1. Introduction

The Singapore Cycling Federation (SCF) is pleased to announce that the OCBC Ranking and Points System for ROAD events will continue in 2024, as part of a strategic objective to enhance the vibrancy of the local events ecosystem. Points acquired will count towards a National Ranking by the end of the local racing season.

The OCBC Ranking and Points System are intended to achieve the following:

- a. Increase opportunities for more winners and reasons to celebrate;
- b. Encourage participation in multiple events in any one local racing season;
- c. Complement SCF's existing Athlete Selection Policy and thereby, ensure that the process of athlete selection for overseas competitions and Major Games remains robust and objective.

2. The OCBC Ranking and Points System for the 2024 Road season will be as follows:

- a. The recognition of road events organised or sanctioned by SCF.
- b. All participants who sign up in a particular category at the beginning of the year will ONLY be awarded points in that category.

At the National Championships (CN) for the UCI categories (registered on the UCI calendar), riders with a Day Licence will be allowed to take part in the 'championship categories' *(Junior, Under 23, and Elite). However, he/she will **NOT** be eligible for the SCF points, UCI Points, and the official 'National Champion's jersey'.

3. <u>Individual Ranking and Points:</u> Individual rankings and points will be awarded in the following categories.

Class 1 – UCI International races (for example UCI class 1.1) held in Singapore and the OCBC National Championships (CN)

Class 2 – Local Races involving Regional, National, and Club Teams (for example OCBC Speedway)

Class 3 – Local Races involving National and Club Teams (for example SCF Track series)

Class 3.1 – Overseas-sanctioned races (to be officially approved by the host nation's national federation and in the presence of national commissaries)

5. Awards

At the end of the season, SCF will present yellow jerseys to the top-ranked rider in each of the points categories and a Challenge Trophy to the top-ranked team/club.

Points will be accrued in the age category that the rider registers at the beginning of the year.

Details of the Season-end prize presentation award ceremony will be communicated by SCF to all winners after the final event for the season.

The overall OCBC Road Series Champion pink jersey will be awarded to the top **Singaporean** rider in the Men Elite and Women Elite categories.

Club Points - Computation and Team ranking (Top Ranked Team/Club)

ONLY the top five (5) individual points scorers for each team (men and women) will be used to calculate the team score for each event, tabulating to the Top Ranked Team/Club in the 2024 OCBC National Ranking.

For any duo or team race, the calculation will be done based on the:

- individual rider's timing/position/points (only for Riders with UCI/SCF License)
- and subsequently added to the team (points)

Overall Points Computation

If we have two, or more, cyclists vying for the same position with a similar number of points, the eventual ranking will be based on the cyclist's position in the last SCF event or SCF-sanctioned race.

Change of Team Name

Teams are permitted to change their team's name during the season (although we strongly encourage the established affiliate clubs to avoid doing this as it would have an impact on your affiliation to SCF and, the Full/Associate Membership status). The SCF and the Event Organiser must be kept informed with at least one month's notice, before the race/competition date, and, the Club President or Club Representative will be required to drop us an email to effect the change – admin@singaporecycling.org.sg

Switching Teams

If a rider wishes to switch from one team/club to another, the rider and club(s) must inform SCF (by email to admin@singaporecycling.org.sg) for SCF to review/approve 30 days before an upcoming event. Again, here we would like to strongly advise the established affiliate clubs to consider entering into an agreement with your riders at the start of the season and for them to commit to remaining with your club until the end of the season.

A maximum of one (1) switch can be made at any time during the season and, individual points secured can be transferred to the new team/club. **HOWEVER:**

- Current team points are NOT transferable to the new team/club.
- An administrative fee of \$50 applies.



FAQs

A. National Points awarded shall be in the Age Category that the Rider registers at the beginning of the Year

Scenario A1: Rider (Youth) seeks approval to race in the Junior Category, subject to approval from the SCF Commissaire Commission. If approved, will be awarded points for the whole season in the Junior Category. Should there be other races over the course of the season he/she rides in the Youth Category, he/she will not get any points for these races.

Scenario A2: Rider (Senior) races in the Elite Category at the beginning of the year, and will be awarded points for the whole season in the Elite Category. Should there be other races over the course of the season he/she rides in the Seniors Category, he/she will not get any points for these races.

- B. Confirmed UCI Licence eligibility for National Ranking and Points for the 2024 Road season UCI Licences must be applied and confirmed before the event, no late or post-event applications will be considered for appeal.
- C. Switching Teams
 - Requests must be in writing via email to admin@singaporecycling.org.sg and are Subject to Approval.
 - Team principals of both old and new teams must be copied in the email
 - Must be at least one month's notice, before the race/competition date
 - A fee of \$50 must be made before the update is administered on the UCI Licence
 - Only one (1) switch is allowed in the season

Scenario C1: Rider Clint of ABC Team has got 20 points so far in the season; then a request for Switching Teams to another team, XYZ Team is filed and approved. Rider Clint's 20 points will not be carried across to his new team, XYZ Team but will remain with ABC Team. (Clint will however retain his Points)

D. Team Points

Q01: Why is the end-of-year team score made up of the top five (5) individual points scorers for each team (men and women)?

A01: This is implemented so that each team's highest ranked and most consistent riders (top-5) shall account for their Final Team Points.

E. Cross Category's for TTT (teams)

S/N	Question	Answer
1.	4 riders in TTT race in Elite category, 3 have Elite licences but one has a Master (or older age category) licence. Would the Master score points?	The Master category rider shall be accorded points. This will be in Master category based on his/her final position in his/her category as ranked by their timings at the race.
2.	4 riders in TTT, some have Master (/age category) and some have Elite licences. Can they enter Master TTT race event?	No, the 4 riders as a team can only join the Elite category, but not the Master category for TTT.



3.	for any event, if rider has age category licence (Masters and above) but race in Elite race, will they score point?	No, the rider can only score points in his/her age category that he/she has registered under for the whole season (Masters and above).
4.	for any event, if rider actual age is Master or above, but has Elite licence, can they race in Master or above race category? Will the score points in master and above race category?	For riders holding Elite licence they may only race in the Elite category. Points will be accorded for said rider in Elite category for the season.
5.	a. Why are riders in the TTT given their individual times to determine rankings? These would typically be based off the 3rd rider's time which is the team time. b. The distances are different for different categories, so how is this compared when giving points for a rider racing in Elite (for example) when they have a Master or SuperMaster licence?	The consideration is taken in view of team's who have riders from a mix of category's (e.g. a Master rider forming with 3 Elite riders in a Quad). Do note that the Race Result, i.e. each team's finishing position, is separate from the Points Award. The former is determined, for instance, once the 3 rd rider of a Quad team crosses the finish line. Whereas the latter is based on individual times for each individual's age category.

F. National Points Eligibility

- I. Only UCI Licence holders will be accorded points.
- II. For each race, riders individual timing will be taken into consideration for their ranking according to their respective registered age category.
- III. The age category a rider registers his/her UCI Licence in for shall be the one and only category he/she is accorded points for the season; regardless of him/her racing in other eligible category's (Example: Masters rider decides to race in Elite category race, he can win/medal in the race but no points accorded as he/she will only get points for Masters category)
- IV. Just one classification (Age Category) across the disciplines, e.g. Road & MTB.
