# THE GARTER CEREMONY at WINDSOR CASTLE - Monday, 19 June

Every June the Knights of the Garter (there are never more than 24) gather at Windsor Castle where new Knights take the oath and are invested with the insignia. After lunch the Knights process to St. George's Chapel.

A limited number of tickets (no charge) are available by ballot for members of the public who would like to stand inside the precincts of Windsor Castle and watch that procession.

As this year's ceremony will be the first presided over by King Charles, the Branch has applied to be included in the ballot for tickets. We may not be successful, but it would be helpful to know how many members would be interested if we were. As tickets are allocated in small numbers it would probably be a case of co-ordinating transport between car drivers; possibly a minibus or small coach could be considered if people without tickets for the procession would like to come to spend the day in Windsor.
