup>5</sup> to tent body side loop, opposite of door (Fig. 4). Stake reflective cord loop
- Locate guylines in guyline bag. Insert plastic toggle through reflective webbing loop on rainfly (5 total). Enlarge the loop near storm line adjuster<sup>6</sup> to shorten the guyline as needed (Fig. 5).

## For Cleaning at Home:
