FIND YOUR PERFECT RING SIZE

This is how to measure your ring size accurately:

- Measure your finger in the evening.
- Do not measure your finger in extreme heat or cold.
- Keep in mind that your fingers are not exactly the same size on each hand.
- Make sure the ring can move comfortably along the entire length of your finger in your chosen size.
- To measure your finger, use a tape measure in mm; this measurement corresponds to the size of the ring.
- We advise you to download and print our Monards Ring Size Guide (please ensure that the scale is set to 100% when printing).



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HOW TO MEASURE YOUR RING WITH OUR MONARDS SIZE GUIDE

- 1. Print the size chart.
- 2. Use an existing ring and position it over the circles to determine the diameter that corresponds with it. Note that the inside circumference of the band should align with the outside of the circle.
