Chem-Crest 121 is a formulated industrial liquid cleaner. The product is capable of removing and dispersing oils, various polymeric and adhesive residues, paints and particulates.

Substrate Compatibility

Chem-Crest 121 is compatible with most metals in general. Aluminum and copper must be tested first. It should not be used on plastics.

Typical Contaminants Removed

Chem-Crest 121 removes oils, various polymeric and adhesive residues, paints and particulates.

Operating Concentration

Chem-Crest 121 is used as received without further dilution. It can be heated up to 170°F. Consult first with Crest Ultrasonics if the process requires a higher temperature. The product can be re-circulated with filtration using a 3-5 micrometer Teflon® filter.

Storage

Avoid freezing conditions. Handle with care. Avoid breakage of containers.

Disposal Methods

The contaminated used material should be handled by a specialized waste disposal company. Dispose of in accordance with Federal, State and Local Government regulations.
