In this delightful nonsense poem, **ASHLEY FAYTH** introduces readers to a range of “wild and wondrous” beasts—like the sniger, the floose, the squiffin, and the butterflabbit. With its playful rhymes and rollicking rhythm, this book is a perfect read-aloud. Yet even in its silliest moments, *The Sniger and the Floose* is a gentle reminder to respect and preserve the beauty of the natural world around us, and a joyous celebration of imagination.

ASHLEY FAYTH is an award-winning singer/songwriter and children’s author from Random Island, Newfoundland. Her debut children’s book, *Blueberry Bay*, was showcased as part of Canada’s Department of Fisheries and Ocean’s World Oceans Day, and explores the impact of plastic pollution on marine wildlife. She lives with her husband and pint-sized daughter in Chester, England, where in-between playgroups and endless loads of laundry, she is working on a new collection of seasonal songs for children (and their grown-ups).

An author-illustrator based in Kettering, Northamptonshire, England, **KATIE BROSNAN** received a Master’s Degree in Children’s Book Illustration (with distinction) from the Cambridge School of Art. She has written and/or illustrated several books, including the acclaimed *Keith Among the Pigeons* (longlisted for the 2020 Klaus Flugge Prize) and *Gut Garden* (winner of the 2020 North Somerset Teachers’ Book Award—Information Book category; longlisted for the 2020 SLA Information Book Award). Her illustrations feature in Andy Jones’s hilarious *Barefoot Helen and the Giants* (see page 22 of this catalogue).

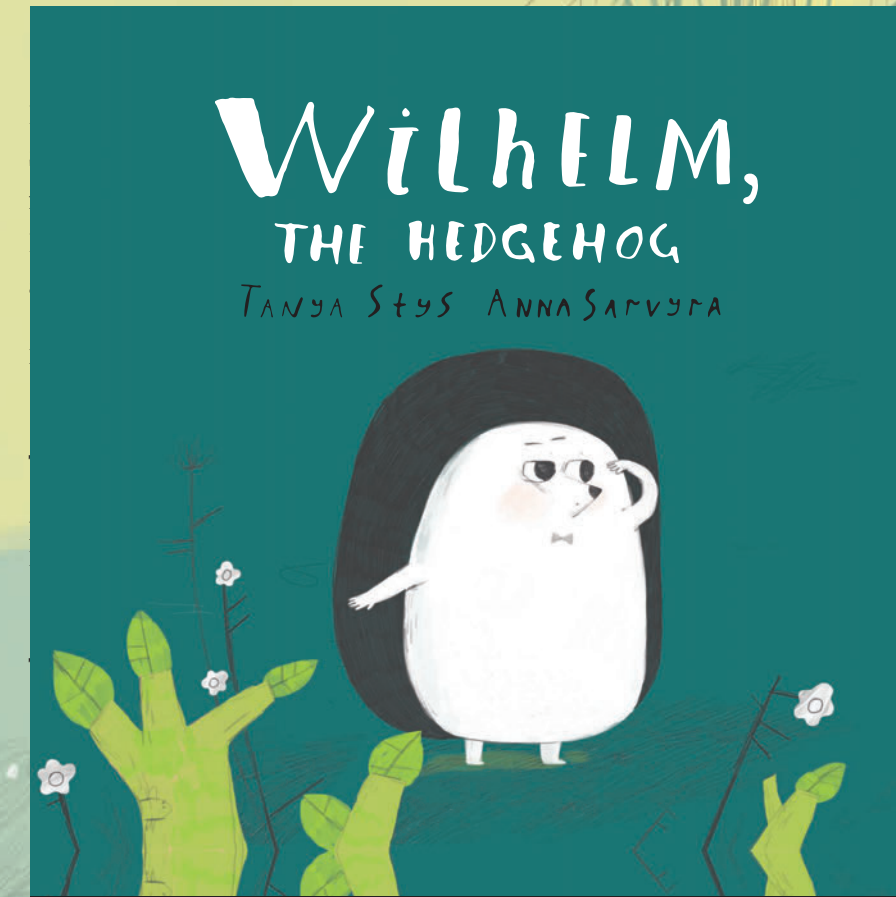

Wilhelm is a hedgehog who lives in a park in the city. Unlike most hedgehogs who sleep in the day and eat and explore in the evening, Wilhelm is curious and wants to know a bit more about the daytime world—especially about Light and the sun. His friends try to dissuade him, but eventually realize that Wilhelm won't be convinced to behave like a "normal" hedgehog. So instead they work together to help him achieve his dream.

A charming tale about being yourself, following your dreams, and about the friends who help you, *Wilhelm the Hedgehog* was originally published in Ukraine in 2017. It celebrates creativity, inspiration, and community.

TANYA STUS is a child psychologist and an author of about two dozen fiction and educational books for children and adolescents. Born into a "teacher's dynasty" with almost 400 years of combined pedagogical experience, she is the Head of the Children's Reading Laboratory of the National Academy of Sciences of Ukraine, founder of its "BaraBooka: The space of the Ukrainian children's book", and editor-in-chief of the children's publishing house Small Academy. As well, she is the author of creative writing programs for children and adolescents, and a public activist for the promotion of children's and adolescent reading and the reform of school literary education.

An illustrator from Kyiv and co-founder of the Pictoric Illustrators Club, **ANNA SARVIRA** has been interested in books and their design since childhood. What began as a childhood passion has become her profession. A graduate of Ukraine's National Academy of Fine Arts and Architecture, she collaborates with many Ukrainian publishers and children's magazines. She has taken part in many exhibitions in Ukraine and abroad; in early 2022 the Museum of Modern Art (NY) featured her graphic artwork on daily life in Ukraine just before Russia's invasion. Her work has been awarded the COW (Centre of the World) International Prize and the Joseph Binder Award.

An island off the coast of another island is home to a small community; life is rich with joy and challenges, and the people who live there love their island home. One day they learn that the government will move them off the island, to new homes with modern conveniences like electricity. Life will be easier, but will it be better?

In gentle and spare prose, and with her unique folk-art illustrations, Lori Doody tells the story of resettlement in Newfoundland—it is a deeply personal tale, but it is also the story of anyone who must leave a loved home to start anew and who carries their old home in their heart.

A printmaker by training, **LORI DOODY** is the author/illustrator of several widely praised picture books that combine bright, simple illustrations with witty, spare stories; these include including *Capelin Weather*; *The Puffin Problem*; *Mallard, Mallard, Moose*; *Paint the Town Pink*; *Catalina*; and the Mr. Beagle series. Two have been included in the Canadian Children's Book Centre's *Best Books for Kids & Teens*; one named an Ontario Library Association "Top Ten Best Bet"; one named a finalist in the Next Generation Indie Book Awards Illustrated Picture Book category; and three shortlisted for the NL Book Award for Children's/Young Adult Literature.

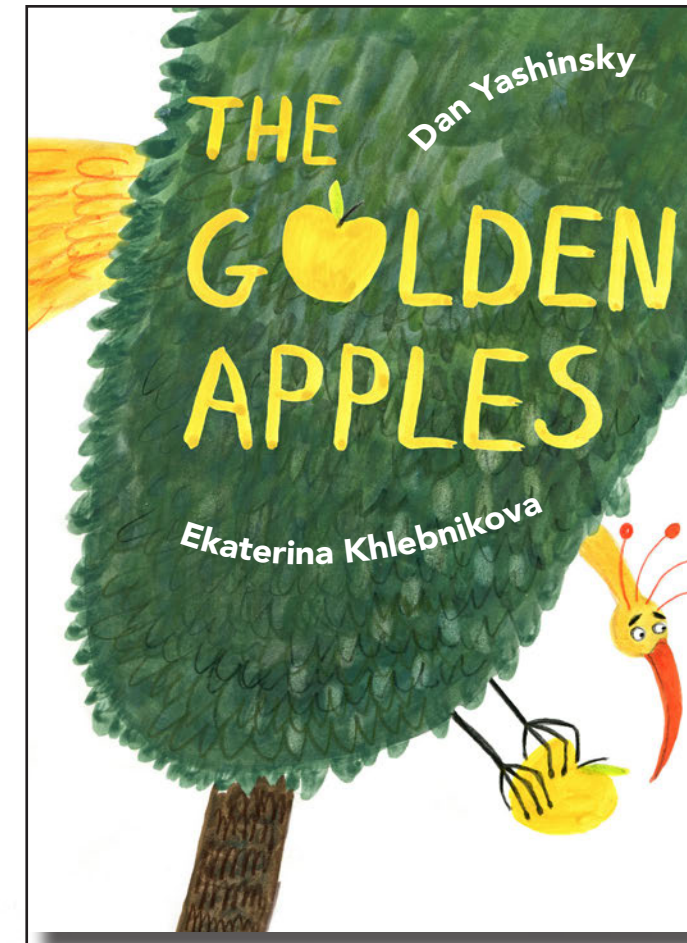

Ekaterina Khlebnikova's brilliant illustrations blend old and new creating a gorgeous visual world; a perfect complement to Yashinsky's re-telling. Together they serve up a book that will delight readers and listeners of all ages.




DAN YASHINSKY has been telling stories for more than forty years. The founder of the Toronto Storytelling Festival and the co-founder of Storytelling Toronto, he has shared his stories across the world—at festivals, in schools and hospitals, in theatres and community spaces.





His work in schools includes creating the Telling Bee, a story-based curriculum project that has taken place in more than forty Ontario schools. He is the editor of four acclaimed folk tale collections, and the author of several books including *Tales for an Unknown City*, which received the Toronto Book Award, and *Suddenly They Heard Footsteps: Storytelling for the Twenty-first Century*. He lives in Toronto.


Raised in a family of book lovers, **EKATERINA KHLEBNIKOVA** dreamt of being an illustrator or artist from a very young age. A graduate of the Moscow State University Ivan Fedorov, Faculty of Graphic Arts, she is a member of the Moscow Union of Artists (Department of Prints). She has participated in numerous exhibitions, both in Russia and elsewhere, and is a winner at Moscow's International Festival of Book Illustration and Visual Literature (MORS). She has created artwork for books published in Russia, China, Serbia, and now Canada.

 The author is an acclaimed storyteller, author, and community organizer, who received the first Jane Jacobs Prize in acknowledgement of his contributions as a storyteller to enhance the cultural life of Toronto.

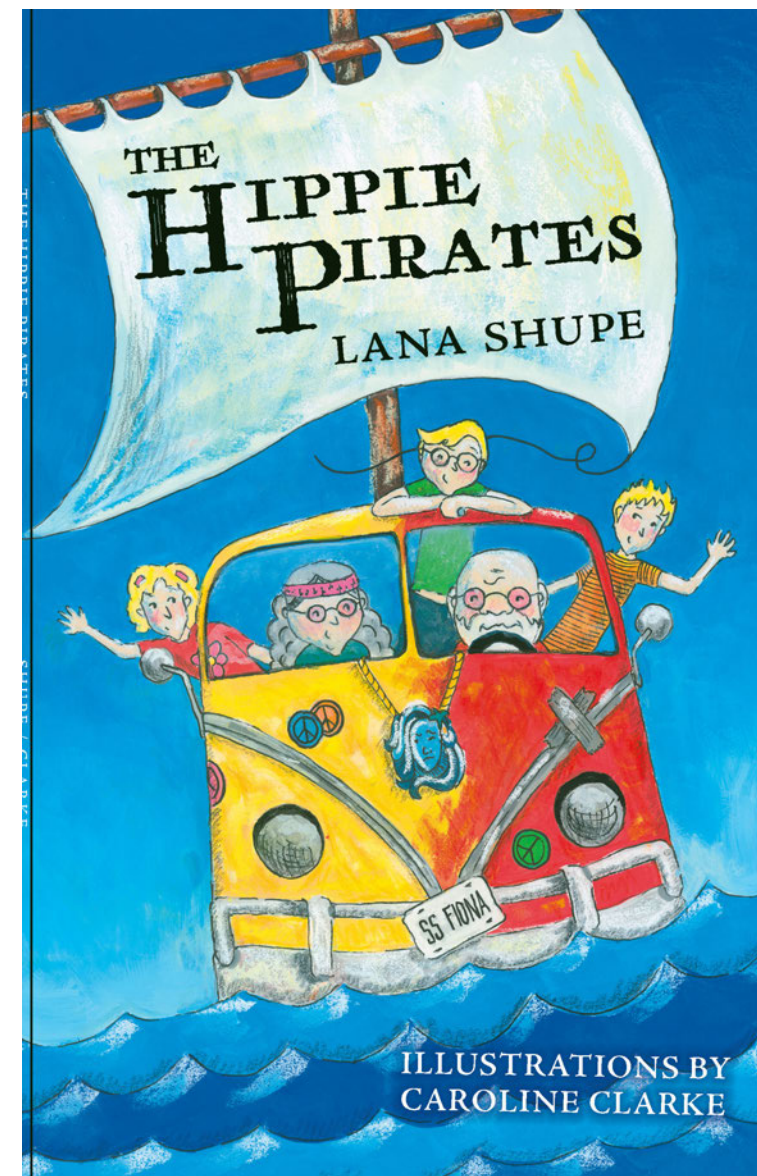
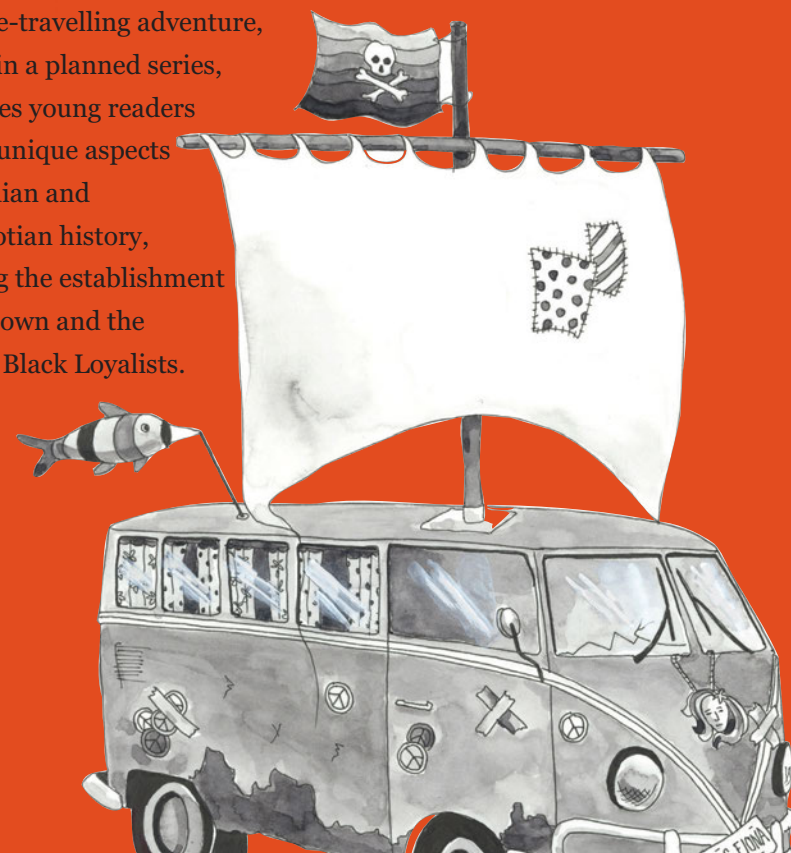
LANA SHUPE fell in love with books when she was a toddler and has never stopped loving them. Telling and writing stories has always been a part of her life. Her house is full of books and she reads anywhere she can find a spot. Her first book, *The Lonely Little Lighthouse*, was published by Nimbus Publishing in 2022.

A St. John's-based musician and graphic designer, **CAROLINE CLARKE** has a penchant for illustration and printmaking. Since 2004, when she began to make prints, she has had four shows at the Craft Council of Newfoundland and Labrador's Gallery and participated in many local craft and print fairs. One of her favourite commissions over the years has been to create artwork used for the Newfoundland and Labrador Folk Festival. Her illustrations feature in *The Mystery of the Portuguese Waltzes*, published by Running the Goat in 2019 (see page 26 of this catalogue).

There are many things that Kent, Ryan, and Amy love about their somewhat eccentric hippie-pirate grandparents, but best of all are their wonderful stories about travelling the world in search of treasure. Central to all their stories is their beloved VW pirate-ship bus, the *SS Fiona*. And now the three children are going to join in on a hippie-pirate adventure, and sail on the *Fiona*!

Where will they go? Liverpool? Norway? New York? No. Three disappointed children learn their destination is Nova Scotia, their home province. But very quickly Kent, Ryan, and Amy come to realize that there's a lot more to "their own backyard" than they'd realized, and that the *Fiona* knows a trick or two as well.

This time-travelling adventure, the first in a planned series, introduces young readers to some unique aspects of Canadian and Nova Scotian history, including the establishment of Birchtown and the plight of Black Loyalists.

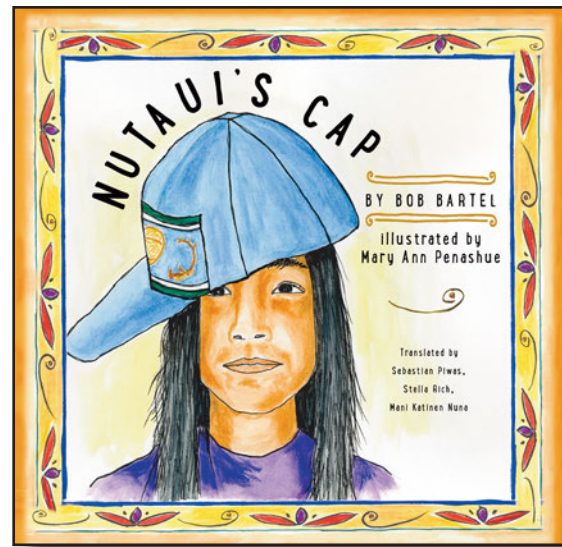
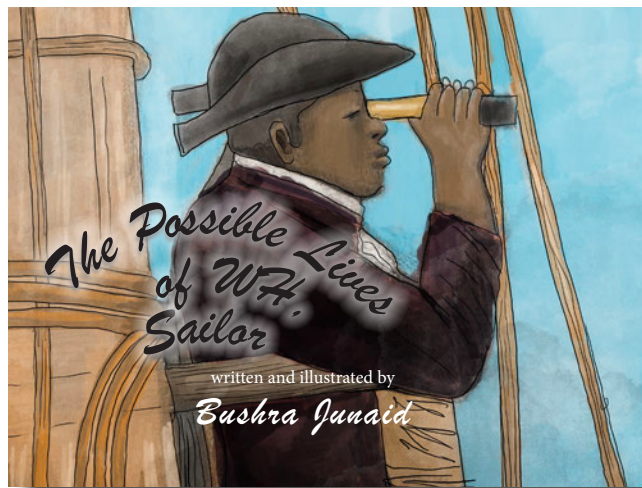


THE POSSIBLE LIVES OF WH, SAILOR
