THE ART AND ICONOGRAPHY OF ST. GEORGE, ENGLAND'S PATRON SAINT

The Friends of Gloucester Cathedral are hosting this fundraising talk on Wednesday, 5 October, starting at 2pm in the Lady Chapel of the Cathedral. The publicity says:

"St George is perhaps unique both in the enduring popularity of his cult and in the widespread devotion to the saint around the world, from England in the west to India in the east, from the Baltic states in the north to Ethiopia in the south. This talk will explore the origins of the cult of St George in the Byzantine Empire and its spread across Europe. The Normans adopted him as the patron of the new form of mounted warfare and, thanks to his saving the First Crusade from disaster with his miraculous appearances in support of the Norman knights, kings and princes across Europe also adopted him. The talk will explore his emergence as the patron of England, then follow saint transformation from warrior to courtly hero in Renaissance art and thence into the gentleman knight of the British Empire. The talk will conclude with a look at the contemporary interest in St George as part of a resurgence of English national identity."


