Dear Commissaires

NOTIFICATION TO COMMISSAIRES -RECENT DEVELOPMENTS

1 We are pleased to inform you that the Commissaires and Technical Commission was formally established on 20 Jan 2017. The Commission is headed by Mr Max Mager, a qualified UCI Commissaire (International Technical Official) in BMX and MTB after successfully completing a UCI Course in 2005 and a Commissaire for Road and Track at the National/Continental level. He has also held the appointment of Race/Event Director at many local, regional and international competitions. Among the key highlights of his illustrious association with the sport includes,

- a) ITO (UCI Commissaire) at the 2012 London Olympics, World MTB Championship in 2012 in Austria and Asian Games in 2014
- b) President of the Commissaires' Panel (PCP) at the 2nd Youth Olympic Games in 2014, the UCI MTB World Cup in in Australia and the 2015 UCI BMX World Championship in Argentina
- c) Competition Manager of the 1st Youth Olympic Games, held in Singapore in 2010

2 In consultation with the Commissaires and Technical Commission, please take note and adhere to the following, should you wish to remain as an active Commissaire:

- a) Your Commissaire's Logbook should be signed-off by the PCP of the event that you have been appointed to officiate in. For the verification of your appointment in events in 2016 and earlier, please contact SCF's Ms Geraldine Mok at 67846621 or sportdev@cycling.org.sg.
- b) Commissaires are required to be members of the SCF at an annual membership fee of \$\$30 (to be renewed annually). You will be issued with a Commissaires' licence and this will be used for verification purposes when you are appointed to officiate at local competitions. Please go to <u>https://regonline.activeglobal.com/Register/Checkin.aspx?EventID=1894134</u> to apply for your licence.
- c) All Level 1 Commissaires who successfully completed the course in 2016 and current Level 2 MTB and BMX Commissaires can register for the Level 2 Road Commissaires'Course scheduled to be held in May 2017. The SCF will not be imposing any pre-requisites but those of you who have been actively officiating at local events will be better positioned to benefit and progress on to become a Level 2 National Commissaire.

Do submit your applications early as we would need to finalize the travel arrangements for an overseas instructor. Level 2 course materials will be sent to registrants, prior to the commencement of course and upon finalisation of the list of participants.
