Safety Precautions



Please read the following **Safety Precautions** before you start using the projector.

- Read all warnings and follow all instructions.
- Allow at least 20" (50 cm) clearance around the projector to ensure proper ventilation.
- Place the projector in a well-ventilated area. Do not place anything on the projector that prevents heat dissipation.
- Do not place the projector on an uneven or unstable surface. The projector may fall over, causing personal injury or projector malfunction.
- Do not look straight at the projector lens during operation. The intense light beam may damage your eyes.
- Do not block the projection lens with any objects when the projector is under operation as this could cause objects to become heated and deformed or even cause a fire.
- Do not attempt to disassemble the projector. There are dangerous high voltages inside which may cause death if you should come into contact with live parts.
- When moving the projector, be careful not to drop or bump the projector on anything.
- Do not place any heavy objects on the projector or connection cables.
- Do not stand the projector on end vertically. Doing so may cause the projector to fall over, causing personal injury or projector malfunction.
- Avoid exposing the projector to direct sunlight or other sources of sustained heat. Do not install near any heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other devices (including amplifiers) that may increase the temperature of the projector to dangerous levels.
- Do not place liquids near or on the projector. Liquids spilled into the projector may cause it to fail. If the projector does become wet, disconnect it from the power supply and contact us to have the projector serviced.
- When the projector is under operation, you may sense some heated air and odor from its ventilation grill. It is a normal operation and not a defect.

- Do not attempt to circumvent the safety provisions of the polarized or grounding-type plug. A polarized plug has two blades with one wider than the other. A grounding-type plug has two blades and a third grounding prong. The wide and third blade are provided for your safety. If the plug does not fit into your outlet, obtain an adapter and do not attempt to force the plug into the outlet.
- When connecting to a power outlet, DO NOT remove the grounding prong. Please ensure grounding prongs are NEVER REMOVED.
- Protect the power cord from being treaded upon or pinched, particularly at the plug, and at the point where it emerges from the projector.
- In some countries, the voltage is NOT stable. This projector is designed to operate safely within a voltage between 100 to 240 volts AC, but could fail if power cuts or surges of ± 10 volts occur. In areas where voltage may fluctuate or cut out, it is recommended that you connect your projector through a power stabilizer, surge protector, or uninterruptable power supply (UPS).
- If smoke, an abnormal noise, or a strange odor is present, immediately switch the projector off and contact your dealer or NOMVDIC™. It is dangerous to continue using the projector.
- Use only attachments/accessories specified by the manufacturer.
- Disconnect the power cord from the AC outlet if the projector is not being used for a long period of time.
- Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel.

| 2 | Focus | Automatically adjusts the image focus. NOTE: To fine tune the image focus, long press the button to display a test pattern and use the Left and Right arrows to adjust. |
| 3 | Settings | Display the Settings menu. |
| 4 | OK/Up/Down/Left/Right | Confirm the selection. Navigate and select the desired menu items and make adjustments. |
| 5 | Return | Return to the previous screen. |
| 6 | Home | Access the Home screen. |
| 7 | Increase | Increase the volume. |
| 8 | Play/Pause | Play/Pause content. NOTE: Only supports built-in media player. |
| 9 | Decrease | Decrease the volume. |
| 10 | Mute | Mute/Unmute. |

Remote Control - Effective Range

To ensure proper function of the remote control follow the steps below:

1. The remote control must be held at an angle within 30° perpendicular to the projector's IR remote control sensor(s).
2. The distance between the remote control and the sensor(s) should not exceed 6 m (20 ft.)

Remote Control - Replacing the Batteries

1. Remove the battery cover from the bottom of the remote control by pressing the finger grip and sliding it across.
2. Remove any existing batteries (if necessary) and install two AAA batteries.
3. Observe the battery's polarities as indicated.
4. Replace the battery cover by aligning it with the base and pushing it back into position.

NOTE:

- Avoid leaving the remote control and batteries in excessive heat or a humid environment.
- Replace only with the same or equivalent type recommended by the battery manufacturer.
- If the batteries are drained or if you will not be using the remote control for an extended period of time, remove the batteries to avoid damage to the remote control.
- A battery subjected to extremely low air pressure may result in an explosion or the leakage of flammable liquid or gas.
- Avoid high or low extreme temperatures that a battery can be subjected to during use, storage or transportation; and low air pressure at high altitude.
- Dispose of the used batteries according to the manufacturer's instructions and local environment regulations for your region.





Initial Setup

Choosing a Location – Projection Orientation

Personal preference and room layout will decide the installation location. Consider the following:

- Size and position of your screen.
- Location of a suitable power outlet.
- Location and distance between the projector and other equipment.

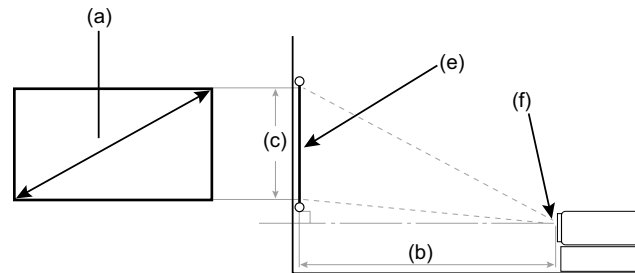
The projector is designed to be installed in one of the following locations:

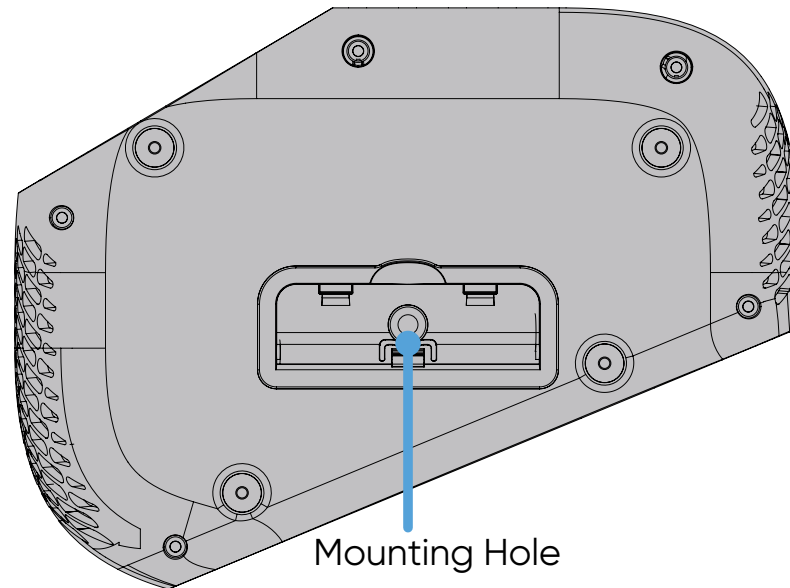

NOTE: It is recommended that if you intend to permanently install the projector to physically test the projection size and distance using the actual projector before you permanently install it.

Mounting the Projector

NOTE: If you buy a third-party mount, please use the correct screw size. Screw size may vary depending on the thickness of the mounting plate.

1. To ensure the most secure installation, please use a certified wall or ceiling mount kit.
2. Ensure the screw used to attach a mount to the projector meets the following specifications:
 - Screw Type: 1/4 UNC
 - Maximum Screw Length: 7 mm



NOTE:

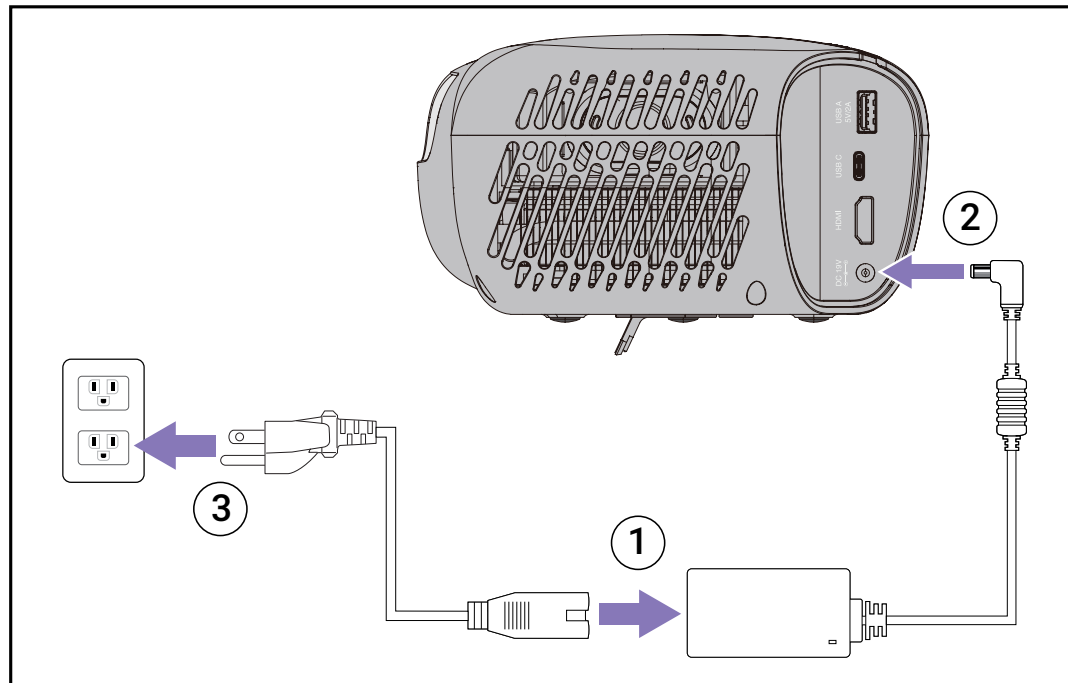
- Avoid installing the projector near a heat source.
- Keep at least a 10 cm gap between the wall/ceiling and the bottom of the projector.

Making Connections

Connecting to Power

DC Power (Power Outlet)

1. Connect the power cord to the power adapter.
2. Connect the power adapter to the DC IN jack at the rear of the projector.
3. Plug the power cord plug into a power outlet.



NOTE: When installing the projector, incorporate a readily accessible disconnect device in the fixed wiring, or connect the power plug to an easily accessible outlet near the unit. If a fault should occur during operation of the projector, use the disconnect device to switch off the power supply, or disconnect the power plug.

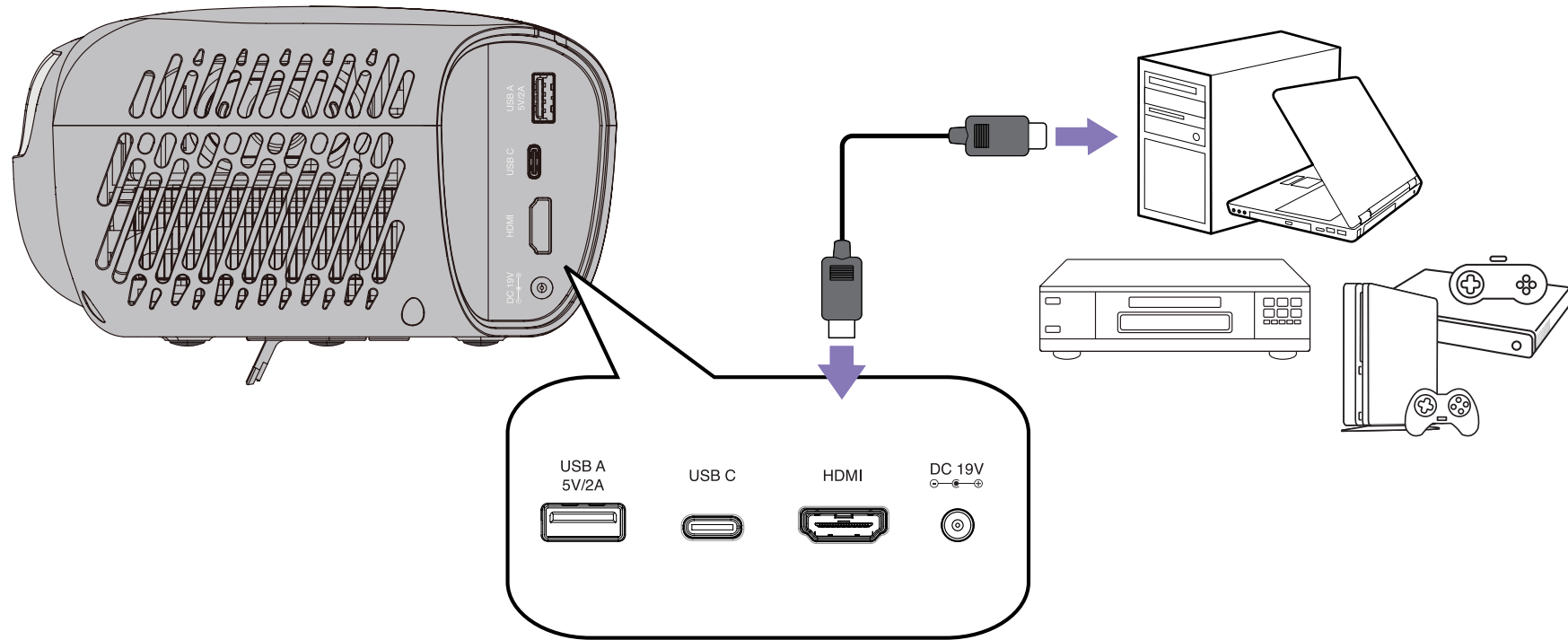
CAUTION:

- Ensure that your projector is connected to the power adapter before turning it on for the first time. We strongly recommend that you use a grounded wall socket while using your projector with the power adapter.
- The socket outlet must be easily accessible and near your projector.
- To disconnect your projector from its main power supply, unplug your projector from the power socket.

Connecting to External Devices

HDMI Connection

Connect one end of an HDMI cable to the HDMI port of your video device. Then connect the other end of the cable to the **HDMI** port (it supports HDMI 2.0, HDCP 2.2) of your projector.

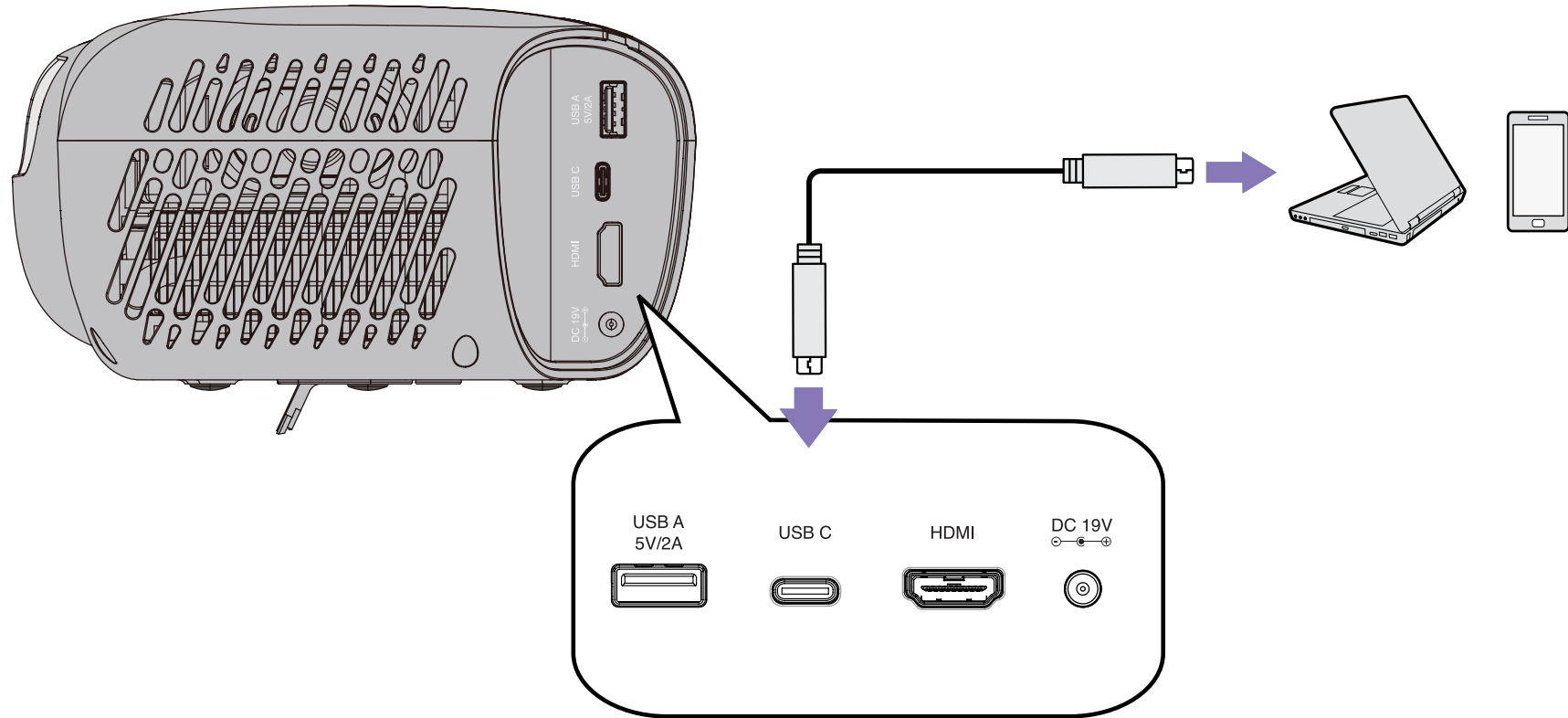


NOTE: iPhone/iPad users will need to use an additional adapter.

USB Connection

USB-C Connection

Connect one end of a USB Type-C cable to the USB-C port of your device. Then connect the other end of the cable to the **USB-C** port of your projector.

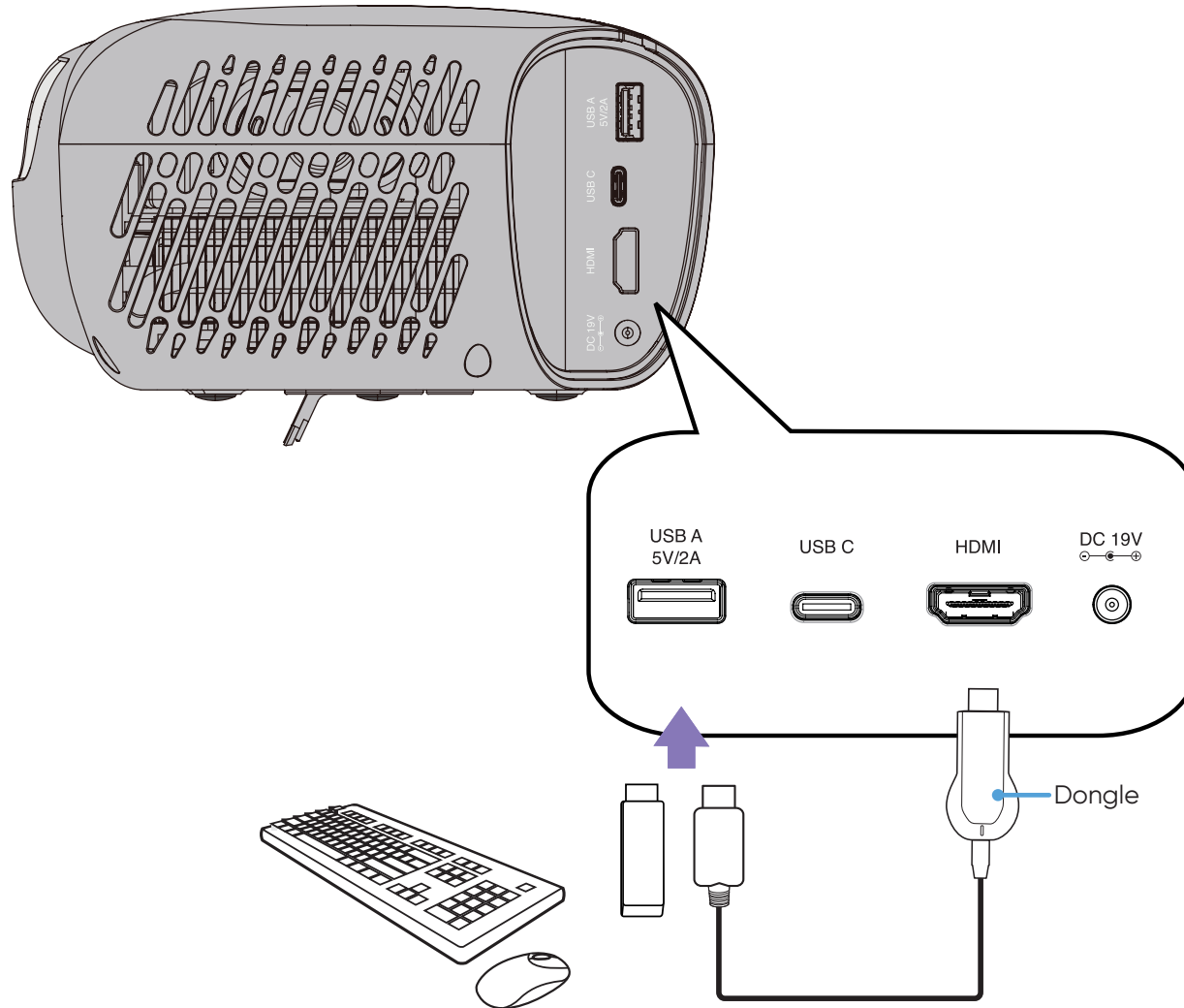


NOTE: Ensure your USB Type-C device can support video transmission.

USB Type A Connection

Connect one end of a USB Type A cable to the USB Type A port of your device (if applicable). Then connect the other end of the cable to the **USB A** port of your projector.

Additionally, you can connect a keyboard, a mouse, dongles, storage devices, etc. to the projector's **USB A** port.



Wireless Screen Mirroring

Screen Mirroring provides a 5GHz Wi-Fi connection for users to mirror the screen on their personal device.

NOTE:

- Ensure your device is connected to the same network as the projector.
- It is recommended to use a 5GHz Wi-Fi network for best results.



For iOS:

1. Access the drop down control menu.
2. Select the "Screen Mirroring" icon.
3. Choose "NOMVDIC XXXX".

For Android:

1. Download and install the "Google Home" application and open it.
2. Pull-to-refresh the app and wait for 30 seconds.
3. "NOMVDIC XXXX" will now be visible, select it.

NOTE: Some Android devices support direct "Casting". If your device does, go to the Casting feature and choose "NOMVDIC" from the list of available devices. If you do not have the "Google Home" application you can also scan the QR code and follow the steps to directly cast your Android device.

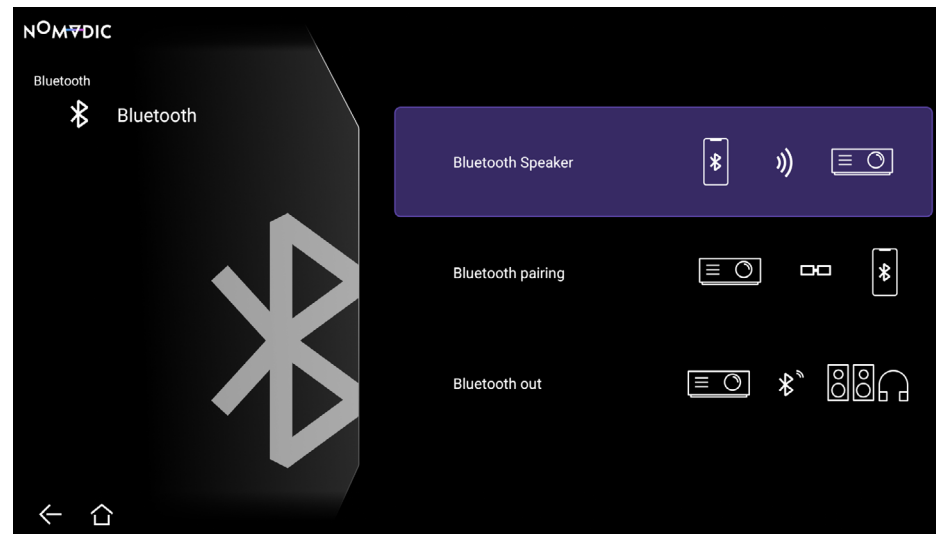
Connecting to Audio

Bluetooth Speaker

The projector is equipped with Bluetooth that allows the user to connect their device wirelessly for audio playback.

To connect and pair your device:

1. Go to: **Home > Bluetooth.**
2. Use the **Up** (⤴)/**Down** (⤵) directional buttons on the remote control to select **Bluetooth Speaker** or **Bluetooth Pairing**. Then press **OK** (⏏) on the remote control.



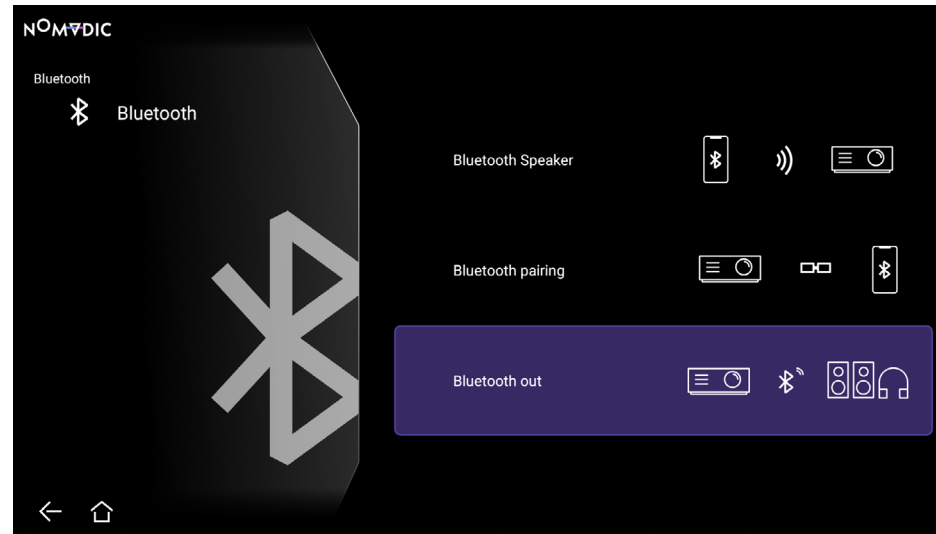
3. A sound effect will be audible upon entering pairing mode.
4. Upon successful connection, another sound effect will be audible.

NOTE:

- Once paired, if both the projector and your device are powered on they will automatically connect via Bluetooth.
- The projector's name will be labeled as "NOMVDIC L500".
- To connect the L500 with a paired smart device, select "L500" from the smart device's Bluetooth settings to connect again each time.

Bluetooth Out

Connect the projector to external headphones or speakers that support Bluetooth.



To connect and pair your device:

1. Go to: **Home > Bluetooth.**
2. Use the **Up** (↗)/**Down** (↘) directional buttons on the remote control to select the **Bluetooth Out** option. Then press **OK** (▼) on the remote control.
3. The projector will search for nearby Bluetooth devices. Select your device from the list and press **OK** (▼) on the remote control.

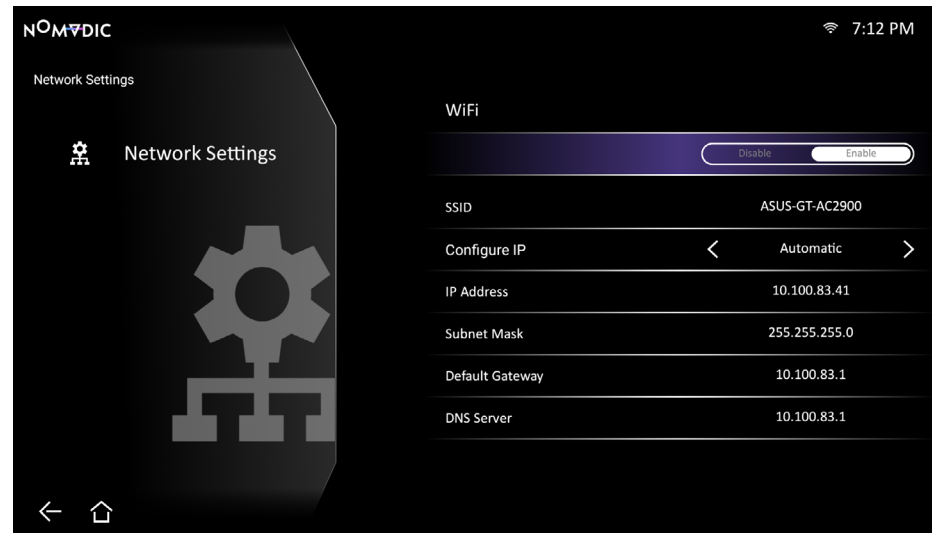
NOTE: **Bluetooth Out** cannot work with **Bluetooth Speaker** or **Bluetooth Pairing** at the same time.

Connecting to Networks

Wi-Fi Connection

To connect to a Wi-Fi network:

1. Go to: **Home > Settings > Network Settings > Wi-Fi.**
2. Press **Left** (⏪)/**Right** (⏩) or **OK** (⏵) on the remote control to select **Enable**.



3. Available Wi-Fi networks will then be displayed. Select one of the available Wi-Fi networks and press **OK** (⏵) on the remote control.
4. If you connect to a secure Wi-Fi network, you must enter the password when prompted.

Custom SSID

To connect to a Wi-Fi network:

1. Go to: **Home > Settings > Network Settings > Wi-Fi.**
2. Press **Left** (⏪)/**Right** (⏩) or **OK** (⏵) on the remote control to select **Enable.**
3. From the available Wi-Fi networks list select **Others** and press **OK** (⏵) on the remote control.
4. Enter the SSID and select the security level.
5. Enter the password when prompted.

NOTE: It is recommended to let the system configure the network settings automatically by choosing **Automatic** for **Configure IP.**

NOMVDIC Remote Control App

In addition to the remote control supplied with the L500, the NOMVDIC Remote Control App can be downloaded to a smartphone and be used to control the projector.

For iOS:

1. Go to the App Store.
2. Search for, select, and download the "NOMVDIC Remote Control" App.
3. Install the App.
4. Connect your smartphone and the L500 to the same Wi-Fi network.

For Android:

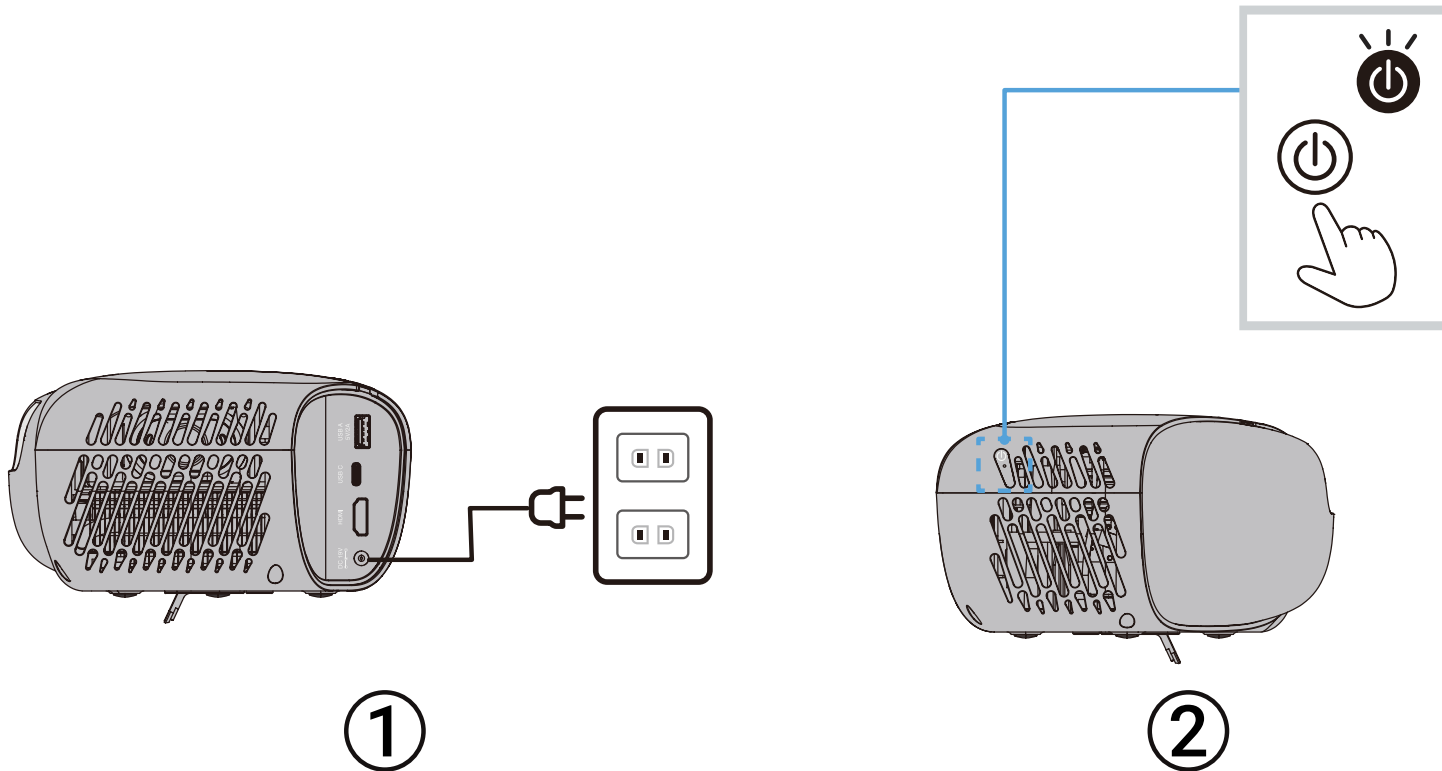
1. Go to the Google Play Store.
2. Search for, select, and download the "NOMVDIC Remote Control" App.
3. Install the App.
4. Connect your smartphone and the L500 to the same Wi-Fi network.

Using the Projector

Starting Up the Projector

1. Ensure the projector's power cord is properly connected to a power outlet.
2. After plugging in the DC Power Adapter, press the **Power** (⏻) button to turn on the projector.

NOTE: The Status LED will be solid green after the startup process.



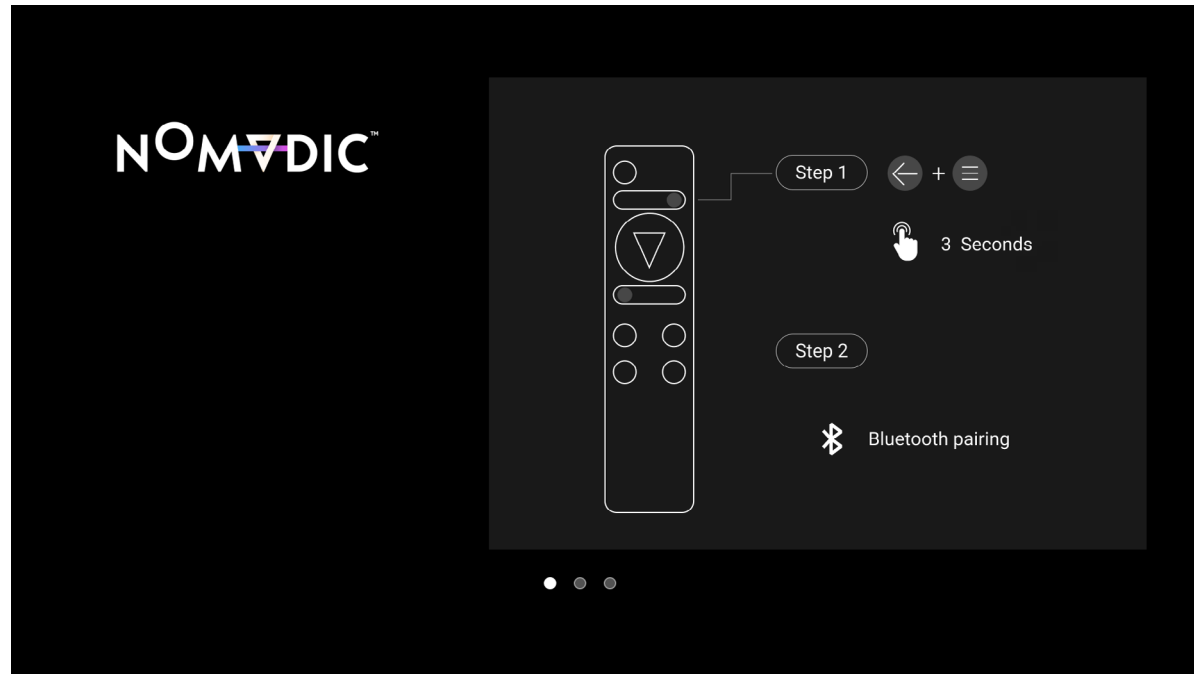
First Time Activation

If the projector is activated for the first time, you will need to set up your Bluetooth Pairing, Preferred Language, and Network Settings. Follow the on-screen instructions using the remote control. When the "Finish screen" appears, this indicates the projector is ready to use.

Bluetooth Pairing

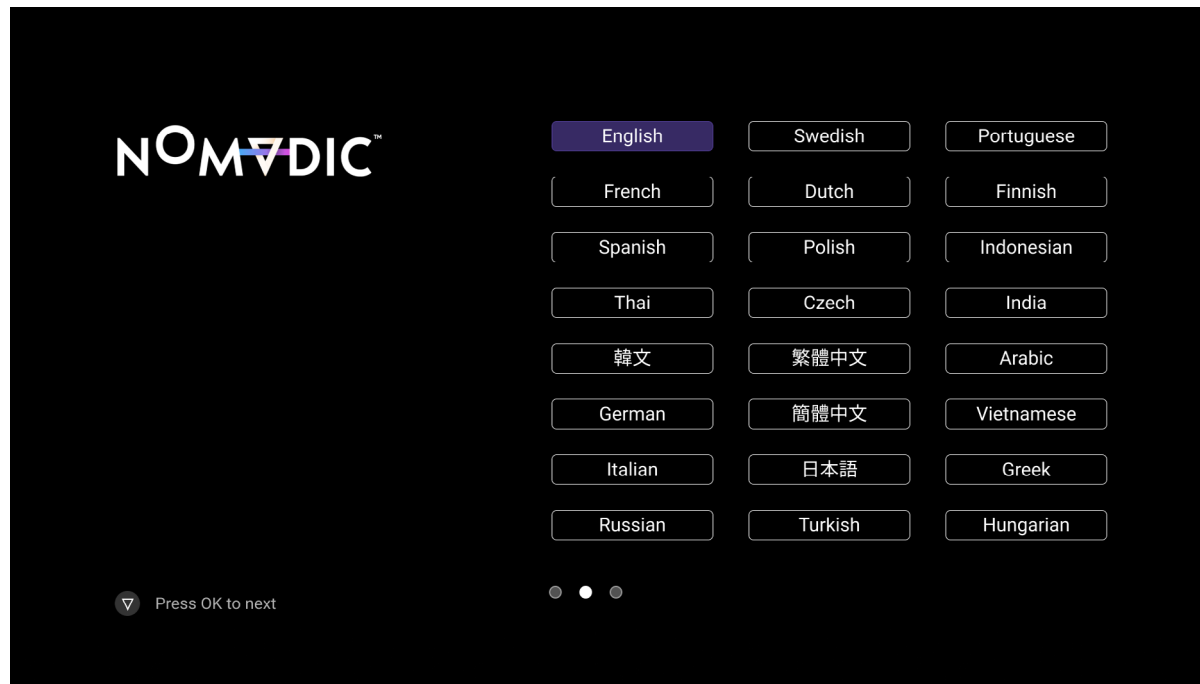
Pair the Bluetooth remote. For more information, see page 26.

NOTE: If the pairing is successful, the remote's indicator light will change from red to blue.



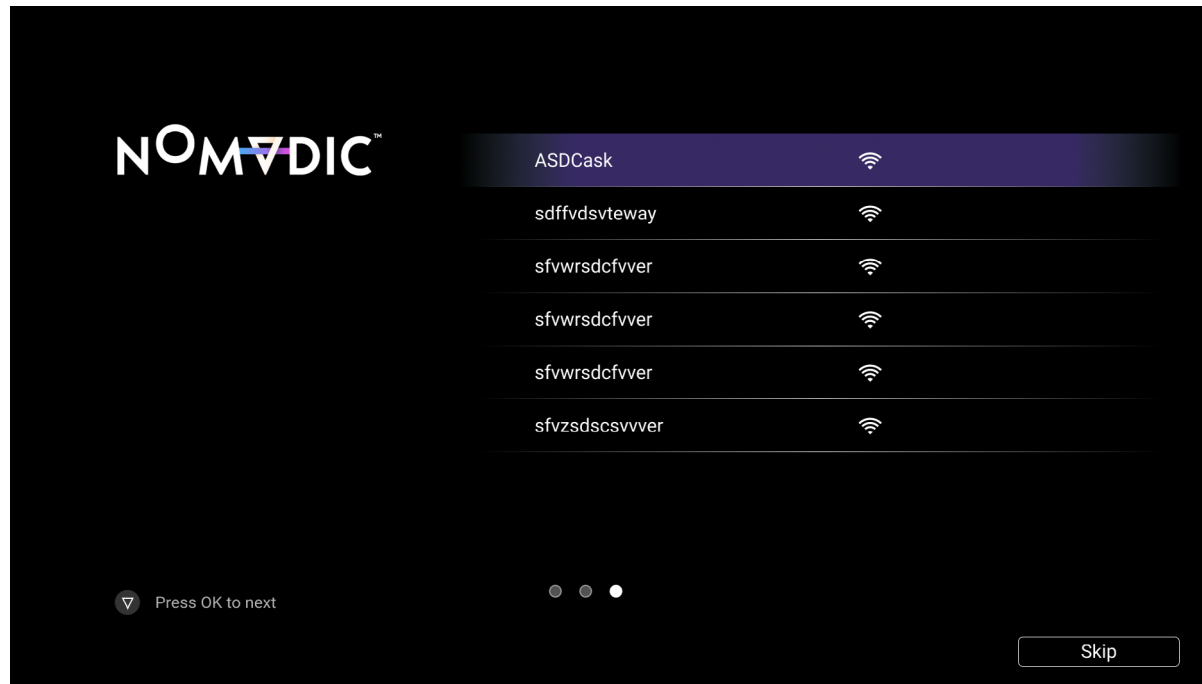
Preferred Language

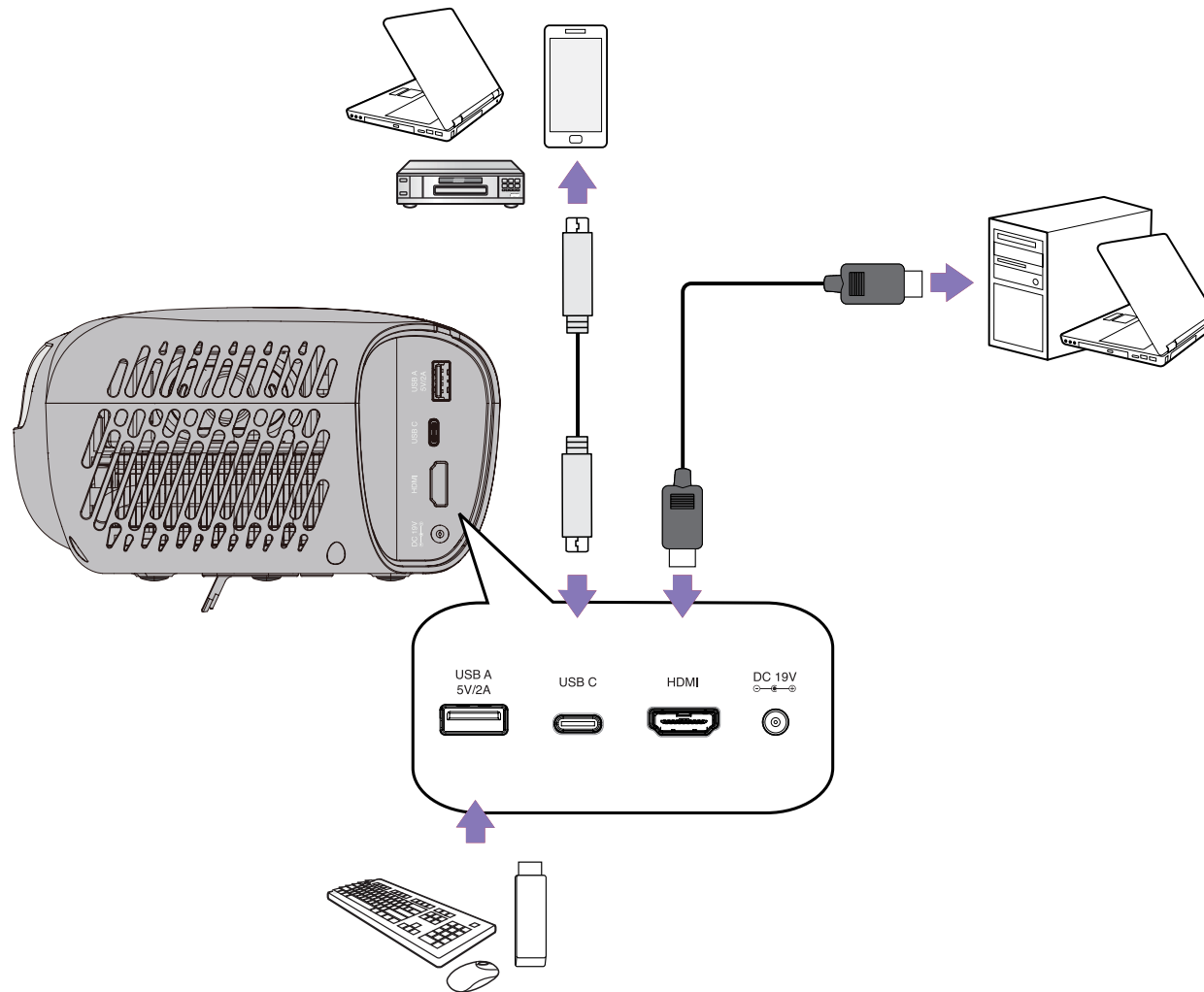

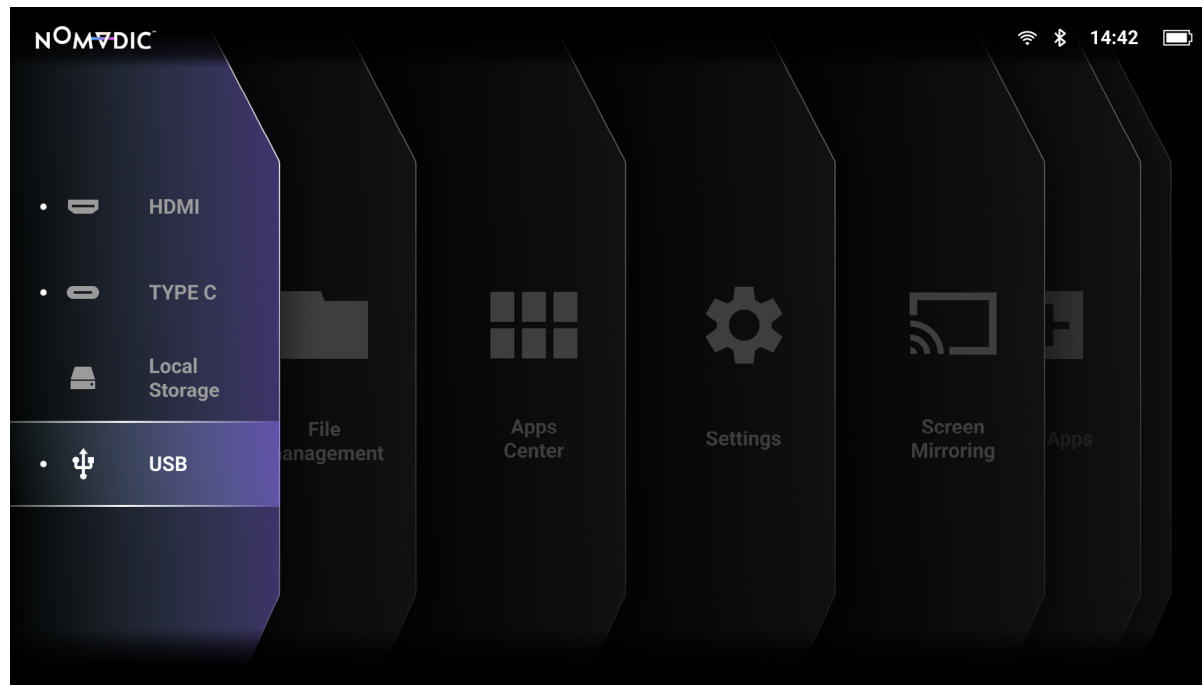
Selecting an Input Source

The projector can be connected to multiple devices at the same time. However, it can only display one source at a time.



The projector will automatically search for input sources. If multiple sources are connected, press the **Left** (⏪) button on the remote control until the source input tab is selected and then choose the input source.

NOTE: Ensure the connected sources are also turned on.



Adjusting the Projected Image

Fine-Tuning the Image Quality

To adjust the image to the size you need:

1. Go to: **Home > Settings > Basic Settings > Zoom.**
2. Press **Left** (⏪)/**Right** (⏩) to reduce or magnify the image.

To improve the image clarity, just press **Focus** (🔍) on the remote control. If you need to manually fine-tune the image clarity, press and hold **Focus** (🔍) on the remote control for three (3) seconds to display the test pattern, then press **Left** (⏪)/**Right** (⏩) to adjust the clarity.

Correcting Keystone

Keystoning refers to the situation where the projected image becomes a trapezoid due to angled projection.

To correct the problem:

- Adjust the projection angle or height of the projector.
- If the installation location of the projector does not allow for angle or height adjustment, you can use the **Auto Keystone** function from the OSD menu.
 - » Go to: **Home > Settings > Basic Settings > Keystone > Auto Keystone > select Enable.**
- If you need to manually correct the image after the **Auto Keystone** adjustment:
 1. Go to: **Home > Settings > Basic Settings > Keystone > Auto Keystone > select Disable.**
 2. Press **Up** (⏶)/**Down** (⏷) to highlight **H Keystone**, or **V Keystone**.
 - » Highlight **V Keystone** and press **Left** (⏪)/**Right** (⏩) to correct the vertical keystone.
 - » Highlight **H Keystone** and press **Left** (⏪)/**Right** (⏩) to correct horizontal keystone.

4 Corner Adjustment

You can manually adjust the shape and size of an image that is unevenly rectangular on all sides.

1. Go to: **Home** > **Settings** > **Basic Settings** > **Keystone** > **4 Corner** > select **Enable** > press **OK** (▽). The Corner Adj. menu will now be displayed.
2. Use **Up** (⤴)/**Down** (⤵)/**Left** (⤁)/**Right** (⤂) to select the corner you wish to adjust and press **OK** (▽).
3. Use **Left** (⤁)/**Right** (⤂) to select an adjustment method that suits your need and press **OK** (▽).

NOTE: As indicated on the screen, **Up** (⤴)/**Down** (⤵) for a 40-degree angle adjustment and **Up** (⤴)/**Down** (⤵)/**Left** (⤁)/**Right** (⤂) for a 40-degree angle adjustment.

4. Press **Up** (⤴)/**Down** (⤵)/**Left** (⤁)/**Right** (⤂) to adjust the shape and size. You can press **Return** (⬅) or **Settings** (≡) to go back to a previous step. Pressing **Settings** (≡) will reset the settings on the corner that you have chosen.

NOTE:

- Adjusting keystone will reset the **4 Corner Adjustment** settings.
- After the **4 Corner Adjustment** settings have been modified, some aspect ratios or timings may not be available. When that happens, reset the settings on all four (4) corners.
- If the projector is not placed on a flat surface or the screen and the projector are not perpendicular to each other, the projected image can become trapezoidal. However, the **Auto Keystone** function will correct the issue automatically.

Shutting Down the Projector

1. Press the **Power** (⏻) button on the remote control.
2. Using the **Up** (⤴)/**Down** (⤵) buttons on the remote control, highlight **Turn Off** and press **OK** (⏏) on the remote control.

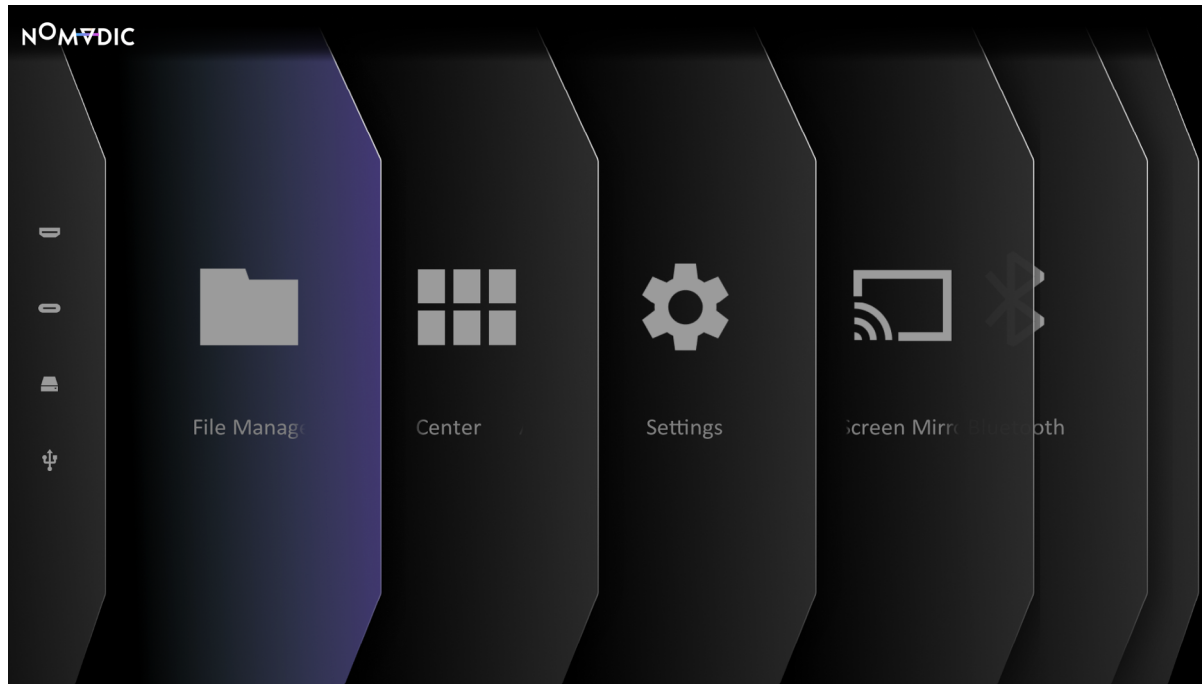
NOTE:

- If you do not respond within a few seconds after the first press of the **Power** (⏻) button, the message will disappear.
- Do not unplug the power cord before the projector completely shuts down.

Operating the Projector

Home Screen
