
## Pinwheel Rail Fence Modification

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## **Required Materials:**

- A 24 block Pre-cut Rail Fence Quilt Kit
  - 1/4 yard for the pinwheels
    - <sup>1</sup>⁄<sub>4</sub> yard for 1<sup>st</sup> border
  - $1/_2$  yard for the 2<sup>nd</sup> border
  - 1 yard for the 3<sup>rd</sup> border
    - $\frac{1}{2}$  yard for binding
    - 3 yards for backing

## **Cutting Instructions:**

From the accent fabric cut 2 @ 2 1/2" WOF and sub-cut to 28 @ 2 1/2" squares.

Sewing Instructions:




Mark a diagonal line on the back of all the 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares. On 14 of the #1 strips place a square on top and stitch along the drawn line as shown below. Fold the square along the stitching line and press, then trim away the bottom two layers leaving a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.




Repeat with 14 of the #4 strips.

Follow the diagrams below to make your Rail Fence Blocks, pressing seams allowances to one side:



Layout the blocks as shown here:



Sew your blocks into rows, then sew your rows together.

Borders:

First border: Cut 5 @ 1 1/2" WOF and sew around all four sides of your quilt. Second border: Cut 5 @ 3" WOF and sew around all four sides of your quilt. Third border: Cut 6 @ 5" WOF and sew around all four sides of your quilt.

Quilt, bind, and enjoy!
