GOVERNING INSTRUMENT

- The SCF is governed by a Constitution which was adopted at the Annual General Meeting on 7 Sep 2012. This was subsequently amended with approval from Sport Singapore, the Commissioner of Charities and the Registry of Societies (July 2016). The amended Constitution was presented and approved at the Annual General Meeting (AGM) held on 23 Sep 2016.
- At the AGM on 29 September 2017, the SCF Constitution was refined further so as to be in alignment with the Charity Council's Code of Governance and best practices. The main changes were on the following:

Rule 4 (a) (ii) (3)	Club Representative : Each club wishing to become an Ordinary Member shall be represented by 1 representative
Rule 5 (i)	Ordinary Members: Each Ordinary Member shall be eligible to vote at all General Meetings, provided that it has been an Ordinary Member for at least

	3 months as at the date of the relevant meeting. Each Ordinary Member shall be entitled to be represented at any General Meeting by its Club Rep. The Club Rep shall be entitled to attend and vote at all General Meetings of the Federation. Each Club Rep shall be entitled to one vote per Ordinary Member
Rule 6 (d) (iii)	Hon. Treasurer and Asst. Hon Treasurer: Each individual may serve a maximum accumulative tenure of 4 consecutive years as Hon. Treasurer or the Asst. Hon. Treasurer. The re-appointment to the Hon. Treasurer and Asst. Hon. Treasurer positions can be considered after a lapse of at least 2 years.
Rule 11 (a) (i)	Quorum : The quorum for any General Meeting shall be 50% of the total voting membership.
Rule 11 (b) (i)	Quorum: The Quorum for a Management Committee meeting shall be at least 50% of the Management Committee members.
Rule 12 (a) (i)	Eligibility to Vote: The eligibility to attend, to vote at and to stand for office at General Meetings is provided for in Rule 5. Each Ordinary Member present shall be entitled to one vote through its Club Rep at all General Meetings. In the event of an equality of votes, the Chairman shall have a second and casting vote.

Ordinary members endorsed and approved the amendments at the Annual General Meeting held on 29 September 2017 while formal approval was granted by Registry of Societies in January 2018.

Governance Evaluation Checklist

As an Institution of a Public Character (IPC), the SCF had duly submitted the Online Evaluation Checklist (for the period from 1 Apr 17 to 31 Mar 18) at the Charity Portal. The Period of Approved IPC status granted to SCF is from 1 Dec 2016 to 30 Nov 2019.

OBJECTIVES:

3. The objects of the Federation are:
 - (a) Cycling: To encourage, promote, organize, develop and control the art and pastime of cycling in Singapore.
 - (b) Cyclists: To support and protect the interest of cyclists in Singapore.
 - (c) Bicycle Racing: To control bicycle racing and arrange bicycle race meetings in Singapore, and to give technical advice or other instructions thereon.
 - (d) Representatives: To select competitors to represent Singapore or the Federation.

(e) Prizes etc.: To give prizes, medals and other awards, and to obtain, collect, receive and hold funds and property by subscription, voluntary contributions, gifts or legacies or otherwise, for the objects of the Federation.

(f) Disputes : To settle any dispute that may arise between the members of the Federation and decide all doubtful and disputed points in connection with the sport and the rules and regulations thereof.

(g) Promotion and Funding: To promote and safeguard the interests of the sport, and employ, when necessary, the funds of the Federation for the purpose

(h) Affiliations: To affiliate with the Singapore Sports Council (“SSC”), Singapore National Olympic Council (“SNOC”), the International Cycling Union (Union Cycliste Internationale or “UCI”), BikeTrial International Union (“BIU”), or other international body or bodies whose objects are the same as or similar to those of the Federation.

(i) Competitions: To sponsor, support and/or participate in any national or international cycling races or competitions.

(j) Cycle Titles: To decide on the official recognition of cycling titles established in Singapore.

(k) Misc: Generally to do all such other acts or things as may be incidental to or connected with or conducive to the attainment of any of the above-mentioned objects.

4. As at 31 March 2018, there were 444 SCF individual members and 7 ordinary members (affiliated clubs with voting rights). Of the 444 individual members, 118 were also holders of a UCI licence.

National Championships and Participation Series

14. The SCF entered into a sponsorship agreement with OCBC Bank, valued at \$90,000.00 for one year (Jan to Dec 2017). The sponsorship monies was to be used solely for the purpose of organising local competitions under a title sponsorship arrangement viz. "OCBC Cycle."

15. The SCF collaborated with DirTraction Pte Ltd on the organisation of the National Championships for Road and MTB. These events were held on 7, 21 May and 23 July 2017 and it attracted a total of 484 participants.
16. The SCF was not able to organise a National Championship for BMX because of the lack of a suitable racing site.

OCBC Cycle National Ranking and Points System – MTB and Road

The OCBC Cycle National Ranking and Points System for Road and Mountain Bike events was introduced in 2017, as part of a strategic objective to enhance the vibrancy of the local events eco-system. Points acquired will count towards a National Ranking by the end of the local racing season.

The OCBC Cycle National Ranking and Points System are intended to achieve the following:

- a. Increase opportunities for more winners and reasons to celebrate ;
- b. Encourage participation in multiple events in any one local racing season ;
- c. Complement SCF's existing Athlete Selection Policy and thereby, ensure that the process of athlete selection for overseas competitions and Major Games remains robust and objective.

18. An awards presentation ceremony was held on 8 December 17 at the INFINITI Singapore Showroom, to officially conclude the 2017 Road racing season. The event's Guest of Honour was Ms Koh Ching Ching, Head of Group Corporate Communications, OCBC Bank.

Community Outreach

Events

20. The SCF organised a BMX and MTB Clinic and mini-race on 15 July 2017 at Centaurs Sports Park in Turf City. This was organised in conjunction with the Singapore Youth Olympic Festival, 2017. A total of 30 children and young adults (U-16) participated in the clinic and mini race.

Collaborations

21. The SCF supported students from the Singapore Management University and their Project Bike4Change. The project's mission is on empowering students through the means of bicycles to help them overcome their physical inaccessibility to education. For their 2017 Project, the beneficiary school, Fatima National High School was a public school located in Cortes, Bohol; Philippines. The Project team aimed to reconnect low-income youths to education by biking, simultaneously empowering and inspiring them for the betterment of their livelihoods.
22. Support from SCF included a link-up with Treknology Bikes 3 Pte Ltd and the organisation of a basic bicycle maintenance workshop for Project members as well as the imparting of knowledge on the organisation of a safe cycling programme for beneficiaries in the Philippines and Singapore.

ActiveSG / Sport Singapore (SportSG)

23. The SCF supported the ActiveSG Jurong West Stadium Turns 11 Sports Carnival held on 21 Oct 2017.
24. With the purpose-built "dual use track" in Jurong West Stadium, the intent was to drive further interest in roller sports activities (including cycling) and provide a platform for participants to experience SCF's 'Cycle Safe' programme.
25. Looking ahead, the Jurong West Centre would like to roll out Learn-to-Cycle and/or Cycle Safe Programme in the stadium as part of a School Holiday Programme.
26. The National Resuscitation Council (NRC) together with SportSG, supported by partners from both government and non-government agencies organised the 7th National Life Saving Day (NLSD) on Sunday 4 February 2018 at Sports Hub, OCBC Square. As part of SCF's contribution, a workshop on safe cycling habits and bike

maintenance was conducted.

People's Association and Grassroots Organisations

27. The SCF, in partnership with Soek Seng and the Sengkang West Community Sports Club organised a Chinese New Year "Lo Hei" community ride on 24 Feb 2018. Dr Lam Pin, Senior Minister of State for Health & Transport Grassroots & Adviser to SengKang West was the Guest of Honour.

Charitable Events

Dr Kevin Lee (VP for Leisure) and Mr Steven Lim (VP for Safety/Education) represented the SCF in support of the 7th edition of Ride for Rations. This was a riding event, involving 150 other cyclists, from Malacca to Singapore between 25 and 27 Aug 2017 to raise funds to:

- monthly food rations to 380 needy households in rental flats and who are registered with outreach Sunlove Abode at Chai Chee, Hougang and Marsiling;
- Monthly breakfast package to 200 school going children living in the above areas and other estates through Sunlove.

On 9 March 2018, the SCF participated in the Tan Tock Seng Hospital (TTSH) Charity Ride which was flagged off from Novena Square. The objective of the ride was to raise at least \$100,000 for the community which require support for out-of-pocket medical expenses when patients are discharged for e.g. on wheelchairs, oxygen concentrators to help patients breathe, milk feeds or even adult diapers etc.

Events Sanctioned/Supported

OCBC Cycle Singapore

28. The SCF continued to sanction the OCBC Cycle Singapore event held on 18 November 2017. A national team comprising Gabriel Tan, Luqmanul Hakim, Junaidi Hashim, Lukman in the OCBC Cycle SEAsian Championship event and came in 4th out of eight competing nations.

29. Over two days, OCBC Cycle Singapore saw a total of 6,500 participants.

Women's Weekend Cycling Clinic

30. With the availability of the Jurong / Jurong West Stadium, SCF was able to conduct beginner level cycling activities. The Women's Weekend Cycling Clinic, organised on 28 Oct 2017, in collaboration with Cycosports Pte Ltd and Fahrenheit Performance served as the kick-off event in the Stadium. This event attracted 41 participants and was intended to introduce beginner and intermediate level cyclists to the fundamentals of bike handling during in a competitive setting.

Singapore Cyclocross

Certification, Technical Courses and Continuing Education (CE)

48. Separately, Mr Max Mager, a Singaporean International Technical Official (ITO) conducted a Level 2 (MTB) Commissaires' Course from 16 to 20 Aug 2017. Of the 16 participants (including 6 from Japan, 2 from Indonesia and 1 from Thailand), 15 successfully completed the course.
49. On the recommendation of the SCF's Technical and Commissaires' Commission, the SCF nominated Faisal Meskam for the UCI Elite National Commissaires' Course for MTB. This course was held in Japan from 21 to 25 Nov 2017 (MTB) and which Faisal completed successfully.

Mechanics' Course

50. The UCI Level 1 Mechanics' Course was held from 9 to 13 Oct 2017 at Kampong Ubi Community Club. This course was conducted by UCI's Mr Jean-Louis Guihard Thebault and it involved 10 participants.

Facilities

51. With the availability of the Jurong West Stadium, SCF was able to conduct beginner level cycling activities. The Women's Weekend Cycling Clinic, organised on 28 Oct 2017, in collaboration with Cycosports Pte Ltd served as the kick-off event.

REVIEW OF FINANCIAL STATE AND EXPLANATION OF MAJOR FINANCIAL TRANSACTIONS

54. Sport Singapore approved a total of \$473,842.20 for FY 17 (including \$40,000 in the form of a matching grant) and, a further \$142,485.71 in the form of direct athlete funds and a spexScholarship grant.
55. The Secretariat ensured that funds were utilised for its intended purposes and provided quarterly reports to Sport Singapore on this.
56. Audit Alliance was responsible for auditing SCF's accounts for FY17. As at 31 March 2018, the SCF's was in a favourable position with accumulated funds totalling \$223,461.99. Apart from funding received from Sport Singapore, the SCF managed to generate additional income from events sanctioned and


