What is Murran?

AN INNOVATIVE AND SAFE SPACE, FOR FIRST NATIONS COMMUNITY BY FIRST NATIONS COMMUNITY. LOCATED ON WADAWURRUNG COUNTRY.

Background

Murran, the First Nations Business, Retail and Arts Hub (The Hub) is a community lead and focused, multipurpose space in the Geelong CBD, a key part of Geelong as an external shop front. Ngarrimili, a First Nations led and operated DGR1 status charity has designed and nurtured the business and retail hub on Wadawurrung Country, the first of its kind nationally.

A hub created by community, for community, with a key focus on fostering First Nations business and entrepreneurship into the future. The Hub consists of a retail and gallery shop front, a cafe, co-working facilities, a workshops and events space, and meeting and conference rooms.

Background continued...

A culturally safe and inclusive multi-purpose space for the First Nations community in the Geelong region and the surrounding regional areas, with access to retail, co-working and training facilities. Murran is centrally located, for established and aspiring First Nations business owners, community workers, community members, Elders, youth and students to connect, create, dream and design together and individually. The First Nations Business, Retail and Arts Hub will consist of:

- Retail hub providing a shop front for a large network of First Nations business owners, entrepreneurs, and creatives to sell their products or services, with the profits going back to the business owners, injecting money directly into the Blak economy.
- Responding to community needs and wants in the Geelong region, with a large number of already established and aspiring Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander business owners, and therefore leading to strong employment opportunities and outcomes.
- Co-working area for First Nations businesses and aspiring entrepreneurs from the Geelong and surrounding regions, to utilise. This encourages connection, creativity and mentoring for other First Nations businesses.

Pricing - Meeting Rooms Mob discount 10%

Small meeting rooms -

Warri (sea) & Yaluk (river)

We have two 3x3 metre meeting rooms available to hire for minimum one hour.

These meeting rooms are located in the centre of the Hub, with floor to ceiling windows.

Each meeting room has a circular table representing gathering, a coming together and is equipped with smart screen technology and whiteboards.

\$40/hour (maximum 4 hours for hourly rate) \$200/day




Scar tree meeting room -

Wiyn (fire)

In the centre of Murran lies an iconic, corten steel sculpture, representing a scar tree, a sacred marking on trees.

Within the sculpture is a private meeting room for 6-8 people, approximately 4m in diameter.

\$50/hour (maximum 4 hours for hourly rate) \$300/day

Conference Rooms -

Ngarrimili & Arranyinha (small conference room)

Murran boasts two, 4m x 7m conference rooms perfect for your organisation's team meeting.

The perfect location to host an event, board meeting, workshop or conference.

Capacity per room: 12-14 seated

A combination of the two small conference rooms, the Murran Conference Room which is 8m x 7m (57sqm) is the perfect location to host meetings, workshops, conference, etc!

Open plan co-working space: Korrak

Murran's co-working space has facilities that can be booked by the public to hold events. Korrak begins from the wooden barrier after the cafe and goes to the conference rooms at the end.


