WHAT TO EXPECT WHEN YOU ARE EXPECTING... A WALL BED

YOUR ORDER IS IN PRODUCTION-IT'S TIME TO PREPARE THE SPACE.

Every project is different. While you may not need to consider everything here, if you do need to make any modifications to the space before installation, make sure it is complete before delivery day. Some things you may need to consider:



Contractor

If your project requires any modification to the space before your wall bed is installed, this is the time to get bids and select the right professional for your job. We can provide your contractor with assembly instructions, and we are always available to support your contractor throughout the process.

Flooring

Ensure that your floor is ready for your installation. Complete any refinishing of existing floors or installation of new flooring well ahead of time.

Area Rugs

Three of our wall bed models have special instructions regarding the placement of area rugs directly in front of the wall bed. If you have any questions or concerns about area rug placement, your Sales & Design Consultant can help.

- Oslo and Tango Area rugs must be placed underneath the sofa seat wheels, ideally during the installation, as it can be difficult to insert area rugs under the sofa seat after installation.
- LGM this model cannot be installed on carpeting, as the LGM rotating mechanism requires a hard floor surface to operate correctly and safely. If using an area rug, the rug should be placed a minimum of 18" from the front edge of the LGM.

Baseboards

If you want the furniture to be flush against the wall, you will need to remove any existing baseboards. You should discuss this with your contractor ahead of time.

Wall Material and Construction

It is important to confirm the wall material and construction (drywall, plaster, concrete, etc.) to determine whether you will need any blocking in your walls, and to ensure that the contractor uses the correct wall fasteners for your situation.

Certain wall bed models, such as the Ulisse and Penelope 2 (plain) almost always require blocking in the wall to ensure the safest installation.

Electric

If there are outlets or switches that will be covered by the furniture, this is the time to decide if you will be moving them, removing them, or covering them. If you will be making any changes, a licensed electrician will ensure that all local building codes are followed.

Painting

Ensure that any painting, especially directly surrounding the installation area, is complete before your delivery and installation.

Confirm Access to the Site

Confirm that there is clear access the entire way from the street to the installation site. If you think there may be issues, please let us know.
