The Management Committee shall use reasonable endeavours to process all membership applications within 3 months of receipt of such application. The Management Committee shall accept the applications which have complied with the membership subscription procedures set out in Rule 4 of the SCF Constitution and shall have the right to reject applications based on defensible reasons with supporting documentation.

Governance Evaluation Checklist

As an Institution of a Public Character (IPC), the SCF had duly submitted the Online Evaluation Checklist (for the period from 1 Apr 19 to 31 Mar 20) at the Charity Portal. The Period of Approved IPC status granted to SCF is from 1 Nov 2019 to 30 Dec 2022.

OBJECTIVES:

3. The objects of the Federation are:
 - a) Cycling: To encourage, promote, organize, develop and control the art and pastime of cycling in Singapore.
 - (b) Cyclists: To support and protect the interest of cyclists in Singapore.

(c) Bicycle Racing: To control bicycle racing and arrange bicycle race meetings in Singapore, and to give technical advice or other instructions thereon.

(d) Representatives: To select competitors to represent Singapore or the Federation.

(e) Prizes etc.: To give prizes, medals and other awards, and to obtain, collect, receive and hold funds and property by subscription, voluntary contributions, gifts or legacies or otherwise, for the objects of the Federation.

(f) Disputes :. Any dispute arising amongst Members or between any Member and the Federation shall be resolved in accordance with the Framework for Alternative Dispute Resolution for Sports (ADR Sports) or other dispute resolution framework jointly administered for the time being by Sports Singapore, the Singapore Mediation Centre and the Singapore Institute of Arbitrators.

(g) Promotion and Funding: To promote and safeguard the interests of the sport, and employ, when necessary, the funds of the Federation for the purpose. To also increase participation and promote community engagement and bonding through the sport of Cycling, in order to promote health and wellness, inclusiveness and integration, and inspire the Singapore Spirit.

(h) Affiliations: To affiliate with the Singapore Sports Council (“SSC”), Singapore National Olympic Council (“SNOC”), the International Cycling Union (Union Cycliste Internationale or “UCI”), BikeTrial International Union (“BIU”), the Asean Cycling Association (ACA), the Asian Cycling Confederation (ACC) or other international body or bodies whose objects are the same as or similar to those of the Federation.

(i) Competitions: To sponsor, support and/or participate in any national or international cycling races or competitions.

(j) Cycle Titles: To decide on the official recognition of cycling titles established in Singapore.

(k) Anti-Doping: The Federation shall recognise the right of all its athletes to participate in clean sport and is committed to ensuring the sport is doping-free. All affiliates, members, athletes, participants, staff and other individuals, who are subject to the jurisdiction of the Federation are bound by and agree to abide by all World Anti-Doping Code-compliant anti-doping rules applicable to the sport.

(l) Misc: Generally to do all such other acts or things as may be incidental to or connected with or conducive to the attainment of any of the above-mentioned objects.

The Management Committee shall determine the Mission, programmes and activities of the Federation for the period prescribed by SSC, and shall ensure that they are consistent with the abovementioned objects of the Federation.

National Championships and Participation Series

14. The SCF entered into a sponsorship agreement with OCBC Bank, valued at \$90,000.00 for one year (Jan to Dec 2019). The sponsorship monies was to be used solely for the purpose of organising local competitions under a title sponsorship arrangement viz. "OCBC Cycle."
15. The SCF collaborated with Cycosports Pte Ltd on the organisation of the National Championships for Road (Team Time Trial, Individual Time Trial, Road Race) and Mountainbike (Downhill and Cross Country). OCBC Cycle National Ranking and Points System – MTB and Road

The OCBC Cycle National Ranking and Points System for Road and Mountain Bike events was introduced in 2017, as part of a strategic objective to enhance the vibrancy of the local events eco-system. Points acquired will count towards a National Ranking by the end of the local racing season.

The OCBC Cycle National Ranking and Points System are intended to achieve the following:

- a. Increase opportunities for more winners and reasons to celebrate ;
- b. Encourage participation in multiple events in any one local racing season ;
- c. Complement SCF's existing Athlete Selection Policy and thereby, ensure that the process of athlete selection for overseas competitions and Major Games remains robust and objective.

17. An awards presentation ceremony was held on 22 Nov 2019 at the Shimano Cycling World, to officially conclude the 2019 racing season.

REVIEW OF FINANCIAL STATE AND EXPLANATION OF MAJOR FINANCIAL TRANSACTIONS

52. Sport Singapore approved a total of \$725,095.53 for FY 19 (including \$33,900.00 in the form of a matching grant) and, a further \$248,293.49 in the form of direct athlete funds, spexScholarship grant and SEA Games Campaign.
53. The Secretariat ensured that funds were utilised for its intended purposes and provided half-yearly reports to Sport Singapore on this.
54. S B Tan PAC was responsible for auditing SCF’s accounts for FY19. As at 31 March 2020, the SCF’s was in a favourable position with accumulated reserves totalling \$384,611.97 (\$273,671.16 unrestricted reserves and \$110,940.81 restricted reserves). Apart from funding received from Sport Singapore, the SCF managed to generate additional income from events organised, through the Cycle Safe Accredited training partner arrangement and licences/membership fees. Details as follows:

58. On a quarterly basis (i.e. Management Committee meetings), the SCF MC reviews the amount of reserves that are required to ensure that they are adequate to fulfil our continuing obligations, provide financial stability and the means for the development of our principal activity. In FY 19, the SCF had set aside \$46,930.81 as restricted funds. This amount was obtained through a Sport Singapore matching grant scheme - "One Team Singapore Fund." The amount was set aside primarily to defray costs (high performance specific programmes and initiatives) to be incurred on the Road, Track, BMX and MTB National Training Squads in preparation for and participation in regional and international competitions and equipment/apparel purchases.

59. In order to also ensure that our reserves are adequate to fulfil our continuing obligations, the SCF will set aside at least six months of reserves for expenditure on rental, office operations and staff salaries.

FUTURE PLANS

Local events

60. The SCF will be working in collaboration with two local events management companies for the organisation of the OCBC Cycle National Road and MTB Championships in 2020. At the same time, local series-type events are also being planned, pending the amount of sponsorship monies that can be raised to defray event organising costs – this includes an Urban MTB cross country eliminator series.

61. The SCF will be sanctioning the OCBC Cycle Singapore (Club and SEAsian Championship) scheduled to be held on 9 May 2020.

ProCyclingSG (Singapore Professional Cycling Academy)

62. The SCF launched ProCyclingSG at the OCBC Lounge, Singapore Sports Hub on 14 Feb 2020. ProCyclingSG is a high-performance training initiative by the Singapore Cycling Federation (SCF) to groom high-performance national athletes in Singapore. It aims to create prospects for talented cyclists by providing a world class daily training environment, exposing them to international racing and nurturing committed athletes. ProCyclingSG will comprise a squad of full-time cyclists consisting of semi-pro and development riders who will be contracted to race around the region.
