Safety Precautions

Please read the following **Safety Precautions** before you start using the projector.

- Read all warnings and follow all instructions.
- Allow at least 20" (50 cm) clearance around the projector to ensure proper ventilation.
- Place the projector in a well-ventilated area. Do not place anything on the projector that prevents heat dissipation.
- Do not place the projector on an uneven or unstable surface. The projector may fall over, causing personal injury or projector malfunction.
- Do not look straight at the projector lens during operation. The intense light beam may damage your eyes.
- Do not block the projection lens with any objects when the projector is under operation as this could cause objects to become heated and deformed or even cause a fire.
- Do not attempt to disassemble the projector. There are dangerous high voltages inside which may cause death if you should come into contact with live parts.
- When moving the projector, be careful not to drop or bump the projector on anything.
- Do not place any heavy objects on the projector or connection cables.
- Do not stand the projector on end vertically. Doing so may cause the projector to fall over, causing personal injury or projector malfunction.
- Avoid exposing the projector to direct sunlight or other sources of sustained heat. Do not install near any heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other devices (including amplifiers) that may increase the temperature of the projector to dangerous levels.
- Do not place liquids near or on the projector. Liquids spilled into the projector may cause it to fail. If the projector does become wet, disconnect it from the power supply and contact us to have the projector serviced.
- When the projector is under operation, you may sense some heated air and odor from its ventilation grill. It is a normal operation and not a defect.

- Do not attempt to circumvent the safety provisions of the polarized or grounding-type plug. A
 polarized plug has two blades with one wider than the other. A grounding-type plug has two
 blades and a third grounding prong. The wide and third blade are provided for your safety. If the
 plug does not fit into your outlet, obtain an adapter and do not attempt to force the plug into
 the outlet.
- When connecting to a power outlet, DO NOT remove the grounding prong. Please ensure grounding prongs are NEVER REMOVED.
- Protect the power cord from being treaded upon or pinched, particularly at the plug, and at the point where it emerges from the projector.
- In some countries, the voltage is NOT stable. This projector is designed to operate safely within a voltage between 100 to 240 volts AC, but could fail if power cuts or surges of ±10 volts occur. In areas where voltage may fluctuate or cut out, it is recommended that you connect your projector through a power stabilizer, surge protector, or uninterruptable power supply (UPS).
- If smoke, an abnormal noise, or a strange odor is present, immediately switch the projector off and contact your dealer or NOMVDIC[™]. It is dangerous to continue using the projector.
- Use only attachments/accessories specified by the manufacturer.
- Disconnect the power cord from the AC outlet if the projector is not being used for a long period of time.
- Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel.

Remote Control - Effective Range

To ensure proper function of the remote control follow the steps below:

- 1. The remote control must be held at an angle within 30° perpendicular to the projector's IR remote control sensor(s).
- 2. The distance between the remote control and the sensor(s) should not exceed 8 m (26 ft.)

Remote Control - Replacing the Batteries

- 1. Remove the battery cover from the bottom of the remote control by pressing the finger grip and sliding it across.
- 2. Remove any existing batteries (if necessary) and install two AAA batteries.
- 3. Observe the battery's polarities as indicated.
- 4. Replace the battery cover by aligning it with the base and pushing it back into position.

NOTE:

- Avoid leaving the remote control and batteries in excessive heat or a humid environment.
- Replace only with the same or equivalent type recommended by the battery manufacturer.
- If the batteries are drained or if you will not be using the remote control for an extended period of time, remove the batteries to avoid damage to the remote control.
- A battery subjected to extremely low air pressure may result in an explosion or the leakage of flammable liquid or gas.
- Avoid high or low extreme temperatures that a battery can be subjected to during use, storage or transportation; and low air pressure at high altitude.
- Dispose of the used batteries according to the manufacturer's instructions and local environment regulations for your region.

Initial Setup

Choosing a Location - Projection Orientation

Personal preference and room layout will decide the installation location. Consider the following:

- Size and position of your screen.
- Location of a suitable power outlet.
- Location and distance between the projector and other equipment.





NOTE: It is recommended that if you intend to permanently install the projector to physically test the projection size and distance using the actual projector before you permanently install it.

Mounting the Projector

- **NOTE:** If you buy a third-party mount, please use the correct screw size. Screw size can vary depending on the thickness of the mounting plate.
- 1. To ensure the most secure installation, please use compatible wall or ceiling mount.
- 2. Ensure the screws used to attach the mount to the projector meet the following specifications:
 - Screw Type: M4 x 12 mm
 - Maximum Screw Length: 12 mm



CAUTION:


- Avoid installing the projector near a heat source or air conditioner.
- Keep at least a 10 cm (3.9 in.) gap between the ceiling and the bottom of the projector.

Making Connections

Connecting to Power

AC Power (Power Outlet)

- 1. Connect the power cord to the AC IN jack at the rear of the projector.
- 2. Plug the power cord plug into a power outlet.



NOTE: When installing the projector, incorporate a readily accessible disconnect device in the fixed wiring, or connect the power plug to an easily accessible outlet near the unit. If a fault should occur during operation of the projector, use the disconnect device to switch off the power supply, or disconnect the power plug.


CAUTION:

- Ensure that your projector is connected to the power adapter before turning it on for the first time. We strongly recommend that you use a grounded wall socket while using your projector with the power adapter.
- The socket outlet must be easily accessible and near your projector.
- To disconnect your projector from its main power supply, unplug your projector from the power socket.

Connecting External Devices

HDMI Connection

Connect one end of an HDMI cable to the HDMI port of your video device. Then connect the other end of the cable to the **HDMI 1** (supports eARC), **HDMI 2**, or **HDMI 3** port (all support HDMI 2.0, HDCP 2.2) of your projector.




NOTE: iPhone/iPad users will need to use an additional adapter.

USB Type A Connection


Connect one end of a USB Type A cable to the USB Type A port of your device (if applicable). Then connect the other end of the cable to the **USB 1** or **USB 2** port of your projector.

Additionally, you can connect a keyboard, a mouse, dongles, storage devices, etc. directly to the projector's **USB 1** or **USB 2** port.



Audio Connection


You can connect to various external sound delivery devices via the Audio Out, S/PDIF, and HDMI 1 ports.



NOTE: The HDMI 1 port supports eARC. It can deliver sound to external devices via the HDMI 1 (eARC) port.

Network Connection

Plug the network cable into the **LAN** port, or use the available wireless connection.



Wireless Screen Mirroring

Screen Mirroring provides a 5GHz Wi-Fi connection for users to mirror the screen on their personal device.

NOTE:

- Ensure your device is connected to the same network as the projector.
- It is recommended to use a 5GHz Wi-Fi network for best results.



For iOS:

- 1. Access the drop-down control menu.
- 2. Select the "Screen Mirroring" icon.
- 3. Choose "NOMVDIC XXXX".

For Android:

- 1. Download and install the "Google Home" application and open it.
- 2. Pull-to-refresh the app and wait for 30 seconds.
- 3. "NOMVDIC XXXX" will now be visible, select it.
 - **NOTE:** Some Android devices support direct "Casting". If your device does, go to the Casting feature and choose "NOMVDIC" from the list of available devices. If you do not have the "Google Home" application you can also scan the QR code and follow the steps to directly cast your Android device.


Connecting to Audio

Bluetooth Speaker

The projector is equipped with Bluetooth that allows the user to connect their device wirelessly for audio playback.

To connect and pair your device:

- 1. Go to: **Home > Bluetooth**.
- 2. Use the Left (()/Right ()) directional buttons on the remote control to select Bluetooth Speaker or Bluetooth Pairing. Then press OK () on the remote control.




- 3. A sound effect will be audible upon entering pairing mode.
- 4. Upon successful connection, another sound effect will be audible.

NOTE:

- Once paired, if both the projector and your device are powered on they will automatically connect via Bluetooth.
- The projector's name will be labeled as "NOMVDIC PJ".
- To connect the NOMVDIC PJ with a paired smart device, select "P2000UST-RGB" from the smart device's Bluetooth settings to connect again each time.

Bluetooth Out

Connect the projector to external headphones or speakers that support Bluetooth.



To connect and pair your device:

- 1. Go to: **Home > Bluetooth**.
- 2. Use the Left (()/Right ()) directional buttons on the remote control to select the Bluetooth Out option. Then press OK () on the remote control.
- 3. The projector will search for nearby Bluetooth devices. Select your device from the list and press **OK** ($\overline{\mathbb{V}}$) on the remote control.


NOTE: Bluetooth Out cannot work with Bluetooth Speaker or Bluetooth Pairing at the same time.

Connecting to Networks

Wi-Fi Connection

To connect to a Wi-Fi network:

- 1. Go to: Home > Settings > Network Settings > Wi-Fi.
- 2. Press Left ($\langle \rangle$)/Right (\rangle) on the remote control to select Enable.



- 3. Available Wi-Fi networks will then be displayed. Select one of the available Wi-Fi networks and press **OK** ($\overline{\mathbb{V}}$) on the remote control.
- 4. If you connect to a secure Wi-Fi network, you must enter the password when prompted.

Custom SSID

To connect to a Wi-Fi network:

- 1. Go to: Home > Settings > Network Settings > Wi-Fi.
- 2. Press Left ($\langle \rangle$ /Right (\rangle) on the remote control to select Enable.
- 3. From the available Wi-Fi networks list select **Others** and press **OK** ($\overline{\mathbb{V}}$) on the remote control.
- 4. Enter the SSID and select the security level.
- 5. Enter the password when prompted.
 - **NOTE:** It is recommended to let the system configure the network settings automatically by choosing **Automatic** for **Configure IP**.

NOMVDIC Remote Control App

In addition to the remote control supplied with the P2000UST-RGB, the NOMVDIC Remote Control App can be downloaded to a smartphone and be used to control the projector.

For iOS:

- 1. Go to the App Store.
- 2. Search for, select, and download the "NOMVDIC Remote Control" App.
- 3. Install the App.
- 4. Connect your smartphone and the P2000UST-RGB to the same Wi-Fi network.

For Android:




Using the Projector

Starting Up the Projector

- 1. Ensure the projector is properly connected to a power outlet.
- 2. Press the **Power** (\bigcirc) button to turn on the projector.

NOTE: The Status LED will be flashing red during the startup process, and solid green after completion.






First Time Activation

If the projector is activated for the first time, you will need to set up your Bluetooth Pairing, Preferred Language, and Network Settings. Follow the on-screen instructions using the remote control. When the "Finish screen" appears, this indicates the projector is ready to use.

Pair the Bluetooth remote.








Selecting an Input Source

The projector can be connected to multiple devices at the same time. However, it can only output one source at a time.



The projector will automatically search for input sources. If multiple sources are connected, press the **Left** (() button on the remote control until the source input tab is selected and then choose the input source.

NOTE: Ensure the connected sources are also turned on.



Adjusting the Projected Image

Fine-Tuning the Image Quality

To adjust the image to the size you need:

- 1. On the remote control, press **Settings** (\equiv) to open the OSD menu.
- 2. Then go to: **DISPLAY** > **Focus**.
- 3. Press Left ($\langle\!\!\!\langle\,\rangle\rangle/\text{Right}$ ($\rangle\!\!\!\rangle$) to to adjust the image.

Warping Adjustment

Configure the geometric distortion of the projector's images when the images are projected onto screens which have a kind of uneven surface such as a cylinder, a spherical shape, etc.

- If the installation location of the projector does not allow for angle or height adjustment, you can use the **Warping** function from the OSD menu.
 - 1. Go to: Home > Settings > Basic Settings > Warping.
 - 2. Press Left (()/Right ()) on the remote control to select Enable.
 - 3. Adjust the X and Y coordinates with the Left ($\langle \rangle$)/Right (\rangle)/Up (\sim)/Down (\sim) buttons.
 - 4. When done, press **Return** (\leftarrow) to exit or **Settings** (\equiv) to reset.

4 Corner Adjustment

You can manually adjust the shape and size of an image that is unevenly rectangular on all sides.

- 1. Go to: Home > Settings > 4 Corner.
- 2. Press Left (()/Right ()) on the remote control and select Enable.
- 3. Use the Left (()/Right ())/Up ()/Down () buttons to select the corner you wish to adjust and press OK (∇).
- Press Up (<)/Down (<)/Left (<)/Right (
 to adjust the shape and size. You can press Return (<) or Settings (Ξ) to go back to a previous step.

NOTE:

- Adjusting Warping will reset the **4 Corner Adjustment** settings.
- After the **4 Corner Adjustment** settings have been modified, some aspect ratios or timings may not be available. When that happens, reset the settings on all four (4) corners.


Shutting Down the Projector

Operating the Projector

Home Screen

The **Home Screen** is displayed every time you start the projector.
