

# Baby Blanket with Stars

This blanket is ideal for babies and toddlers during the winter season.  
It's knitted from bottom to top and from right to left



## BEFORE YOU START KNITTING,

- > READ ALL INSTRUCTIONS PAGES CAREFULLY !
- > Knit a gauge first
- = If you don't, you might be disappointed with the result !

## Material and informations

**Finished size of the blanket:** approximately 37.5" x 27.5" (95 x 70 cm)  
(The size might differ slightly depending on the way you knit and once the blanket is blocked).

**Gauge:** 4 x 4" / 10 x 10 cm = 15 sts x 25 rows with Needle 6 mm / US10 / UK4 in stockinette stitch.  
(If you don't follow the gauge, the pattern might be out of shape!).

**Needles:**  
Needles 6 mm/US10/UK4

I recommend using circular needles with a 30" long cable. However you can use straight needles if you prefer.

**Wool :** 4 balls of Pildar « Phil Looping » jean color (ap. 163 m (178 yds) /skein)

But you can use any bulky yarn (12 ply). Approximately 652 meters of yarn (715 yds) or any length to fit the gauge.

## Stitches glossary and techniques

### For the pretty edges :

Slip the first stitch of each row without knitting it.

### Seed Stitch (Se):

The knit and purl stitches are alternated for a staggered, lightly bumpy texture. 1 knit stitch and 1 purl stitch across a row, and then they are alternated every other row by knitting the purl stitches and purling the knit stitches.

Row 1 (rs): \*k1, p1, k1, p1 - repeat from \* across

Row 2 (ws): \*p1, k1, p1, k1 - repeat from \* across

Repeat Row 1 and 2

### Stockinette Stitch:

Row 1 (rs): knit to the end

Row 2 (ws): purl to the end

Repeat Row 1 and 2

### Abbreviations :

rs: Right Side / ws: Wrong Side

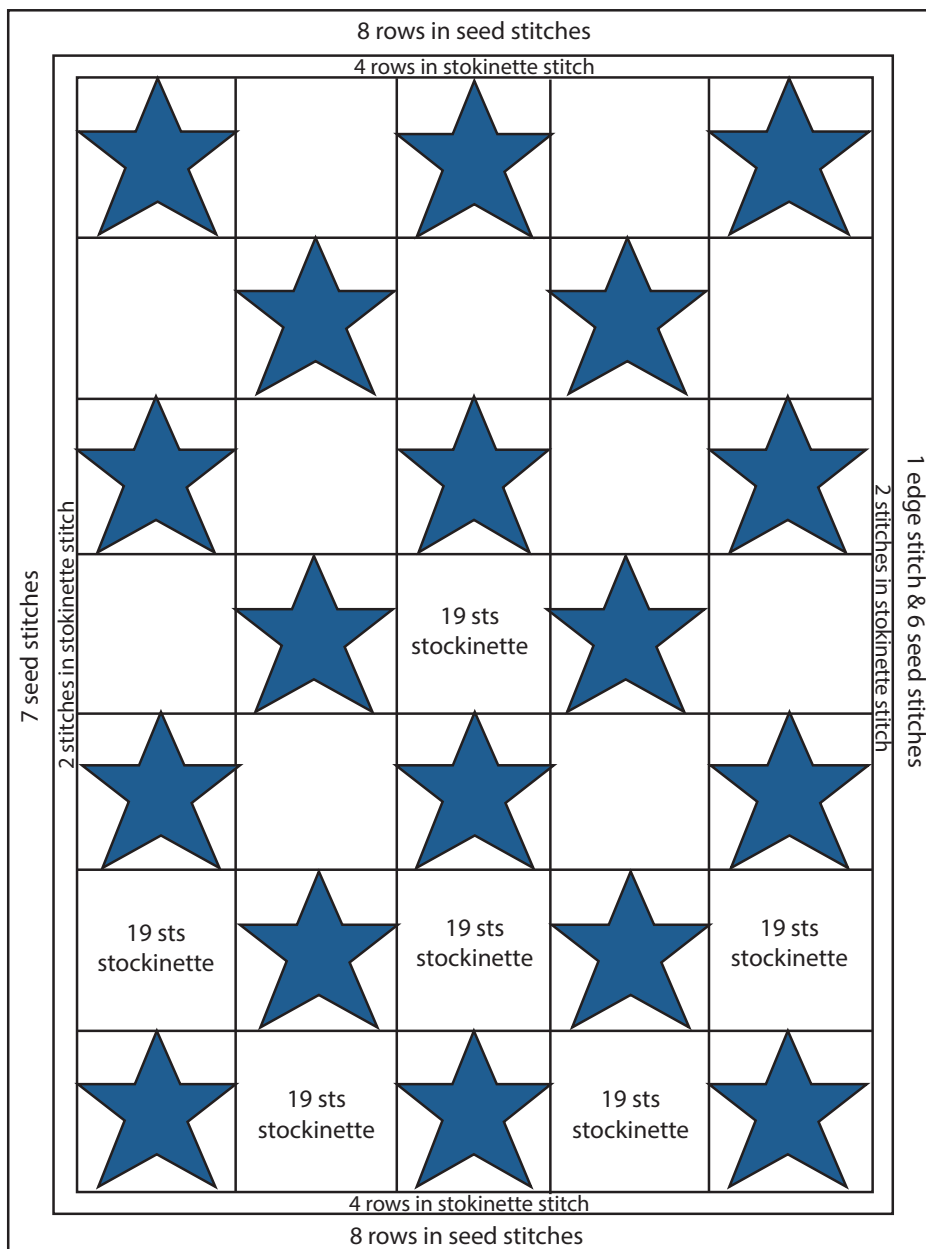
Ess: edge stitch slipped

Sts: Stitches / Se: Seed Stitch

k: Knit / p: Purl

SSSC: Seed Stitch Star chart

## Blanket Chart



# Star Chart

## The chart :

1 square = 1 stitch

The chart reads from bottom to top :

Line 1 (rs) : k from right to left

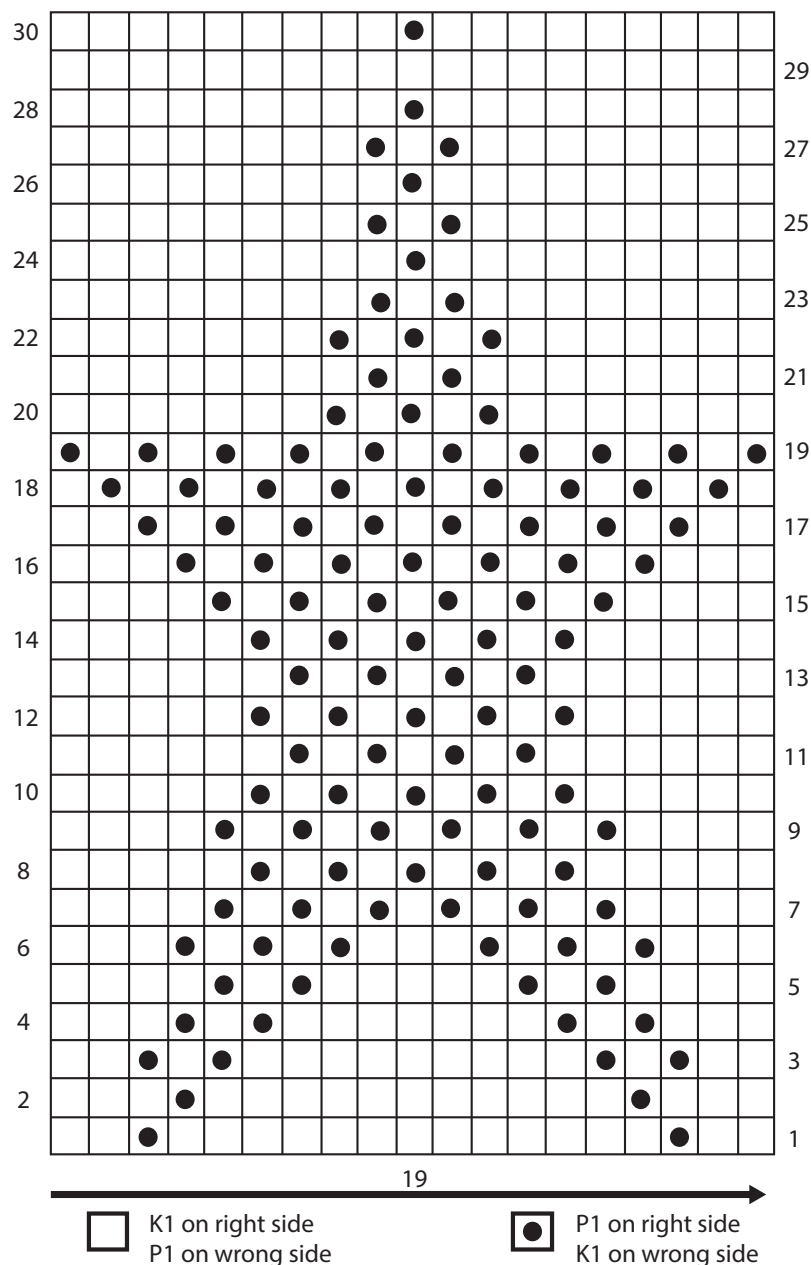
Line 2 (ws) : p from left to right

Line 3 (rs) : k from right to left

Line 4 (ws) : p from left to right

Etc...

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## Knitting the blanket

### Step 1: Bottom of the blanket and the bottom edge

Cast on 113 Stitches

*Note : because you have odd number (113 stitches), you will have to knit rows 1 and 2 the same alternative way (k1,p1)*

**Row 1 (rs):** Ess1 \*k1, p1, k1, p1 - repeat from \* across,

**Row 2 (ws):** Ess1 \*k1, p1, k1, p1 - repeat from \* across,

Repeat these 2 rows to obtain **8 rows of seed stitch**.

You have been knitting the bottom border.

Knit 4 rows

**Row 9 (rs):** Ess1, Se6, k99, Se7

**Row 10 (ws) :** Ess1, Se6, p99, Se7

**Row 11(rs):** Ess1, Se6, k99, Se7

**Row 12 (ws) :** Ess1, Se6, p99, Se7

### Step 2: The stars

**Row 13 (rs):** Ess1, Se6, k2, SSSC19 (Seed Stitch Star chart from the bottom right), k19, SSSC19, k19, SSSC19, k2, Se6

**Row 14 (ws):** Ess1, Se6, p2, SSSC19, p19, SSSC19, p19, SSSC19, p2, Se7.

Repeat rows 13 & 14 until you've worked 7 stars rows (see blanket chart).

### Step 3: the top bottom and the top border

Knit 4 rows

**Row 223 (rs):** Ess1, Se6, k99, Se7

**Row 224 (ws) :** Ess1, Se6, p99, Se7

**Row 225(rs):** Ess1, Se6, k99, Se7

**Row 226 (ws) :** Ess1, Se6, p99, Se7

Finish pattern with by 8 rows of 113 in seed stitches.

Bind off: Weave in ends and block to measurements.
