The crested looking-glass above the Pompadour fireplace in Philippe Grand and Jean-Pierre Ollier's salon reflects their fondness for Rococo (page 142). Admire its likeness - and your own – in the form of this 19th-century overmantel (£1,690) from the French Antique Company. Visit frenchantiquecompany.com.

2 The two gentlemen of Montmartre are huge Madonna fans – that's the Virgin, not the artiste - as you will gather from the contents of their cloches (page 142). Well, praise be to Re for selling this plaster statue (from £54) in six serene shades and these divine 'Shola' baubles (from £1.95), should you want to accessorise Our Lady of Nice Necklaces in like fashion. 3 If you worry that there's something a bit school staffroom about a mid-century armless chair, banish those misgivings tout de *suite*! Two lettuce-green examples in the Paris apartment (page 142) help dispel such associations. Alas, the Florence Knoll original on which they are based is no longer in production, but 'Major' by Mitchell Gold and Bob Williams (shown in verde performance velvet) is a worthy substitute. 4 Did you clock the dinky opaline globes orbiting Arthur Mitchell's studio like minor planets (page 102)? Us too! On a mission to find such a system for an un-astronomical sum we landed on these in glass and porcelain from Trainspotters. They're 20cm in diameter and £144 each. > 5 There was never a dull moment in the kitchen of the bohemian Chelsea residence (page 105), thanks to ultra-bright walls that glow as if someone forgot to switch off the sun. If you too like paint that packs a punch say hello to 'English Yellow' by Annie Sloan (£41.95 for 2.5 litres). Ring 01865 770061, or visit anniesloan.com.

> O The Mallord Street house was so cold in winter its owners would flock like migratory birds from the upper floors to warmer climes - the drawing room. Suffice to say, they really needed their classic eiderdowns


