GOVERNING INSTRUMENT

1. The SCF is governed by a Constitution which was adopted at the Annual General Meeting on 7 Sep 2012. This was subsequently amended with approval from Sport Singapore, the Commissioner of Charities and the Registry of Societies (July 2016). The amended Constitution was presented and adopted at the Annual General Meeting held on 23 Sep 2016 and the following key amendments to the Constitution were effected:
 - a. Article 2(a): to update the registered address of the SCF namely #01-33, 3 Stadium Drive, Singapore 397630.
 - b. Article 3(h): to include as affiliates of the SCF the following associations: (a) Asean Cycling Association (ACA) and (b) Asian Cycling Confederation (ACC)
 - c. Article 6(a) and 6(b): to make provision for the Management Committee to include a Vice President for Media and Publicity and a Vice President for Track.
2. Harding MTB Racing Team and Team Cycledelic were officially accepted as new SCF ordinary club members. As at 31 March 2017, the SCF has seven (7) affiliated ordinary members.
3. Governance Evaluation Checklist
As an Institution of a Public Character (IPC), the SCF had duly submitted the Online Evaluation Checklist (for the period from 1 Apr 16 to 31 Mar 17) at the Charity Portal. The Period of Approved IPC status granted to SCF is from 1 Dec 2016 to 30 Nov 2019.

OBJECTIVES:

4. The objects of the Federation are:
 - (a) Cycling: To encourage, promote, organize, develop and control the art and pastime of cycling in Singapore.

- (b) Cyclists: To support and protect the interest of cyclists in Singapore.
- (c) Bicycle Racing: To control bicycle racing and arrange bicycle race meetings in Singapore, and to give technical advice or other instructions thereon.
- (d) Representatives: To select competitors to represent Singapore or the Federation.
- (e) Prizes etc.: To give prizes, medals and other awards, and to obtain, collect, receive and hold funds and property by subscription, voluntary contributions, gifts or legacies or otherwise, for the objects of the Federation.
- (f) Disputes: To settle any dispute that may arise between the members of the Federation and decide all doubtful and disputed points in connection with the sport and the rules and regulations thereof.
- (g) Promotion and Funding: To promote and safeguard the interests of the sport, and employ, when necessary, the funds of the Federation for the purpose
- (h) Affiliations: To affiliate with the Singapore Sports Council (“SSC”), Singapore National Olympic Council (“SNOC”), the International Cycling Union (Union Cycliste Internationale or “UCI”), BikeTrial International Union (“BIU”), or other international body or bodies whose objects are the same as or similar to those of the Federation.
- (i) Competitions: To sponsor, support and/or participate in any national or international cycling races or competitions.
- (j) Cycle Titles: To decide on the official recognition of cycling titles established in Singapore.
- (k) Misc: Generally to do all such other acts or things as may be incidental to or connected with or conducive to the attainment of any of the above-mentioned objects.

5. There are 467 current SCF individual members (SCF / UCI License holders) and seven (7) ordinary members (affiliated clubs with voting rights). Of the current individual members, 100 have been granted UCI Licenses.

Events

Cycle Safe Programme and Collaborations

Accredited Training/Service Provider

21. Asian De Tours was recognised as an “accredited service provider” which essentially meant that they could run Cycle Safe programmes as per SCF’s syllabus and training materials. In August 2016, Asian Detours Pte Ltd produced a promotional video the link can be found at <https://youtu.be/8wmzo-vSaFl>. SCF’s Vice President for Safety Mr Steven Lim was featured in the video.

National Environment Agency (NEA)

22. The SCF awarded Level 1 and 2 Certification for 75 staff of the NEA, on their successful completion of the Cycle Safe Course held on 21, 27 and 29 September 2016.

Ministry of Education

23. Cycle Safe Trainers’ Course organised for 14 MOE staff on 12 and 13 Oct 2016.

People’s Association and Grassroots Organisations

24. An SCF Cycle Safe Ambassador’s Course was organised on 23 April 2016 for North East CDC and a course specifically for People’s Association on 30 April 2016.
25. Separately and, as part of the Sembawang GRC’s Cycling Community Day, a Cycle Safe Ambassadors’ Course was organised in the Sembawang Community Club on 13 and 20 November 2016.
26. On the request of Gain City, the SCF participated in and conducted a safe cycling clinic for kids. This was organised as part of the Yuhua Community Club Women’s Executive Committee (WEC) Cycling to Gain City & Crime Prevention Awareness Day on 27 November 2016. The event was also organised in conjunction with Gain City Celebrates Fitness & Health.

Singapore Sports Hub Community Day

27. The SCF was involved in the Singapore Sports Hub’s Community Play Day held on 11 June 2016 within the vicinity of the Sports Hub. A “learn how to cycle,” workshop was organised and led by VP (BMX) Hairul Nazwa.

Cycosports Jungle Cross Clinic

28. In a new initiative spearheaded by VP (BMX) and BMX Coach Hairul Nazwa, Cycosports' Jungle Cross III Event on 14 August 2016, saw the introduction of a Kid's MTB clinic and fun race on a newly designed kid's MTB course. The objectives of the clinic and race are twofold i.e. (a) to inspire youth to pursue cycling and (b) introduce key riding skills in a safe and controlled environment. This event was organised with support of Cycosports, Centaurs Group and Sports Camp Australia.

Charitable Events

Dr Kevin Lee (VP for Leisure) and Mr Steven Lim (VP for Safety/Education) represented the SCF in support of the 6th edition of Ride for Rations. This was a riding event, involving 150 other cyclists, from Malacca to Singapore on 27 and 28 Aug 2016 to raise funds to:

- provide monthly food rations to 380 needy households registered with Sunlove Neighbourhood Link, an outreach of registered charity, Sunlove Abode for Intellectually Infirm.
- provide monthly breakfast package to 200 school-going children living in the above and other estates through Sunlove.

Events Sanctioned/Supported

29. OCBC Cycle Singapore
The SCF continued to sanction the OCBC Cycle Singapore event held on 1 Oct 2016. A national team comprising Junaidi Hashim, Ho Jun Rong, Gabriel Tan, Raymond Queck and Mohd Irsyad Marican participated in the SEAsian Championship event and came in 5th out of 6 competing nations (i.e. Singapore, Malaysia, Brunei, Cambodia, Myanmar, Philippines). As for the Club Championship, there were nine local cycling clubs field 15 teams in total. Specialised Mavericks emerged winners in this category.
30. The OCBC Cycle mass event on 2 Oct 2016 saw nearly 7,000 cycling fans participate in a non-competitive ride held at the Singapore Sports Hub.
31. TOGO 920
The SCF lent its support for #TOGO920 held between 14 May and 17 July 2016. Organised by Togoparts, it encourages cyclists to ride 920km in eight weeks, anytime, anywhere and on any Bike. #TOGO920 is the second of three Challenges in 2016 to celebrate Togoparts' 15th Anniversary. Participants had to use the "strava" application to record their rides to become a finisher. And on successful completion of the 920km ride, the cyclist received a finisher jersey with an embroidered #TOGO920 badge and SCF logo.
32. Singapore Bike Show 2016
SCF played a role to support "The Singapore Bike Show 2016" – through the activation of a group of BikeTrial riders to perform during the event. Organised

by Space Arena, the inaugural “The Singapore Bike Show 2016” - the first exposition in Asia featured motorcycles, bicycles and e-bikes from around the world, making it a one-of-its kind event. The Show was held on 20 and 21 August 2016 at Hall 3 of the Singapore Expo. It comprehensively showcased the latest models and actively promoted safe riding and cycling. It also served as a key platform for associations, manufacturers, distributors, training schools and delivery companies in Asia to converge, network and develop business opportunities.

Cycosports

33. Cycosports, specialising in the organisation of cycling events, organised two events viz. the OCBC Cycle Car Park Climb on 7 Aug 2016 and the Seletar Criterium along Piccadilly Road on 21 Aug 2016. Both events were supported by the SCF. In addition, the following regional competition was also recognised as part of the OCBC Cycle National Ranking and Points System (Road):

a. Tour De Phuket – 17 to 19 March 2017 with 39 participants from 6 countries, including Singapore

34. The Junglecross Series was also recognised as events where riders could secure national ranking points viz. OCBC Cycle National Ranking and Points System (MTB). The following were organised in FY16:

a. Jungle Cross I - 12 Feb 2017 with 69 participants

Holy Crit 9 and 10

35. This SCF sanctioned event (Holy Crit IX) was organised on 3 Dec 2016 in a “closed circuit” at Jalan Benaan Kapal. A total of 90 riders took part in this event.

36. On 11 Feb 2017, the Sports Hub hosted Holy Crit X (10) as part of an “indoor” night race. This event was also sanctioned by SCF and it attracted 110 participants.

Cyclocross Singapore

37. The 3rd Annual Cyclocross Singapore Mass Event Ride held on 8 Jan 2017 at Kranji. The SCF assisted with publicity of the event and officially endorsed it as an SCF-“supported” event. The event attracted 70 participants.

IMEvents Criterium

38. This event was held on 5 Feb 2017 at Keat Hong Link/Choa Chu Kang. A total of 158 participants signed up for the event including our national athletes who took part as Team SCF.

E3Sports

39. E3 Sports specialises in MTB cross country events. Their series of four (4) races were recognised as part of the OCBC Cycle National Ranking and Points System,

of which, the following event was organised in FY16:

- a. MTB Performance Challenge – 12 Mar 2017 which attracted 107 participants

International Competitions

BMX

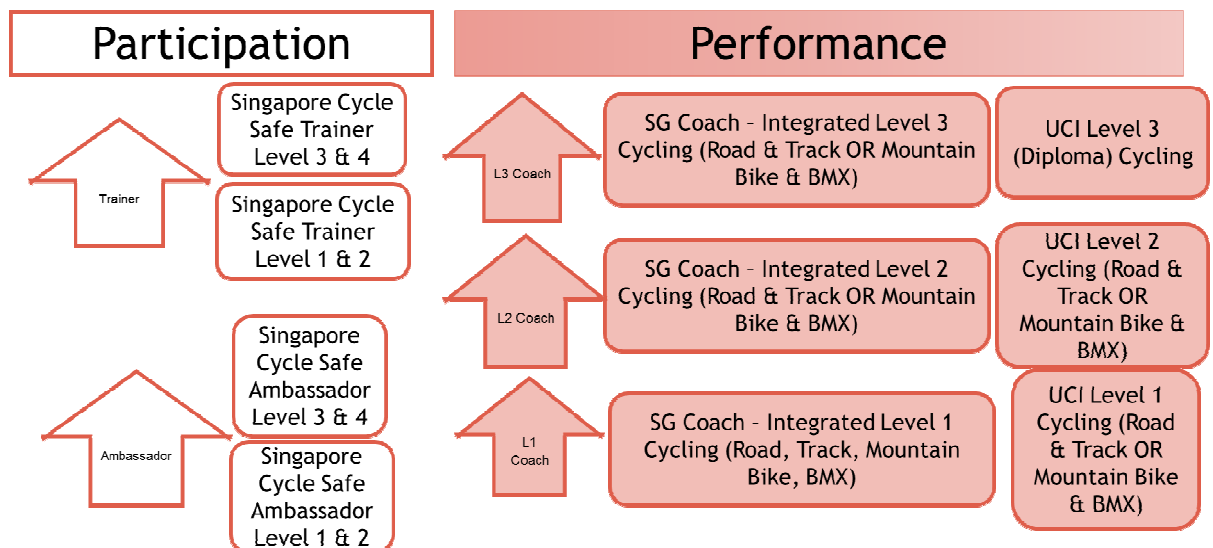

56. For year ending 31 March 2017, the SCF issued the “Cycling Bronze Award” to 115 members of the Singapore Police Force for successfully completing the “Cycling Familiarisation Course” Bronze Certificates. The SCF charged \$5.00 for each certificate issued and this course continued to be organised by Asian Detours Pte Ltd.
57. Coaching Course – Level 1 (SportSG-SCF endorsed)
The SCF organised a Level 1 Coaching Course from 3 to 14 Oct 2016, soon after developing a Coaching Certification and Development Pathway.



58. The course attracted 15 participants.
59. Commissaires Course - the SCF ran a Basic National Commissaires' Course (Level 1) on 14 and 15 May 2016. The course was conducted by Mr Max Mager and it attracted 13 participants. A second run was conducted on 30 and 31 July 2016 and it involved 13 participants, also facilitated by Mr Max Mager.


