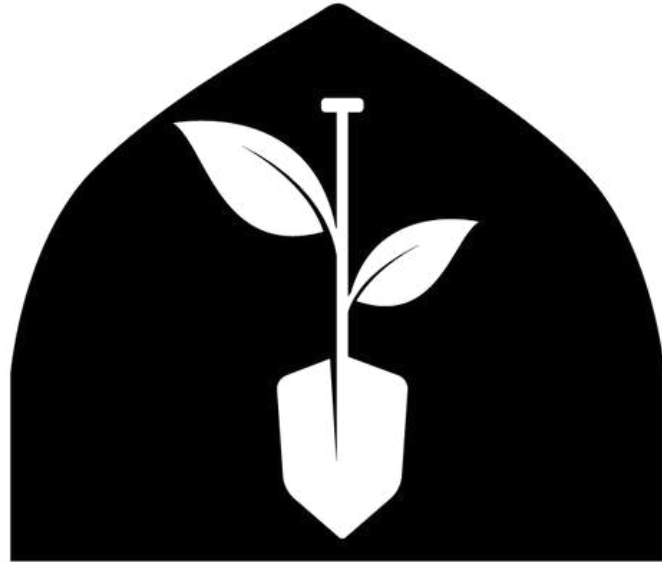

Greens Varieties

Astro Arugula

Early, heat tolerant.

A selection of standard arugula. Leaves are less deeply lobed and exhibit a more strap-leaf shape.

- Edible Flowers: Harvest the white flowers with dark-pink veins as they appear. Sprinkle them over salads or add to vegetable stir-fries. Flavor is spicy and nutty. Popular choice for brightening up salad mixes.

Prize Bok Choy

Elegant vase-like shape, medium thick white stems and smooth, mild flavor.

The best open-pollinated full sized pac choy we have seen in our trials! Prefers cool weather, but is slow to bolt in heat. We have hand-selected our strain for uniformity, vigor and bolt resistance. For early spring or fall planting. 14,000 seeds/oz.

Green Wave Mustard Greens



Bright green, broad leaves with a tightly scalloped margin and hot, mustardy flavor. Plant densely so leaves remain a proper size for baby leaf and petioles elongate for easy harvest. AAS winner. USDA Certified Organic.

Ruby Streaks Mustard Greens

Intricately lobed dark green and maroon leaves.

Fine, deeply incised leaves. The color ranges from dark green with red veins to dark maroon, with the maroon color darker when grown without row cover and in cooler weather. The flavor is mild and slightly pungent.

Miz America Mustard Greens



Exceptionally dark red, deeply lobed leaves.

Delicate, toothed leaves are dark red on both sides for a striking addition to salad mixes. Uniform leaf size and shape, with a mild flavor.

Champion Collards



Selected to hold in the field up to two weeks longer than other varieties for an extended harvest.

Rich blue-green cabbage-like leaves. Plants are bolt resistant, productive and hardy. Waxy leaf surface provides natural protection from cabbage worms.

Winterbor Kale

Standard green curly kale.

Redbor Kale



Frilly deep purple-red leaves.

Similar to Winterbor in everything but color. For garnishing and eating. Flavor, color, and curling are enhanced by cold weather.

Black Magic Kale

Highly uniform for full-size production.

Black Magic is a well-maintained selection of Toscano kale with long, narrow leaves for attractive and tall, straight bunches. Dark blue-green leaves with beautiful savoy. Lacinato or "dinosaur" type kale.

Red Russian Kale



Smooth, green, purple-veined leaves for baby leaf and bunching.

Stems are purple; leaves are flat and toothed with purple veins. Mature plants are medium-tall and leaves are tender compared to other kales. For salads and light cooking.

Coastal Star Romaine

A longtime favorite.

The large, heavy heads are dark green. Heat tolerant. Suitable for marketing as full heads or romaine hearts. Good, sweet flavor. Utility Patent granted. Intermediate resistance to corky root. MTO-30. Also available with NOP-compliant pelleting. USDA Certified Organic.

Gem Lettuce



Three irresistible mini bibb varieties for home and market gardens.

All three varieties form uniform and dense, “true mini” heads, meaning they fill out and are nicely proportional at the mini stage. They also span a range of colors that create a dynamic contrast when combined. Bibb lettuces are known for their excellent eating quality, and these varieties are no exception, each possessing exceptionally sweet flavor and tender texture.

Muir Head Lettuce



The most heat tolerant lettuce. Organic seed.

Muir is an extremely heat tolerant variety and was the slowest to bolt in our summer trials. Technically a Batavian type, the light green, extra-wavy leaves form dense heads at a small size and can be harvested as a mini or left to bulk up into large, heavy, full-size heads. The leaves are crisp and have excellent flavor. Suitable for hydroponic systems.

Cherokee Head Lettuce

Dark red leaves for mini-head or full-size production.

Thick, crisp, dark red leaves with good flavor. Similar appearance to Magenta except much darker red color, though not quite as sweet. Very slow bolting with excellent tolerance to heat and bottom rot. High resistance to downy mildew races EU 16, 21, 23, 32; US 5-6.

Bloomsdale Spinach



Open-pollinated savoy for spring and fall.

Medium-dark green leaves on upright plants make Bloomsdale easy to harvest. Heavily savoyed. Suited for early spring and fall plantings as it is fast growing. For full size and bunching. Great flavor.

Space Spinach

Tried-and-true variety for all seasons.

Fast growing, medium-green leaves are smooth to slightly savoyed. High resistance to downy mildew

Bright Lights Chard

The gold standard for multicolored Swiss chard.

Nicely savoyed and glossy green or bronze leaves with stems of many colors including gold, pink, orange, purple, red, and white with bright, pastel, and multicolored variations. The flavor is milder than ordinary chard, with each color a bit different. Direct seed or grow from transplant which allows separating out the individual colors. Consistent growth rate, leaf shape and texture, and strong bolt resistance across all colors makes this a superior mix. Suitable for production year-round, but somewhat less frost hardy than other chards. AAS winner.

Pea & Bean Varities



Provider Beans



Earliest to market.

Provider can be planted earlier than other beans because it germinates well in cool soils. Compact plants are easy to grow and adaptable to diverse soil and climate conditions. Produces 5-5 1/2" fleshy round pod green beans. High resistance to bean mosaic virus and powdery mildew. Purple seeds. Bush bean. USDA Certified Organic.

Seychelles is an All-America Selections winner with plenty to offer pole bean-lovers: vigorous plants produce dark green, round pods that drop in clusters of six on a loose hanging truss for an easy and continuous harvest. Great flavor and all-around high performance won our hearts. Vines will reach 5' tall and require initial training to climb a trellis.

H-19 Little Leaf

Reliable yields on a uniquely compact plant. Blocky, medium-length (3–5") fruits are good for fresh eating. They pickle well and have a distinctive, bright emerald green color. Vines are compact, multibranching, and yield well even under stress. Half normal-sized leaves. White spines. Parthenocarpic. High resistance to anthracnose, angular leaf spot, bacterial wilt, and scab; and intermediate resistance to cucumber mosaic virus and powdery mildew. USDA Certified Organic.

- Marketmore 76 remains the most widely-planted open-pollinated slicer in the US!

Resistance includes anthracnose, scab, and cucumber mosaic virus. The vigorous plants offer multiple picks, and the gynoecious fruiting quality offers greater yield potential because of the increased percentage of female flowers.

Mexican Sour Gherkin



- A unique specialty cucumber.
- Cute, 1" long fruits look like miniature watermelons and taste like cucumbers with tangy citrus overtones. Vines start growing slowly but can get up to 10' long. Can be eaten fresh or pickled. Fruits can be sold in half-pint or clamshell containers at markets that appreciate novelty. Also known as the Cucamelon and mouse melon. Not particularly high yielding. Trellising recommended. NOTE: We recommend harvesting these cucumbers promptly as they tend to get seedy if allowed to grow longer than 1"

Zucchini Varieties



Y Star Patty Pan

Yellow organic patty pan.

Prolific yielder of shiny, yellow, scalloped squash fruits, with light green on the blossom end. Amount of green may vary depending on the level of heat and plant stress. Widely adaptable. Open plant for easy harvest. USDA Certified Organic.

Yellowfin

Organic yellow zucchini with powdery mildew resistance.

Uniform, cylindrical fruits; attractive golden-yellow color. Semi-open plants with moderate spines. Intermediate resistance to cucumber mosaic virus and powdery mildew. USDA Certified Organic.

Italian heirloom with tender, gray-green skin and prominent ribbing that give this variety a distinctive appearance. Pick at 6" or smaller and fry whole with the flower still attached.

Zephyr



Unique appearance and great flavor. Distinctive, slender fruits are yellow with faint white stripes and light-green blossom ends. Harvest young at 4-6" for unusually delicious, nutty flavor and firm texture. Vigorous, high-yielding plants. NOTE: Under certain stressful situations, such as hot weather, Zephyr fruits can show some variability in the amount of green at the blossom ends. In addition, sometimes the first one or two fruits produced can be green-striped.

- Edible Flowers: Blossoms bear a mild, squash-like flavor and are great stuffed and fried, or sliced for use in soups, omelets, salads, and pasta dishes.

Typically 30 lb. or more, well ribbed, with thick, medium length handle with an upright shape. Vigorous medium vines. Our thanks to the University of New Hampshire for working with us to develop this variety.

A reliable producer in an essential size class (medium-large, 40–50 bin count).

Just right for single servings when halved. Worthy of marketing by name. Semibush plant. Bred by Dr. Brent Loy at UNH to fulfill his career-long ambition to improve acorn squash flavor. Intermediate resistance to powdery mildew.

Waltham Butternut

Still the benchmark for large butternuts.

Larger fruits with small seed cavities and thick, straight, cylindrical necks. Flesh has smooth texture and sweet flavor, particularly after 2 months of storage. This 1970 All-America Selections winner from Massachusetts is still deservedly the most widely grown, full-size OP butternut.

Bush Delicata



Compact, tidy plants with sweet, oblong fruits.

Delicious smooth, nutty flesh with hints of butter and brown sugar. Skin starts creamy white with green stripes and flecks, curing to striped light yellow. Compact plants spread only 4-6 feet. All-America Selection (AAS) winner bred by Molly Jahn and George Moriarty at Cornell University.

Delectable squash is smaller than Ponca with more uniform butternut shape. Green unripe fruits; early planting is recommended for tan color. Field resistance to powdery mildew. Developed by the Vegetable Breeding Institute at Cornell University.

Golden Acre Cabbage

A refined, open-pollinated cabbage with round green heads encasing beautiful, tender white hearts.

Plants mature early and are compact, perfect for dense plantings with tighter spacing while still producing good yields of marketable heads. Heads are round, solid, and have a delicate, crunchy flavor that is suitable for most kitchen preparations. When cooked, the spicy cabbage flavor becomes mild and buttery. An excellent OP for the serious cabbage grower.

Amarant Red Cabbage



Strikingly beautiful red coloration on compact heads with good crunch, sweet flavor and juicy texture.

Short stems and highly flattened outermost leaves make heads visible and easy to harvest. Tolerance to heat allows for early and main season growing. Darker purple interior than Red Express. This open pollinated variety is bred by Kultursaat biodynamic seed initiative in Germany.

Lavender Cauliflower

Well-domed, violet heads.

Attractive, bright purple florets make Lavender a great choice for dipping platters. Stems are a beautiful medium-purple in fall, paler in spring. Compared to Graffiti, heads are a much brighter violet-purple and have a slightly larger dome. Performs best for fall crops but may also be grown successfully for summer crops.

Puntoverde Romanesco



Hybrid, specialty. Attractive, high-quality heads for summer or fall harvest. Produces excellent fall crops and, unlike other romanesco types, produces very good summer crops in areas without extreme summer heat. Also suitable for winter or early spring production in areas with mild winters. Strong, rugged plants. Outperforms typical romanesco types under stressful weather conditions.

Snow Crown Cauliflower

This hybrid shows unusual seedling vigor. Good quality, medium-size heads whether harvested in summer or fall. Good tolerance to moderate fall frost (25–32°F/-4–0°C). AAS winner. NOTE: When grown under fertility or moisture stress all cauliflower, but particularly Snow Crown, can show a purplish coloration on the undersides of the heads.

Improved Black Italian type.

Traditional appearance with modern advantages. Spineless plant reliably sets fruit under variable conditions. Heavy yields. An earlier, improved eggplant over Nadia. Green calyx.

Annina Eggplant

Prolific yields of lovely striped fruit on upright, spineless plants.

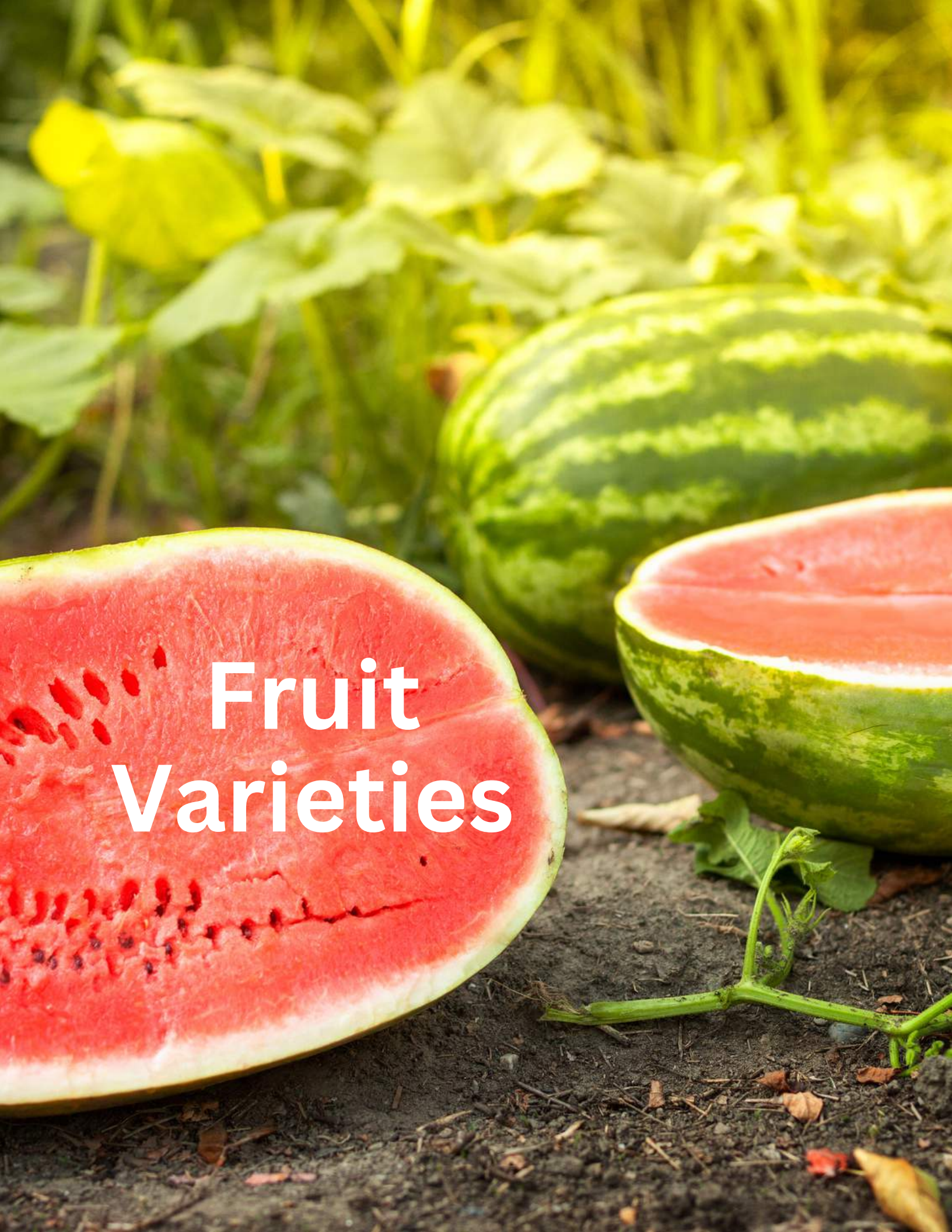
Walla Walla Sweet Onion
