

THERAPY AIR IN BOARDING KENNEL AND CATTERY

Five months ago I bought a Therapy Air for my Boarding Kennels. Since having it I had a cat come to my cattery that showed the signs of cat flu. Cat flu is something that spreads pretty quickly through a cattery.

I brought my Therapy Air over to the cattery and out of ten cats that were there only one other cat got cat flu. I put it down to the fact that I placed the Therapy Air there.

When a dog comes to my Boarding Kennels, which is showing signs of kennel cough, I put the Therapy Air in front of the kennel and turn it on at the highest setting then I find very few if any dogs end up with signs of kennel cough.

An example: Recently I had a dog come in and it was coughing. The customer told me that it did not have kennel cough but a chest infection and the Vet had said that it was not contagious. After only one day I decided it could be kennel cough. I put my Therapy Air in front of the kennel. One week later, the dog in the next room had kennel cough, but no other dogs that were there in over the time that contracted kennel cough and there were at least one hundred dogs through kennel in this time passing.

I would strongly recommend every boarding kennel and cattery to have "Therapy Air". The animals seem calmer, the customers love fresh smell. Viruses and bacteria are taken out of the air, which is the main reason that animals stay well and happier.

Providing warm, clean kennels and environment which is virus and bacteria free greatly enhances business prospects.
