

# Honey Bun Star!

Finished Size 41 x 41"

**Fabric requirements:**

35 Honey Bun 1 1/2" Strips


Background - 1 yard OR 50 Charm 5" Squares

Binding - 1/2 yard

Backing - 2 2/3 yards

Select 5 assorted strips to create a strip unit. Stitch the 5 strips into a strip unit using a **slightly larger than 1/4"** seam. The goal is to end up with the strip unit at 5" wide, but it is ok if it is wider. Be careful not to stretch the strips as you stitch. Finger-press each seam to one side as you go, and then steam press all seams in the same direction.

Your finished strip set should look like the photo below and will measure about 5" to 5 1/4" wide. Make 6 more strip units for a total of 7.



From each strip unit, cut eight 5" squares as shown below for a total of 50 pieced blocks.




### **Background:**

Cut 7 @ 5" WOF (width of fabric). Sub-cut to 50 - 5" squares. If you are using pre-cut charms, they are already cut!

**Half square triangles (HST):** Take a 5" background square and draw a diagonal line on the reverse side from corner to corner. Center the background square on top of a pieced block with right sides together (the background square may be slightly smaller than the pieced square). Stitch  $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn line. Trim off any excess of the pieced block so it is the same 5" size as the background square.

Cut along the drawn line to yield two half square triangles. Open the half square triangle unit and press seam allowance toward the background fabric. Trim "dog ears" if desired. The finished square should now measure  $4 \frac{5}{8}$ " square. Repeat to make 100 HST units.



Lay out the blocks in a 10 x 10 block arrangement as shown in the picture of the finished quilt. Stitch into rows, and stitch rows together. Do not attempt to match the seams in the small patchwork blocks when stitching them together – they are not meant to match up! This is to create a scrappy, patchwork look, and makes for fast and easy patchwork sewing!

Quilt, bind, and enjoy!
