### KEY OBJECTIVES, VISION, PURPOSE AND CORE VALUES:



#### 1. The objects of the Federation are:

- a. Promote, develop and increase participation for the sport of Cycling in Singapore
- b. Promote physical activity for health and wellness, foster community engagement and bonding for social inclusiveness and integration, and inspire the Singapore Spirit through the sport of Cycling.
- c. To engage communities and provide access to the sport of Cycling to vulnerable segments of the community such as youth at risk and the less privileged.
- d. Unify, co-ordinate, sanction and organise Cycling activities in Singapore, including national and international Cycling tournaments and events.
- e. Raise the competitive standards of Cycling athletes in Singapore for sustainable elite level performance at international competitions and multi-sport major games.
- f. Provide sport pathways and opportunities for the progression and advancement of Cycling athletes, coaches, mechanics and technical



officials in Singapore.

- g. Raise the technical capability of Cycling coaches, mechanics, team managers and technical officials in Singapore.
- h. Do all things complementary or incidental to attain the aforesaid objects.

### **Selection and Recruitment of Board Members**

2. As extracted from the SCF Constitution:

#### **Key Office Bearers**

- a. The Board's key office bearers will minimally be the President, Secretary General, Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer.
- b. The President and Secretary General shall be Elected Board Members who are Singapore citizens and who have served at least one term of two years, in the immediate preceding four years, as an Elected Board Member. This criteria shall be waived in the event that there are no members satisfying the criteria stepping forward to be nominated for the aforesaid positions.
- c. The Treasurer should preferably have a recognized accounting qualification and / or appropriate practical experience.
- d. The President should have served and made positive contributions to the sport of Cycling and/or SCF as an ex-athlete, official or elected Board member, or should be a prominent individual of good standing within the sport and / or community.

#### **Board Members**

- e. Board members shall at least be twenty-one (21) years of age and shall be Singapore citizens or Permanent Residents.
- f. Board members shall not be Individuals who are disqualified from serving on the Board of charities or companies pursuant to the Charities Act and Companies Act or have past convictions for offences for which criminal record cannot be spent pursuant to the Registration of Criminals Act (Third Schedule).
- g. Board members shall not be serving a suspension or ban from UCI or other regulatory authority.
- h. Board members shall be persons of good character with the relevant experience and credentials.





- i. Board members shall neither be a paid employee of SCF nor have a family member who is a paid employee of SCF.
  - j. No more than three (3) of the Board members shall be family members, and such relationships must be declared upfront in the nomination and before the Board election.
3. Notwithstanding the above, the SCF Board encourages anyone who has the passion to grow and develop the sport of cycling as well as the necessary skill sets and experience (as listed below) to come forward to volunteer.
4. Relevant skill sets or work experience include (non-exhaustive):
- a. Sports Management, Business Management
  - b. Coaching, Sports Science
  - c. Understand the technicalities of the sport of cycling
  - d. Public relations and Integrated Communications
  - e. Social media management
  - f. Marketing (and digital marketing)
  - g. Sponsorship and asset/rights management
  - h. Finance, accounting, auditing
  - i. Human Resource Management
  - j. Information Technology
  - k. Legal
  - l. Project and Event Management
  - m. Managing a Charitable Organisation or an Institution of Public Character
5. For an individual who is keen to assume the post of an incumbent office holder, by the time of the next AGM (Annual General Meeting), he/she would be encouraged to commit to volunteer his/her services for minimally one year or the full term of two years in office as an Associate Member and to understudy the incumbent office holder.

7. Based on the evaluation, Board members could seek training to plug competency gaps, adopt best practices or where appropriate, appoint new Management Committee members with the relevant expertise.

8. It is expected that a Board Member will attend at least three out of the four quarterly Board meetings (annually) as well as relevant lend his/her expertise to specific tasks or actively participate in specific task group or sub-committee meetings when called upon to do so. A letter of appreciation would be extended to a Board member who is no longer able to commit his/her time and expertise actively and, a replacement would be appointed.

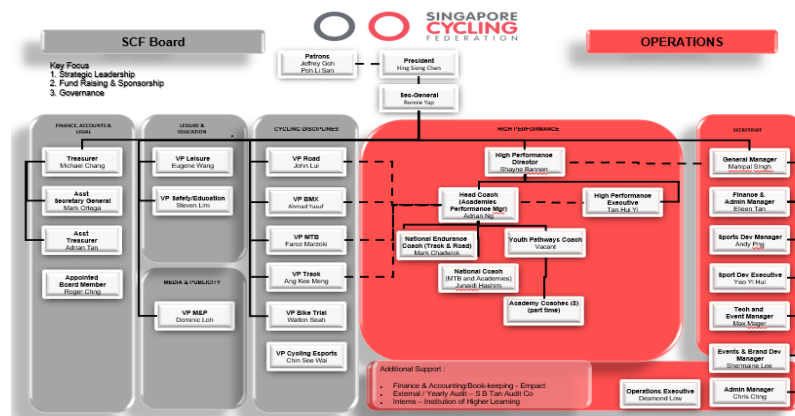
### Staffing and Organisational Structure

14. The Secretariat of the Singapore Cycling Federation (SCF) is headed by Mahipal Singh s/o K. Ishar Singh, the General Manager, who was appointed on 1 Apr 2014.

15. Prior to joining the SCF, Mahipal spent 21.5 years (between Feb 1991 and Jun 2012) in the Singapore Sports Council, SSC (Sport Singapore), where he was responsible for the overseeing the day to day operations of National Sports Associations (NSAs) high performance planning and implementation, coach education and development and also held leadership responsibilities during the 1993 SEA Games (Singapore), Asian Youth Games in 2009 (Singapore), the Youth Olympic Games in 2010 (Singapore) and at other major international multi-sports events including the Commonwealth Games, Asian Games, Asian Indoor Games and the South East Asian Games. His last held position in the SSC was that of a Deputy Director, Coaching Services, Singapore Sports Institute

16. As at 31 March 2023, there were 13 full time staff.

18. None of the three (3) highest paid staff also served as a Board member of the SCF. In addition, there is no paid staff being a close member of the family belonging to the General Manager or a Board member of the SCF who has received remuneration in excess of \$50,000 during the financial year.

19. On matters of salary increments, salary adjustments and promotions as well as staff performance review, the SCF's Human Resource (HR) Committee would make reference to its in-house developed Salary Guide.

20. The SCF's HR Committee comprises the President, Secretary-General, Treasurer and VP (Cycling Esports). The composition of the Committee is on two-year term from September 2021 to September 2023.

**Remuneration for key staff**

21. The Board may by way of a unanimous vote of the Board members recruit any person to be its Chief Executive Officer, General Manager, Technical Director,/High Performance Director or such other key or other staff on a full time or on a part time basis, or any entity with the relevant qualification and ability, to manage the operations of the Federation. The Board will make such recommendations to Sport Singapore as part of its annual funding/budgetary requirements prior to recruiting such persons or entity(ies).

22. For key executives eg. the Chief Executive Officer, the Federation and Sport Singapore shall jointly recruit such key staff through joint interviews and evaluation, and the appointment of such key staff will be subject to Sport Singapore's approval, which will not be unreasonably withheld.

23. The appointment, remuneration, key performance indicators and terms of employment of such staff shall be determined by the SCF Board and approved by Sport Singapore.

24. The Board shall formulate policies and procedures to help assess, screen, supervise and train volunteer appointees including procuring appropriate HR provisions for its staff, officials and volunteers, e.g. insurance coverage. Such decisions will be documented in the minutes of Board meetings.



### Conflict of Interest Declaration

25. SCF's Conflict of Interest Policy can be found on SCF's website – [www.singaporecycling.org.sg](http://www.singaporecycling.org.sg) . On an annual basis, all Board members and staff would be required to make a conflict of interest declaration. A staff or Board member who declares that he/she has existing/potential conflict of interest is required to state the conflict of interest (including persons, companies with whom/which he/she has official dealings and/or private interest) and for this to be escalated to the President, SCF. He/She will then be required to recuse himself/herself from all transactions, recommendations or decision making on matters pertaining to the subject matter in which he/she is in a conflicted position.

### Whistle Blowing Policy

26. Whistle-blowing is defined as a deliberate, voluntary disclosure of individual or organisational malpractice by a person who has or has had privileged access to data, events, or information about an actual, suspected, or anticipated wrongdoing within or by SCF, that is within SCF's control. Reportable Incidents must have been, or are expected to be, committed at SCF premises and/or during the conduct of the SCF Board members's/staff's/ duties, employment or conduct of business with SCF.

### Regional and International Meetings/Conferences

#### Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI)

33. The UCI Congress was held on 22 Sep 2022, in conjunction with the UCI World Championship (Road) which was held in Wollongong, Australia. SCF was represented by Mr Ronnie Yap, Secretary General (also in his capacity as a UCI Delegate) and Mr Michael Chang, Treasurer.

#### Asian Cycling Confederation (ACC)

34. The ACC Congress was held in Bali, Indonesia from 28 Feb to 1 Mar 2023. The SCF was represented by Dr Hing Siong Chen, President (also in his capacity as the Treasurer, ACC) and Mr Ronnie Yap, Secretary General (also in his capacity as a UCI Delegate).

### High Performance Programmes, Academies and National Level Squads

35. Shayne Bannan as SCF's High Performance Director continued to have oversight of SCF's high performance plans, programmes and initiatives. Adrian Ng as SCF's Head Coach was primarily responsible for performance planning and monitoring as well as all aspects of sports science services and engagement with various stakeholders including the Singapore Sports Institute, National Youth Sports Institute, Singapore Sports School and Clubs.



36. The priorities for 2022 include:
- a. Training stints, preparation and participation in the South East Asian (SEA) Games in Vietnam.
  - b. The establishment of a Cycling Esports, Track and Women's Academy.
  - c. International partnerships with GreenEdge (BikeExchange-Jayco) and the Australian Cycling Academy (ACA).
  - d. Club engagement.
  - e. Professional development of coaches.

SCF Academy – Track

37. SCF's Track Cycling Academy was officially launched on 20 January 2023 and is supported by the Active Citizen Grant – a grant available for athletes to tap on to start their own charity or social pursuit for causes close to their hearts under Team Singapore Cares, a platform for Team Singapore athletes to serve and give back to the community. The SCF Track Cycling Academy was initiated by national track cyclist Calvin Sim, who has a passion in promoting cycling to the younger generation and teaching them the techniques to excel in the sport.
38. This initiative was targeted at Singapore youth cyclists between the ages of 14 and 18 years old (as of 2023), seeks to expose them to track cycling and provide them the opportunity to learn track cycling techniques in a safe environment in Jurong West Stadium.
39. Kids Clinic would also be available for younger children aged 8 to 13 years old (as of 2023), where they will learn the basic bike handling skills.
40. As for the SCF's Academies, National Development and National Training Squads, these continue to evolve both in terms of the quality of training programmes as well as the number of riders.

## SCF Fund Raising Campaign 2022

### Cycle For Hope

41. The SCF organised its first ever Fund-Raising Campaign, “Cycle For Hope,” in 2022. It involved two events viz.
- a. a Cycling Challenge (to be completed indoor and / or outdoor) from 9 Jul to 20 Aug 2022 and,
  - b. culminating in the Sports Hub Sport Series #4 on 21 Aug 2022 at the Sports Hub.

In addition, a Charity Golf and Appreciation Dinner event was held on 21 October 2022 at the Tanah Merah Country Club.

42. The three events were organised with the intent of raising funds for the Singapore Cancer Society and the Singapore Cycling Federation and funds were apportioned to the Singapore Cancer Society and for the development of future cycling talents through SCF’s Children Academy and high-performance developmental programmes including the development of a BMX Track.



43. A total of \$481,611.00 was raised from the Cycling Challenge held between 9 July and 21 August 2022 and the Charity Golf and Appreciation Dinner on 21 October 2022. Of the total amount raised, 171,020.00 was channelled (donated) to the Singapore Cancer Society, as part of SCF's commitment.
44. The SCF would like to specially acknowledge Mr Baey Yam Keng, Senior Parliamentary Secretary, Ministry of Transport and Ministry of Sustainability and the Environment for agreeing to be SCF's Patron for the Fund Raising Campaign and SCF's cash sponsors – OCBC Bank, Novartis Singapore (Pte) Ltd and Maybank Banking Berhad (Singapore Branch) which contributed \$20,000, \$12,000 and \$5,000 respectively towards defraying costs incurred on the fund-raising campaign.

#### Sports Hub Sports Series: Festival of Cycling 2022

46. Continuing from Series 1 and 2 in Feb and Mar 2022, the SCF's collaboration with the Singapore Sports Hub rolled over into FY22 with three events between May 2022 and Feb 2023:
- Sports Hub Sports Series #3 on 29 May 2022 (Criterium and Kids Race) – 163 participants



- Sports Hub Sports Series #4 on 21 Aug 2022 (Criterium and Kids Race) – 99 participants
  - Sports Hub Sports Series #5 on 5 Feb 2023 (Urban Eliminator and Kids Race) – 93 participants
47. On 26 March 2023, the SCF introduced the first of a series of events intended specifically for those between the ages of 4 and 16 years of age. Titled, the SCF Gen Z Alpha Series, this inaugural event attracted a total of 65 participants for Series 1.

#### Tour De France Prudential Singapore Criterium

48. This inaugural event, sanctioned by SCF, was organised on 29 and 30 Oct 2022. This event was supported by the Singapore Tourism Board and promoted by TEG Sport in conjunction with Evoke EXP.
49. The event was the Tour de France’s first criterium in Singapore and South-east Asia, where cyclists had to complete 20 rounds around a 3.2km circuit – part of which was used for Formula One Singapore Grand Prix.
50. In the main event, Jonas Vingegaard, the reigning Tour de France Champion, claimed the title from 43 other cyclists. Four-time Tour winner Chris Froome was second, while 2014 champion Vincenzo Nibali, who had announced he would retire at the end of 2022, was third.
51. Separately, SCF entered into a collaboration with:
- a. Imagine + (and Prudential) for the organisation of Basic level coaching Clinics and
  - b. TEG Asia for the organisation of Intermediate level coaching Clinics.

#### #TOGOSG Round The Island Challenge

52. The SCF entered into a collaboration to support the #TOGOSG Round The Island Challenge which was held from 18 Mar to 11 Apr 2022. National cyclists participated in the event intended to inspire Singaporeans to cycle.

#### Safe Cycling – Training, Education and Promotion

53. Go-Ahead Singapore, in collaboration with LTA and SCF, organised an awareness session for Bus Captains and Cyclists on 30 Apr 2022 at the Loyang Bus Depot. Through the classroom discussions and practical role-playing sessions, participating cyclists shared that it was very beneficial that they were able to have a first-hand experience of the bus captains’ perspectives, as well as gain awareness of the additional challenges Bus Captains face. On the other hand, Bus captains shared about their training and how it helped them to drive safely and to look out for other road users





such as cyclists.

54. LTA organised a ride event, supported by SCF, - the **Move Happy Explore SG Ride** between 23 June and 23 September 2022. This initiative promotes Active Mobility (AM) uptake through fun exploratory rides. Participants could choose curated routes across 10 locations in Singapore comprising a mix of park connectors, cycling paths and footpaths, and explore as many routes as they like at their own pace within the 3-month period. Participants had to register for the ride via LTA's event microsite, track their rides with a GPS-based fitness application and submit their ride details on the event microsite. Rewards were given to participants according to the number of routes they complete.

#### Move For Dyslexia

55. The Dyslexia Association of Singapore (DAS) organised "Move for Dyslexia" between 11 October and 31 December 2022 to raise awareness on dyslexia and other specific learning differences (SpLDs) – by walking, running or cycling as well as raise funds for children with dyslexia from lower-income families. This event was supported by the SCF.

#### Let's Ride Singapore

56. Let's Ride, Singapore was a month-long virtual cycling event with a series of challenges and contests open to all cycling enthusiasts in Singapore. It was organised by MiRXES and managed by Events People Inc Pte Ltd and held from 14 August to 18 September 2022. The event's key objectives were to initiate a public education programme to promote road safety and healthy lifestyle through cycling, and to enhance and improve the harmonious relationship amongst all road users.

57. The SCF supported this event by:
- providing professional advisory and consultancy for the Event's marketing video.
  - Hosted Talks/Workshops during the event and,
  - Publicised the event through our network and social media.

#### Diabetes Singapore

58. The SCF supported Diabetes Singapore's Cycle For Charity Event, "PEDAL (Physical Exercise – Diabetes Awareness League)" the first event of its kind in Singapore – Supporting Diabetes Care. This event was held on 14 May



2022, with the aims to raise awareness about diabetes and raise support for better diabetes care management.

### Campus Legend

59. The SCF collaborated with the Singapore Cybersports Online Gaming Association (SCOGA) to organise a zwift competition for school-going children, aged 17 years old, as part of Campus Legend 2022. Qualifying events were held on 30 July 2022 while the Final was held on 6 and 7 Aug 2022. The zwift competition attracted 34 participants.

### International Cycling Executives (ICE)

60. On 27 January 2023, the SCF announced the establishment of a strategic relationship with International Cycling Executives (ICE) - an active, global business community of executives and influencers connecting through a shared passion for cycling.
61. Starting from 2023, the SCF will initiate activities for personal and professional development through our shared passion of cycling. Over time, it is envisaged that deep and endearing friendships and business opportunities will develop to help realise SCF's core objectives in the years ahead.

### PedalFest Singapore 2023

62. PedalFest Singapore 2023 was organised on 11 and 12 Feb 2023 at the 100Plus Promenade in the Singapore Sports Hub. This is an event organised by Firefly Connections and dedicated to all cyclist(s) to connect and meet over bicycle films, sporting programmes, pedal and spin challenges, bike safety, health and wellness workshops.
63. The SCF supported the event by organising a Kids' skills clinic and a track-stand competition and all participants had the opportunity to also try-out peddling on a Watt bike.

88. SB Tan Audit PAC was responsible for auditing SCF’s accounts for FY22. As at 31 March 2023, the SCF was in a favourable position with cash and cash equivalents amounting to \$989,423.00. Apart from funding received from



Sport Singapore, the SCF managed to generate additional income from events organised, through race registration fees, event sanctioning, competency development courses and licences/membership fees. This amounted to \$321,087.00

93. On a quarterly basis (i.e. Board meetings), the SCF Board reviews the amount of reserves that are required to ensure that they are adequate to fulfil our continuing obligations, provide financial stability and the means for the development of our principal activity. In FY 22, the SCF had accumulated and set aside \$707,576 as restricted funds. This amount was obtained through donations and a Sport Singapore matching grant scheme - "One Team Singapore Fund." A further \$360,963.00 is available as unrestricted funds.

94. The amount raised was set aside primarily for SCF's Children's Academy including the development of a BMX and Pump Tracks and to defray costs (high performance specific programmes and initiatives) to be incurred on the Road, Track, BMX and MTB National Training Squads in preparation for and participation in regional and

international competitions and equipment/apparel purchases.

95. In order to also ensure that our reserves are adequate to fulfil our continuing obligations, the SCF will set aside at least six months of reserves for operating expenditure on rental, office operations, staff salaries and to fund its performance related, community outreach and competency development programmes and initiatives.

## **FUTURE PLANS**

### Local events

96. The SCF would be engaging local events management companies for the organisation of the local cycling events, to complement SCF organised National Championship events. At the same time, local series-type events are also being planned, with a focus on Kids and Youth (between the age of 4 and 16 years of age).

97. The SCF will be sanctioning up to three events in 2023 viz.

- a. OCBC Cycle Singapore (Club Championship) to be held on 6 May 2023.
- b. Singapore Open Enduro on 21 and 22 Oct 2023.
- c. Tour De France Prudential Singapore Criterium on 28 and 29 Oct 2023.

### Staff Appointment

98. The SCF is pleased to announce the following appointments:

- a. Miss Tan Hui Yi's appointment as SCF's High Performance Executive, following her initial appointment as an Admin Executive as part of the SGUnited Traineeship Programme.

### SCF Fund Raising Campaign – 2023

99. After a successful campaign in 2022, the Singapore Cycling Federation (SCF) will again be embarking on a campaign to raise funds not only for SCF but also for the Singapore Cancer Society (SCS) in 2023 i.e. Cycle For Hope Campaign. After deducting expenses incurred to organize the fund raiser, it is proposed that 70% of all funds raised through donations would be channeled to the SCS while 30% would go towards developing SCF's Children Academy and related high-performance programmes including the development of a BMX and Pump Tracks. In addition, the SCF would also be organizing a Charity Gala Dinner to complement what would be raised through the Cycle For Hope Campaign.




