

Replacing and Installing a Ball Detection Switch on your Elite 3 & Pickle 2.

	Removing The CaseStep 1.) Unscrew the (6) Phillips-head screws along the bottom of the red case where it attaches to the chassis of the machine. (2-front, 2-rear, one on each side)Step 2.) Lift the red case off the chassis and set it aside. (Make sure to not allow the Ground Wire from the case to touch the Green control board and panel- this could fry the ground wire.) 	 Removing the Bad Ball Detection Switch Step 1.) Remove the 2 wires attached to the Ball Detection Switch by using a pair of needle nose pliers. DO NOT PULL ON THE WIRE! Use the red/pink connection to remove the wires. (This switch is located on the middle back portion of the Ball Chute). Step 2.) Using a small P1 Philips screw driver, and needle nose pliers, grab onto the small nut (on the left or right hand side), and unscrew the nut. Replacing and Installing a Ball Detection Switch on your Elite 3 & Pickle 2. Wires Removed, exposing screw and nut. **Installing the New Ball Detection Switch Step 1.)** Using the 2 small long screws, place them thru the 2 holes on the right hand side (so that the thread is facing the left). Line the Ball Detection Switch up with the screw Ball Detection Switch with Nut holes (the metal tabs for the 2 grey wires should be facing and Screw attached. away from the ball chute). Add the nuts on the end and tighten until the Ball Detection Switch is snuggly in place. Step 2.) Attach one grey wire to the bottom tab (coming out furthest away from the ball guide), and the other grey wire to the middle tab. (NOTE: The tab closest to the ball chute is to remain empty). Ball Detection Switch with Wires Attached **Testing the New Ball Detection Switch Step 1.)** With the case still resting beside the machine, use **Ball Detection Switch position** a long stick, or screw driver and make sure the ball "UP". detection switch clicks on the inside of the ball chute. (This is where the balls slide down, and then exit the machine). You should hear a "click" noise, and the plate (on current models) should spring back into place. **Ball Detection Switch position** "Down".



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
